COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC ESTABLISHES ACCOUNTING FELLOWSHIP. The SEC announced the establishment of a professional accounting fellow program designed to bring outstandingly qualified professional accountants into its Office of the Chief Accountant on a rotating basis for two-year non-renewable terms. The program is scheduled to commence with the initial appointment beginning in April 1973; one SEC fellow will be designated each year for a two-year term. The program was designed to assist the Commission in undertaking its vital function of active participation in the development of accounting and disclosure principles and to enable the Commission to move affirmatively to resolve emerging accounting and disclosure problems based on adequate and appropriate research rather than simply responding on a case-by-case basis. The program is also designed to provide the SEC with a continual supply of "new blood" which will keep the permanent accounting staff up-to-date on matters of current accounting practice and broaden the perspective of SEC rulemakers. It will also result in the gradual build up of accountants with meaningful SEC experience in the public accounting profession which should benefit both the profession and the Commission.

The SEC fellow will work under the direct supervision and guidance of the Chief Accountant. He will perform research, develop position papers and work with various governmental and private professional accounting research committees. A portion of his time is expected to be devoted to tasks designed to increase his knowledge of the functions of the SEC as a whole. He will also be assigned where possible to programs relating to other agencies in the government where there is a mutuality of interest with the SEC.

A selection committee composed of the Chairman and the Chief Accountant of the Commission, and the Executive Vice President of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants will review all applications received in determining the successful applicants. OCEANOGRAPHY MARICULTURE INDUSTRIES TRADING BAN LIFTED. The SEC announced that the suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Oceanography Mariculture Industries, Inc. ("OMI"), a Delaware corporation with its principal offices in Rivera Beach, Fla., will terminate at 10:00 a.m. (EST) on November 2, 1972. Trading in OMI securities was originally suspended by the Commission on September 27, 1972, at the request of the company because of the unavailability of adequate and accurate information concerning the company and questions raised with respect to the transfer of substantial assets of the company to its parent, Oceanography Development Corporation ("ODC"). The company requested that trading be suspended until such time as a legal review and a special financial audit could be made into OMI's affairs in order to determine the current financial condition of the company.

The legal review and special audit referred to above have not yet been concluded. The Commission has determined to lift the trading suspension, however, in light of certain developments. On October 20, 1972, the company distributed a letter to its shareholders which summarizes the terms of an agreement that it has entered into with ODC and Adolph B. Lewson, George Lewson and Faye Lewson, former members of the Board of Directors of OMI, which obligates the foregoing to make restitution to OMI for over \$1 million of assets allegedly improperly diverted from OMI to ODC, together with all reasonable expenses incurred by OMI. COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

REAL-TEX ENTERPRISES, OTHERS ENJOINED. The SEC Fort Worth Regional Office announced October 25 the entry of an order of permanent injunction by consent by the Federal court in Fort Worth against Real-Tex Enterprises, Inc. and Joe Gebron, Jr., both of Dallas, AEI, Inc., Bloomington, Minn., Robert P. Johnson, St. Louis Park, Minn. and William S. Nemes, Spokane, Wash. Real-Tex Enterprises, Inc., Gebron, Johnson and AEI, Inc. all consented to the entry of an order of injunction forbidding future violations of the securities registration and anti-fraud provisions of the Federal securities laws, while Nemes consented to the entry of an order forbidding future violations of the registration provisions only, all without admitting or denying the allegations in plaintiff's complaint. A hearing was set for February 5, 1973 for the remaining defendant, Edward L. Baker, Jr., Fort Worth. (LR-5590)

W. S. NEMES ENJOINED. The SEC Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on October 24 the Federal court in Dallas entered an order of permanent injunction by consent against William S. Nemes, Spokane, Wash. formerly of Minnetonka, Minn., forbidding further violations of the registration provisions of the Federal securities laws involving the offer and sale of assignments of contracts for deed by Dal-Tex Properties Corporation, Dallas. Nemes consented to the entry of the court order without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint. (LR-5591)

OVER

G. L. EQUITIES CORP., OTHERS ENJOINED. The SEC announced on October 31 that the Federal court in New York had issued an order of preliminary injunction enjoining G. L. Equities Corp., George C. Bergleitner, Michael David Harvey and Frank J. Serrano of New York City from further violations of the net capital rule and upon the consent of all parties, appointed Charles H. Kaufman, 61 Broadway, New York as the Securities Investor Protection Corporation Trustee. (LR-5592)

BYRON E. PRUGH SENTENCED. The SEC Fort Worth Regional Office announced the sentencing on October 13 of Byron E. Prugh, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., to four months' imprisonment on a conviction of criminal contempt in connection with a permanent injunction entered against him and others in connection with the offer and sale of securities issued by W.I.D.E., Inc. (LR-5594)

