COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC EXTENDS SUSPENSION OF LEASING CONSULTANTS OTC TRADING. The SEC today extended the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the common stock of Leasing Consultants, Inc. a New York corporation of Roslyn, New York which had originally commenced on July 28, 1970 to expire on August 6, 1970. The order extends the time of the temporary suspension through August 16, 1970. (For further details, see Release 34-8944).

ROLEN DIVERSIFIED INVESTORS SUSPENSION PERMANENT. The SEC today announced that it had ordered the permanent suspension of Regulation A exemption from registration under the Securities Act of 1933 with respect to the public stock offering proposal of Rolen Diversified Investors, Inc. Ida A. Leonardini, president of Rolen, on July 13, 1970, requested that the Commission enter the order of permanent suspension. The Commission's temporary suspension order of June 2, 1970, was based on the fact that the Commission had "reasonable cause" to believe that the terms and conditions of Regulation A were not complied with, in that there was a failure to amend Rolen's offering circular to disclose (1) a court action in December 1968 in which Rolen and its principals are charged with fraud, (2) a class action filed in behalf of the company in December 1968 against the company and its president and controlling stockholder, Ida M. Leonardini, for recovery of \$123,969 allegedly owed to the company and for \$500,000 damages, and (3) the institution by Rolen in 1969 of voluntary proceedings under Chapter XI of the Bankruptcy Act. The company also failed to file reports of sales pursuant to its offering.

EXAMINER FINDS LEWIS SECURITIES FILING DEFICIENT. SEC Hearing Examiner Sidney L. Feiler has filed an initial decision in administrative proceedings under the Securities Act involving a public offering pursuant to a claimed Regulation A exemption from Securities Act registration of an issue of 60,000 shares of its common stock at \$5 per share by Lewis Securities Company, Inc., a registered broker-dealer of Hanover, N. H. The Examiner found that the offering circular filed by the company was seriously deficient in its presentation of the financial situation of the company for the latest period reported, in that substantial unrealized losses in the firm's trading account were not revealed. The Examiner concluded that this was a material omission of information necessary for an investor to make an informed judgment of the value of the current assets of the company, its profits, stockholders' equity, and retained earnings and that the use of the offering circular would be violative of the Securities Act. The Examiner further found that there had been a sufficient showing of good faith and other mitigating factors to permit the granting of an application to withdraw the filing.

Review of the decision may be sought within 15 days. In the event no such petition is filed and the Commission does not determine on its own initiative to review the decision, the Examiner's decision will become final.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALABAMA POWER RECEIVES ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act (Release 35-16798) authorizing Alabama Power Company, Birmingham subsidiary of The Southern Company, to issue and sell up to \$30,400,000 of short-term notes to six New York City banks, up to \$500,000 of such notes to a Pittsburgh, Pa., bank and up to \$32,195,000 of such notes to 62 Alabama banks. Such notes are part of the \$80,000,000 of notes and commercial paper Alabama Power was authorized to issue by the Commission on November 5, 1969 (Release 35-16512).

HARTFORD ELECTRIC SEEKS ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act (Release 35-16799) giving interested persons until August 27 to request a hearing upon an application of The Hartford Electric Light Company, Wethersfield, Conn., subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to issue and sell up to \$35,000,000 of short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to dealers in commercial paper. The company will use the net proceeds for construction expenditures and for investments in nuclear generating companies. Construction expenditures are estimated at \$66,600,000 for 1970 and \$63,700,000 for 1971.

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

BANK OF NEW YORK CO. SEEKS ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act (Release IC-6155) giving interested persons until August 27 to request a hearing upon an application of The Bank of New York Company, Inc. ("Bank of New York"), New York bank holding company, for exemption from all provisions of the Act of common trust funds established by any bank controlled by Bank of New York and maintained by it exclusively for the collective investment and reinvestment of moneys contributed thereto by the bank or one or more banks controlled by it provided (1) each bank contributing moneys to such common trust fund makes its contributions solely in its capacity as a trustee, executor, administrator or guardian within the meaning of the Act and (2) such common trust fund meets the requirements of Section 100-c(17) of the New York Banking Law. Organized in 1968, Bank of New York controls seven trust companies and banks with fiduciary powers organized under New York law.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

SEC COMPLAINT NAMES LIBERTY EQUITIES, OTHERS. The SEC announced on August 6 (LR-4709) the filing of a complaint in the Federal court in the District of Columbia seeking to enjoin violations of the registration, reporting, proxy and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in the offer and sale of the securities of Liberty Equities Corporation. Named as defendants, in addition to Liberty Equities, were C. Wyatt Dickerson, Jr., Richard P. McMurray, Murray B. Weiner, Edward A. White, Peat, Marwick, Mitchell & Co., National Savings and Trust Co., White & Company Inc., Edward B. Kennedy, Kennedy Investments, Inc., Mason & Company, Inc., and Allen & Company, Inc.

SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

NUVEEN FUND PROPOSES OFFERING. Nuveen Tax-Exempt Bond Fund, Series 30, 209 S. LaSalle St., Chicago, Ill. 60604, filed a registration statement (File 2-38117) with the SEC on August 5 seeking registration of \$12,375,000 of units. The Fund is one of a series of investment companies created by the sponsor and underwriter, John Nuveen & Co. (Inc.), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Investors Syndicate of America, Inc.; it consists of a diversified portfolio of interest-bearing obligations issued by or on behalf of states, counties, municipalities and territories of the United States and authorities and political subdivisions thereof, the interest from which, in the opinion of counsel for the sponsor, is exempt from all Federal income taxes under existing law.

WADDELL & REED FUND PROPOSES OFFERING. United Vanguard Investment Programs, filed a registration statement (File 2-38119) with the SEC on August 5 seeking registration of \$10,000,000 of Monthly Investment Programs and \$10,000,000 of Executive-Professional Investment Programs to accumulate shares of United Vanguard Fund, Inc. Waddell & Reed, 20 W. 9th St., Kansas City, Mo. 64105, is the sponsor. Cornelius Roach is board chairman and William A. Reasoner president of the sponsor.

CONTINENTAL TELEPHONE TO SELL NOTES. Continental Telephone Corporation, 222 S. Central, Clayton (St. Louis), Mo. 63105, filed a registration statement (File 2-38120) with the SEC on August 5 seeking registration of \$65,000,000 of notes, due 1975, to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by E. F. Hutton & Co. Inc., 61 Broadway, New York, and two other firms. The interest rate, offering price and underwriting terms are to be supplied by amendment. An independent telephone company, the company also manufactures communications equipment, provides CATV service primarily in areas served by certain of its telephone subsidiaries and furnishes data services to its subsidiaries and others. Net proceeds of the company's financing will be used to reduce bank loans made and commercial paper sold in connection with investments in and advances to its subsidiaries. In addition to indebtedness and preferred stock, the company has outstanding 26,375,251 common shares.

ATLANTIC CITY ELECTRIC FILES FINANCING PROPOSAL. Atlantic City Electric Company, 1600 Pacific Ave., Atlantic City, N. J., filed a registration statement (File 2-38121) with the SEC on August 5 seeking registration of \$20,000,000 of first mortgage bonds and \$10,000,000 of debentures, to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding. A public utility, the company will apply the net proceeds of its financing toward the prepayment, without premium, of a portion of its outstanding notes payable to banks, which totaled \$32,270,000 at July 31. The proceeds of such notes have been or will be used to pay for part of the 1969 and 1970 construction programs. Construction expenditures are estimated at \$50,000,000 for 1970.

MCCORMICK 1970 MIDYEAR OIL & GAS PROPOSES OFFERING. McCormick 1970 Midyear Oil & Gas Program ("Partnership"), 1204 Tennessee Bldg., Houston, Tex. 77002, filed a registration statement (File 2-38125) with the SEC on August 6 seeking registration of \$5,400,000 of limited partnership interest, to be offered for public sale in \$10,000 units. No underwriting is involved; participating NASD members will receive a 7% selling commission. McCormick Exploration Corporation, a wholly-owned subsidiary of McCormick Oil & Gas Corporation (the General Operating Agent), will serve as Managing Partner. Sanford E. McCormick, president and board chairman, owns 75% and R. E. Warren, Jr., executive vice president, 25% of the outstanding stock of McCormick Oil & Gas.

MISCELLANEOUS

BACHE & CO. RECEIVES ORDER. The SEC has granted an application of Bache & Co., Incorporated, New York broker-dealer, for exemption from the registration provisions of Section 12(g) of the Act. The exemption was granted by reason of the amount of trading interest in the securities of the corporation, the fact that none of the company's securities is freely transferable, the restrictions placed on the securities by the company and the New York Stock Exchange, and Bache's undertakings in this matter.
