RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

LIMITATIONS ON REFUNDABILITY OF SENIOR
SECURITIES SUBJECT TO THE PUBLIC UTILITY
HOLDING COMPANY ACT OF 1935

An invitation for comments on whether issuers subject to the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935 should be authorized to restrict, up to ten years, the refundability of long-term debt and preferred stock has been issued giving interested parties until December 12 to respond. All such communications should be filed in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, Washington, D.C. 20549 and should refer to File No. S7-596, and will be available for public inspection. (Rel. 35-19224)

NASD SUBMITS PROPOSAL TO AMEND
ITS FIDELITY BONDING REQUIREMENTS

The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (the NASD) submitted on October 22 a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 with respect to the NASD's fidelity bonding requirements as set forth in Article III, Section 32 (and Appendix "C" thereto) of the NASD Rules of Fair Practice. The proposed rule change would permit, subject to certain conditions, the inclusion of a higher deductible provision in a fidelity bond for those members purchasing coverage in excess of the required minimum coverage. In addition, the proposed rule change includes a technical drafting revision to Section (a) of Appendix C relating to the exemption for members of certain exchanges which is necessitated by recent amendments to the Commission's Rule 15c3-1.

Publication of the submission is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 28, 1975. Interested persons are invited to submit written data, views and arguments concerning the PBW submission within 30 days from publication in the Federal Register. Persons desiring to make written statements should file six copies thereof with the Secretary of the Commission, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capitol Street, Washington, D.C. 20549. DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

AMEX APPLICATION TO DELIST CLARY
CORPORATION STOCK GRANTED

The Commission has granted the American Stock Exchange's application to delist the common stock of Clary Corporation of San Gabriel, California.

The Exchange's action was based on Clary's operating losses in three of four years (1969-72). The Exchange, based on its express policy of discounting extraordinary gains in computing eligibility for continued listing on the basis of income results, gave no effect to extraordinary gains during the four-year period. Had it done so, 1971 would have been deemed a profitable year, and Clary would have qualified for continued listing.

The Commission rejected Clary's contention that the Exchange should not have discounted the effect of an extraordinary gain resulting from Clary's 1971 sale of future royalties to be paid by licensees of certain adding machine patents owned by Clary. Clary contended that the Exchange knew, when it was considering delisting, that the standards governing the accounting treatment of sales of future royalties had been revised during 1973 to permit the inclusion of revenue from that source in ordinary income. Clary, although conceding that the revised standard was not retroactive, argued that the Exchange should have used its discretion in a manner to reflect that change.

The Commission, noting that Clary conceded that its argument turned on a matter of Exchange discretion, reaffirmed its prior decisions holding that while "there is room for discretion in determining to apply those rules strictly in a particular situation .. that discretion belongs to the Exchange, not to us." **KLEE & COMPANY, INC. REVOKED;
PRESIDENT BARRED**

The Commission has revoked the broker-dealer registration of Klee & Company, Inc., of Cleveland, and barred Jay Walter Klee, its former president, from association with any broker, dealer or investment company.

The sanctions were based on findings that the firm and Klee failed to comply with net capital, recordkeeping and reporting provisions.

Without admitting or denying the charges against them, the firm and Klee consented to the above findings and sanctions. (Rel. 34-11752)

**FIRST WESTERN SECURITIES AND
WILLIAM LASSWELL, JR. SUSPENDED**

The Commission has suspended First Western Securities Company, a Spokane, Washington broker-dealer firm, and William Lasswell, Jr., its managing partner, from engaging in over-the-counter securities activities for 30 business days effective November 3. During the suspension, respondents may handle unsolicited transactions for existing customers, and liquidate the firm's existing proprietary stock position.

The sanctions were based on findings that respondents aided and abetted violations of antifraud and registration provisions of the securities laws.

The Commission's action was taken pursuant to an offer of settlement in which respondents, without admitting or denying the charges against them, consented to the above findings and sanctions. (Rel. 34-11753)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

FOREIGN RESTRICTED LIST

The Commission has placed Hemisphere Land Corporation on the Foreign Restricted List for the reason that it has been making a public offering in the United States, by mail from Nassau in the Bahamas, of interests in land in Canada which are investment contracts that are securities. No registration statement covering these securities has been filed with the Commission under the provisions of the Securities Act of 1933. The Foreign Restricted List is composed of foreign corporations offering securities in violation of Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933. (Rel. 33-5633)

The Commission has also placed on the Foreign Restricted List American Industrial Research, S.A., a Mexican corporation also known by the name of Investigacion Industrial Americana, S.A. for the reason that this corporation has been publicly offering to investors in the United States units composed of its shares of stock and warrants to buy additional shares without these securities being registered under the Securities Act of 1933. The Foreign Restricted List is composed of foreign corporations whose securities are being publicly offered in the United States in violation of the provisions of Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933. COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

J. & C. SALES COMPANY, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on October 16 a preliminary injunction was issued by U.S. District Court Judge C. Clyde Atkins in the U.S. District Court, Southern District of Florida, Miami Division, against J. & C. Sales Company, Inc. (J&C), a Florida corporation, and Joseph G. Ehrlich, enjoining them from violating the antifraud provision of the securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of the securities of J&C or any other securities. (SEC v. J. & C. Sales Company, Inc., et al., S.D. Fla. Civil Action No. 75-2246-Civ-WM). (LR-7132)

The Commission announced the filing of a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia on October 21 seeking a court order directing Hallcraft Homes, Inc. (Hallcraft), Phoenix, Arizona, to comply with the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeking a permanent injunction against further such violations. According to the Commission's complaint against Hallcraft, the company failed to file with the Commission in proper form its annual report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended April 30, 1975, and its quarterly report on Form 10-Q for the quarter ended July 31, 1975. (SEC v. Hallcraft Homes, Inc., U.S.D.C., D.C. Civil Action No. 75-1751). (LR-7133)

An order has been issued on an application of Wellington Fund, Inc., Windsor Fund, Inc., Ivest Fund, Inc., Exeter Fund, Inc., Explorer Fund, Inc., Trustees' Equity Fund, Inc., Wellesley Income Fund, Inc., W. L. Morgan Growth Fund, Inc., Westminster Bond Fund, Inc., and Fund for Federal Securities, Inc., all open-end investment companies, Gemini Fund, Inc., a closed-end investment company, Whitehall Money Market Trust (Whitehall) and Qualified Dividend Portfolios, Inc. (Qualified), two newly organized open-end investment companies, The Vanguard Group Inc. (Vanguard), Wellington Management Company (WMC) and Thorndike, Doran, Paine & Lewis, Inc. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing National Fuel Gas Company, a registered holding company, to increase the amount of its short-term unsecured notes to banks from \$30 million to \$38 million and to apply the additional proceeds therefrom to the purchase of a like amount of short-term notes to be issued by its subsidiary company, National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation. JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Jersey Central Power & Light Company, a subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, and Delmarva Power & Light Company, a registered holding company, that they make certain changes relating to guarantees of loans to an unaffiliated coal supplier. CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, and certain of its subsidiaries that Central and South West make a \$5 million capital contribution to one of those subsidiaries.
