FINAL ORDER – THIS PRELIMINARY DETERMINATION BECAME THE FINAL ORDER OF THE COMMISSION ON FEBRUARY 18, 2022 AS TO CLAIMANT 3 PURSUANT TO RULE 21F-10(f) OF THE SECURITIES EXCHANGE ACT OF 1934

Notice of Covered Action

PRELIMINARY DETERMINATIONS OF THE CLAIMS REVIEW STAFF

In response to the above-referenced Notice of Covered Action, the Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission") received whistleblower award claims from and ("Claimant 3") (collectively, "Claimants") for the above-referenced Commission enforcement action ("Covered Action"). Pursuant to Section 21F of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Exchange Act") and Rule 21F-10 promulgated thereunder, the Claims Review Staff ("CRS") has evaluated these claims in accordance with the criteria set forth in Rules 21F-1 through 21F-18. The CRS sets forth its Preliminary Determinations for the award claimants as follows.



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Claimant 3

The CRS has preliminarily determined to recommend that the Commission deny an award to Claimant 3. No information submitted by Claimant 3 led to the successful enforcement of the Covered Action within the meaning of Section 21F(b)(1) of the Exchange Act and Rules 21F-3(a)(3) and 21F-4(c) because none of the information that the Claimant 3 submitted:

- 1. caused the Commission to (i) commence an examination, (ii) open or reopen an investigation, or (iii) inquire into different conduct as part of a current Commission examination or investigation under Rule 21F-4(c)(1) of the Exchange Act; or
- 2. significantly contributed to the success of a Commission judicial or administrative enforcement action under Rule 21F-4(c)(2) of the Exchange Act.

In making this determination, the CRS notes that the record demonstrates that staff working on the investigation that led to the Covered Action reviewed Claimant 3's

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submission and determined that, while it provided some information alleging that
the submission did not provide any substantive information showing
securities fraud. Although Claimant 3 submitted other tips related to , which were
provided to the staff conducting the Covered Action investigation, those tips did not relate to
, which was the subject matter of the Covered Action. Claimant 3's
nformation did not cause the staff to open the investigation that led to the Covered Action nor
lid it significantly contribute to that investigation.