COMPLAINT NAMES FUNDAMATIC INVESTORS, INC. The New York Regional Office announced the filing of a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York seeking to enjoin Fundamatic Investors, Inc., New York City mutual fund, from further violations of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and the Rules thereunder, involving redemptions at improper prices, late payment of redemptions, failure to file with the Commission and transmit to shareholders required reports, and failure to maintain and/or keep current certain books and records. The Commission's complaint also seeks the appointment of a receiver and trustee for the Fund based upon the alleged violations and the further allegation that the Fund has no functioning board of directors. CLAUDIA DICKSON ENJOINED. The SEC Fort Worth Regional Office announced that the Federal court in Dallas permanently enjoined Miss Claudia F. Dickson of Dallas, from further violations of the anti-fraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of fractional undivided working interests in oil and gas leases located in Cochran and Tom Green Counties, Texas on behalf of Capital Oil Corporation. Miss Dickson consented to the court order without admitting the allegations. (LR-5596)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN GENERAL CONVERTIBLE SECURITIES, INC. The SEC has issued an order permitting American General Convertible Securities, Inc., Houston closed-end investment company, to invest concurrently with American General Insurance Company, Inc., also of Houston, in securities purchased at direct placement and to exercise warrants conversion privileges and other rights at the same time and in the same amount and subject to certain conditions. NARRAGANSETT CAPITAL CORPORATION. The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until November 22 to request a hearing on an application by Narragansett Capital Corporation, Providence, R. I., closed-end investment company, for an order permitting the proposed sale by Bevis Industries, Inc., of the assets of Newman-Crosby Steel Company to a new Rhode Island Corporation and the sale of certain land to Business Development Corporation of Rhode Island. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASE

MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC. The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until November 22 to request a hearing upon the proposals of Arkansas Power & Light Company of Little Rock, Ark., subsidiary company of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to issue and sell, pursuant to competitive bidding, \$15,000,000 of first mortgage bonds, due 2002, and 200,000 shares of cumulative preferred stock (\$100 par). Net proceeds will be used to retire bank loans and commercial paper incurred to pay part of cost of Arkansas' construction program. Arkansas further proposes to issue and sell, and Middle South (the holder of Arkansas' presently outstanding common stock) 800,000 shares of Arkansas' common stock, which transaction is to occur concurrently with the payment of a cash dividend by Arkansas to Middle South equal to the purchase price of the Arkansas common stock. SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

INTERNATIONAL FUNERAL SERVICES OF CALIFORNIA, INC., 2501 Grand Ave., Des Moines, Iowa 50312, filed a registration statement on October 24 seeking registration of \$7.5 million of 4-1/2% debentures, due 1992, to be offered for public sale at 100% of principal amount. No underwriting is involved. The company is engaged in the funeral service business and cemetery operations. Net proceeds will be used for expansions of existing funeral service facilities, acquisition of additional facilities and for other corporate purposes. (File 2-46100)

WAILA DEVELOPMENT COMPANY (a joint venture of The Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company and Wailea Land Corporation), 822 Bishop St., Honolulu, Hawaii 96813, filed a registration statement on October 20 seeking registration of \$4,806,533 of apartment deeds and partnership interests in Pacific Colony Beach Club (Resort Condominium Apartments), to be offered for public sale at prices ranging from \$45,000 to \$96,000. The offering is to be made by Wailea Investment Corporation, 822 Bishop St., Honolulu, Hawaii 96813. (File 2-46103)

TEXAS SOUTHWESTERN MUNICIPAL BOND FUND, Series 1, filed a registration statement on October 24 seeking registration of \$5,250,000 of units. The Fund was created by a trust agreement under which Rauscher Pierce Securities Corporation and Rowles, Winston & Co., Inc. act as sponsors, United States Trust Company of New York acts as trustee and Standard & Poor's Corporation acts as evaluator. The Fund's objectives are to provide tax exempt income and conservation of capital through an investment in the Tax Exempt Bond Portfolio of interest-bearing obligations issued by or on behalf of states, counties, territories or municipalities of the United States and authorities, municipal corporations and political subdivisions of any of them, the interest on which is, in the opinion of recognized bond counsel, exempt from all Federal income tax under existing law. DIVERSIFIED TAX-EXEMPT BOND FUND, CALIFORNIA SERIES 1, 1 Chase Manhattan Plaza, New York 10005, filed a registration statement on October 24 seeking registration of \$16.5 million of units. The Fund is the first of a proposed series of similar but separate trusts created by a trust indenture and agreement between Blyth Eastman Dillon & Co. Incorporated, as sponsor, and Bank of America National Trust and Savings Association, as trustee and evaluator. The Fund consists of a diversified portfolio of interest-bearing municipal bonds, the interest on which is, in the opinion of recognized bond counsel, exempt from all Federal and California income tax. NORTHERN STATES FINANCIAL CORPORATION, Penobscot Bldg., Detroit, Mich. 48266, filed a registration statement on October 24 seeking registration of 600,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale (*at \$22 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Kidder, Peabody & Co. Inc., 10 Hanover Sq., and W. E. Hutton & Co., 14 Wall St., both of New York. The company is a banking holding company. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$25 million will be invested in its banking subsidiary as equity capital and the balance for other corporate purposes. (File 2-46108)
