If you disagree, we will consider your explanation as to why our comment is inapplicable or a revision is unnecessary. Please be as detailed as necessary in your explanation.

Please understand that the purpose of our review process is to assist you in your compliance with the applicable disclosure requirements and to enhance the overall disclosure in your filings. Item 4.01 Form 8-K Filed September 24, 2009

1. Please revise your disclosure in paragraph (1)(ii) to state whether either of the reports of Williams & Webster on the financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2008 and June 30, 2007 contained an adverse opinion or a disclaimer of opinion or were qualified or modified as to uncertainty, audit scope, or accounting principles. Refer to paragraph (a)(1)(ii) of Item 304 of Regulation S-K.
2. Please revise your disclosure in paragraph (1)(iv) with respect to the period during which there were no disagreements with your former accountant to

comply with paragraph (a)(1)(iv) of Item 304 of Regulation S-K. This period should include the two most recent fiscal years and the subsequent interim period through the date of the dismissal, which appears to be the years ended June 30, 2008 and June 30, 2007 and the subsequent interim period through September 21, 2009.

3. Please revise your disclosure in paragraph (2) to disclose the date that you actually engaged Li & Company, PC as your independent registered accounting firm as opposed to the effective date of the engagement. Refer to paragraph (a)(2) of Item 304 of Regulation S-K.
4. Please revise your disclosure in paragraph (2) with respect to the period during which there was no consultation with your new accountant. This period should include the two most recent fiscal years and the subsequent interim period through the date of the engagement. Refer to paragraph (a)(2) of Item 304 of Regulation S-K.
5. Please note that you are also required to file an updated letter from the former accountant stating whether the firm agrees with the statements made in any amendment to the filing and, if not, stating the respects in which the firm does not agree. Refer to Items 304(a)(3) and 601(b)(16) of Regulation S-K.

As appropriate, please amend your filing and respond to these comments within five business days or tell us when you will respond. You may wish to provide us with marked copies of the amendment to expedite our review. Please furnish a cover letter with your amendment that keys your responses to our comments and provides any requested information as an EDGAR correspondence file. Detailed cover letters greatly facilitate our review. Please understand that we may have additional comments after reviewing your amendment and responses to our comments.

We urge all persons who are responsible for the accuracy and adequacy of the disclosure in the filings to be certain that the filings include all information required under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and that they have provided all information investors require for an informed investment decision. Since the company and its management are in possession of all facts relating to a company's disclosure, they are responsible for the accuracy and adequacy of the disclosures they have made.

In connection with responding to our comments, please provide, in writing, a statement from the company acknowledging that:

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- the company is responsible for the adequacy and accuracy of the disclosures in the filing;
- staff comments or changes to disclosure in response to staff comments do not foreclose the Commission from taking any action with respect to the filing; and
- the company may not assert this action as a defense in any proceeding initiated by the Commission or any person under the federal securities laws of the United States.

In addition, please be advised that the Division of Enforcement has access to all information you provide to the staff of the Division of Corporation Finance in connection with our review of your filing or in response to our comments on your filing.
