COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

NAME INVESTMENT ADVISORY SERVICES COMMITTEE. Chairman William J. Casey announced today the formation of an advisory committee to assist the Commission in developing clearer policies and guidelines in the area of investment management services for individual investors.

In describing the committee's assignment, Chairman Casey said: "Through computer technology it now appears feasible to provide individualized investment advisory services to investors who have relatively small amounts of money to invest. These services can substantially reduce the disparity between research information and investment management available to institutional, as opposed to individual investors, by providing the direct investor with continuous account supervision based upon his individual needs.

"However, there is a great deal of uncertainty about the applicability of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and the Securities Act of 1933 in this area. An advisory service which makes large-scale solicitations of relatively small accounts and provides substantially the same advice to clients can become functionally indistinguishable from an investment company. Representations as to "individualized" treatment of clients may in such a case also raise questions under the anti-fraud provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. On the other hand, notwithstanding some overlapping investment advice, such a service might actually provide individualized service.

"In the absence of clear standards, some investment advisory firms may have been inhibited from establishing non-pooled individualized advisory services. Others inadvertently may be operating advisory services in a manner contrary to the securities laws. The advisory committee will attempt to resolve questions in these areas and formulate policies and guidelines as well as recommend rule proposals."

CITE CONTINENTAL INVESTMENT, WADDELL & REED AND OTHERS. The Commission has ordered public administrative proceedings under the Federal securities laws against Continental Investment Corporation (CIC), Waddell & Reed, Inc., Kansas City Securities Corporation (KCSC) (CIC Respondents), and The First National Bank of Boston. CIC is a Boston based holding company whose primary subsidiary is Waddell & Reed, a registered broker-dealer and investment adviser. Waddell & Reed, which is located in Kansas City, Mo., is the investment adviser and principal underwriter for United Funds, Inc., United Vanguard Fund, Inc., United Continental Growth Fund, Inc. and United Continental Income Fund, Inc. (collectively referred to as "United funds"). United funds are open-end investment companies which collectively have more than \$2.5 billion in net assets. The funds are not parties to these proceedings. KCSC, which is also located in Kansas City, is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Waddell & Reed, a registered broker-dealer and a member of various regional stock exchanges. FNBB is a national bank with its principal place of business in Boston.

The proceedings concern activities occurring during the period July 1, 1969 to the present and are based upon allegations of the Commission's staff of violations of the Federal securities laws in two broad areas of mutual fund management: (1) execution of portfolio transactions, and (2) custodian bank relationships.

The staff has alleged, among other things, that from on or about April 1, 1971 to date, substantially all of KCSC's income has been received through the reciprocal brokerage practices; that CIC Respondents violated the anti-fraud provisions of the Federal securities laws, and the proxy rules and provisions of the Investment Company Act which prohibit these affiliated persons of United funds from breaching their fiduciary duty and receiving illegal compensation while acting as agent for the purchase or sale of property. The particulars of these charges are that the CIC Respondents engaged in a course of business which resulted in the enrichment of the CIC Respondents at the expense of and to the detriment of United funds and their shareholders. In furtherance of this course of business, the CIC Respondents caused United funds to, among other things, (a) effect portfolio transactions for the purpose of securing benefits principally for the CIC Respondents and persons other than United funds and their shareholders; and (b) effect portfolio transactions through KCSC although the services of KCSC were not needed in the transactions.

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The staff also charges that the CIC Respondents, while representing that Waddell & Reed would use its judgment and experience to effect United funds portfolio transactions as expeditiously as possible and at the best obtainable price, did not seek or obtain best price and execution for United funds portfolio transactions.

A hearing will be scheduled by further order to take evidence on the staff charges and afford Respondents an opportunity to offer any defenses thereto, for the purpose of determining whether the allegations are true and, if so, whether any action of a remedial nature is necessary or appropriate in the public interest. TRADING SUSPENDED IN POWER CONVERSION STOCK. The SEC ordered, pursuant to Section 15(c)(5) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the common stock \$.01 par value, of Power Conversion Inc., a New York corporation located in Tuckahoe, N. Y., for the 10-day period commencing at 6:00 p.m. (EDT) on October 6, 1972 and continuing through October 15, 1972. The suspension was ordered because of the unavailability of adequate and accurate current information concerning the business operations and financial condition of Power, and because of the recent unusual market activity in Power's securities and the lack of information to account for the activity. TRADING SUSPENDED IN GOODWAY INC. SECURITIES. The SEC on October 10 ordered the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Goodway Inc. of Philadelphia, effective for a ten-day period beginning October 10 through October 19, 1972. Goodway is principally engaged in printing and communications services. The suspension was ordered because of the unavailability of adequate and accurate information concerning the company in that, among other things, it is delinquent in filing a Form 10-K for fiscal year ending February 29, 1972. COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

JAMES W. McCROCKLIN SENTENCED. The SEC Washington Regional Office announced on October 5 that James W. McCrocklin of Alexandria, Va. (former promoter, chief executive officer and board chairman of APPCA, Inc.) was sentenced to four months to two years imprisonment on McCrocklin's plea of guilty to two counts charging him with violations of the registration and anti-fraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of unregistered securities of APPCA, Inc. (LR-5558)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASE

OHIO POWER COMPANY. The SEC has issued an order authorizing Ohio Power Company, Canton subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to issue and sell at competitive bidding \$25,000,000 of first mortgage bonds and 450,000 shares of cumulative preferred stock (\$100 par). Proceeds will be applied to payment of Ohio Power's unsecured short-term indebtedness estimated to be outstanding in the amount of \$110 million at the time of the sale. (Rel. 35-17721)
