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### NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

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#### RESCHEDULING OF CLOSED MEETING AGENDA

The following item originally scheduled for the closed meeting at 1:30 p.m. on October 6, 1977 has been rescheduled for 9:00 a.m. on October 12, 1977: Discussion of regulatory matters bearing enforcement implications. Additional staff consideration of the matter is required.

In addition, the closed meeting previously scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, October 12, 1977, will be held at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, October 13, 1977, subject to the deletion of the following items: Institution of administrative proceedings.

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### DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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#### NASD ACTION AGAINST HIBBARD & O'CONNOR SECURITIES, INC. AND CERTAIN OF ITS OFFICIALS REMANDED; ACTION AGAINST OSCAR E. COLLIER SET ASIDE

The SEC has remanded to the NASD disciplinary proceedings against Hibbard & O'Connor Securities, Inc., a Houston, Texas broker-dealer firm, and Philip S. Hibbard, Aubrey D. O'Connor, Raymond J. Lenger and Edward F. Butler, who were officials of that firm. It set aside the disciplinary action taken by the NASD against Oscar E. Collier, who was an officer of the firm.

The Commission affirmed the NASD's findings that the firm "parked" securities, failed to register salesmen, made improper payments to an employee of another NASD member firm, and did not comply with certain recordkeeping, customer protection and prompt delivery requirements. However, it set aside the NASD's findings that the firm failed to comply with net capital, reporting and other recordkeeping requirements, and improperly hypothecated customers' securities. The Commission concluded that, since it had set aside "a substantial number of the NASD's findings," the proceedings against applicants other than Collier should be remanded to the Association so that it can re-examine the sanctions it imposed.

The Commission set aside all findings of violation against Collier. But it went on to note that the NASD is free, should it choose to do so, to institute new proceedings against Collier based on his alleged efforts to cover up misconduct in which he was not a participant. (Rel. 34-13996)

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### COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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#### ROBERTA S. KARMEL TAKES OATH AS COMMISSIONER

Roberta S. Karmel, of New York, took the oath of office as a member of the Commission on September 30, 1977. Before her appointment to the Commission, Mrs. Karmel was a partner in the New York law firm of Rogers & Wells and an adjunct professor at Brooklyn Law School.

She was born May 4, 1937, in Chicago, Illinois. She received a B.A. from Radcliffe College in 1959 and an LL.B. from New York University School of Law in 1962. From 1962 to 1969, Mrs. Karmel worked for the Securities and Exchange Commission, as an attorney, then attorney branch chief, then assistant regional administrator. From 1969 to 1972 she was an associate with Willkie, Farr & Gallagher in New York.

Mrs. Karmel was a partner in Rogers & Wells since 1972, and an adjunct professor at Brooklyn Law School since 1973. She has been a member of the American Bar Association Federal Regulation of Securities Committee since 1973. She has also served on the Association of the Bar of the City of New York Committee on Securities Regulation, Committee on Administrative Law, and Committee on Professional Responsibility. She is the author of numerous articles in legal journals.

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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### ARKANSAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued releasing jurisdiction over the terms and conditions of a proposal by Arkansas Power & Light Company, subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., whereby Arkansas Power & Light will enter into installment sales agreements with Jefferson County, Arkansas for the purpose of financing the construction of pollution control facilities through the issuance of \$46 million of pollution control revenue bonds and \$1 million of industrial development revenue bonds by the County. 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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-CBOE-77-19) to repeal recently adopted rule changes which provide, among other things, for the appointment of board brokers on the basis of competitive bidding. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 10. (Rel. 34-14029)

### ORDER ABROGATING PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has abrogated a proposed rule change filed by the New York Stock Exchange Inc. (SR-NYSE-77-22) pursuant to Section 19(b)(3)(C) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The rule change was intended to clarify the permissible scope of communications between specialists and listed company officials. (Rel. 34-14030)

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## MISCELLANEOUS

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### REGULATION A EXEMPTION OF MAJOR RESOURCES, INC. TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED

An order has been issued temporarily suspending the Regulation A exemption from registration under the Securities Act of 1933 with respect to a proposed public offering of 100,000 shares of Class B common stock of Major Resources, Inc. According to the order, the Commission has reason to believe, among other things, that: (a) the Regulation A exemption is not available to the issuer because Robert C. Miller, a promoter and affiliate of the issuer, is subject to an order of permanent injunction issued by the 6th Circuit Court of Miami, Pinellas County, Florida; (b) the offering circular and notification of Major Resources, Inc. misrepresent and omit to state material facts; (c) the terms and conditions of Regulation A have not been complied with; and (d) the offering, if made, would be made in violation of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws.
