

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

Note 1 – Organization and Nature of Operations

CanAm Investor Services, LLC (the "Company") was organized in the state of Delaware on June 6, 2011. The Company is 100% owned by CanAm BD Holdings, LLC. The Company was organized as a limited liability company principally to engage in private placement activity (Reg D) and is a registered broker-dealer with the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. (FINRA) effective October 25, 2012.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Statement of Cash Flows

For purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, the Company has defined cash equivalents as highly liquid investments, with original maturities of less than three months, that are not held for sale in the ordinary course of business.

Concentration Credit Risk

The company maintains a bank account at one financial institution, which at times exceed federally insured limits. Management has not experienced any losses in such account. The account balance is insured by the Federal Deposit Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000. Management evaluates and believes the Company is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash and cash equivalents. At December 31, 2016, amounts in the bank were in excess of FDIC insured limits of \$ 3,540,000.

Revenue Recognition

The Company recognizes advisory revenues in accordance with the provisions of the respective agreements.

Income Taxes

The Company is a limited liability company, and treated as a partnership for income tax reporting purposes. The Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") provides that any income or loss is passed through to the members for federal and state income tax purposes. Accordingly, the Company has not provided for federal or state income taxes. The Company is subject to the New York City unincorporated business tax. Approximately \$124,817 of such tax was incurred during the year ended December 31, 2016, and is included in New York City unincorporated business and other taxes in the statement of operations.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

At December 31, 2016, management has determined that the Company had no uncertain tax positions that would require financial statement recognition. This determination will always be subject to ongoing reevaluation as facts and circumstances may require. The Company remains subject to U.S. federal and state income tax audits for all periods subsequent to 2016.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 3 - Exemption from Rule 15c3-3

The Company is exempt from the SEC Rule 15c3-3 pursuant to the exemption provision of such paragraph (k)(2)(i) and, therefore, is not required to maintain a "Special Reserve Bank Account for the Exclusive Benefit of Customers."

The Company maintains all of its cash in one financial institution, which at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any loss in this account and believes it is not subject to any significant credit risk.

Note 4 - Commitments

The Company leases office space under an Agreement of Sublease made on August 1, 2012 through September 30, 2015 and further extended to September 30, 2017 and further extended to December 31, 2019.

Rent expense for the year ended December 31, 2016 was approximately \$19,200 and is included in the occupancy expense line item in the Statement of Operations.

Note 5 - Net Capital Requirement

At December 31, 2016, the Company's net capital was approximately \$3,283,800 which was approximately \$3,250,425 in excess of its minimum requirement of \$33,375 SEC Rule 15C3-1.

The Company, as a member of the FINRA, is subject to the SEC Uniform Net Capital Rule 15c3-1. This rule requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1, and that equity capital may not be withdrawn if the resulting net capital ratio would exceed 10 to 1.

Note 6 - Fair Value

Fair Value Hierarchy

FASB ASC 820 defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and establishes a hierarchy of fair value inputs. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. A fair value measurement assumes that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability occurs in the principal market for the asset or liability or, in the absence of a principal market, the most advantageous market. Valuation techniques that are consistent with the market, income or cost approach, as specified by FASB ASC 820, are used to measure fair value.

The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three levels:

Level 1. Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Company can access at the measurement date.

Level 2. Inputs other than quoted prices included within level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability either directly or indirectly.

Level 3. Unobservable inputs for the assets or liability.

The availability of observable inputs can vary from security to security and is affected by a wide variety of factors, including, for example, the type of security, the liquidity of markets, and other characteristics particular to the security. To the extent that valuation is based on models or inputs that are less observable or unobservable in the market, the determination of fair value requires more judgment. Accordingly, the degree of judgment exercised in determining fair value is greatest for instruments categorized in level 3.

Note 6 - Fair Value (continued)

The inputs used to measure fair value may fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy. In such cases, for disclosure purposes, the level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement falls in its entirety is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety.

At December 31, 2016, the Company's fair value hierarchy consisted of level 1 inputs of cash in the amount of \$3,784,417.

Note 7 – Subsequent Events

These financial statements were approved by management and available for issuance on *February 24, 2017*. Subsequent events have been evaluated through this date.
