Business and Anticipated Business Plan

6. Describe in detail the business of the issuer and the anticipated business plan of the issuer.

Wind Harvest International, Inc. (“Wind Harvest”) aims to be the world’s leading mid-level wind turbine company and a brand universally respected for its environmental, economic, and social values. In the process, the Company aspires to open new markets for wind and renewable energy, and benefit ratepayers, stakeholders, partners, local communities, the environment, and investors. Our primary business is to design, make, and sell mid-level, vertical axis wind turbines (“VAWTs”). Our Wind Harvester™ line of H-type VAWTs are commercial and utility scale. They may vary in capacity from 50 kilowatts (“kW”) up to 250kW. Their blade tips can reach between 60 and 120 feet above the ground. These turbines are designed for the turbulent and gusting mid-level wind that traditional horizontal axis wind turbines are generally unable to use. The Wind Harvester 4.0 with 50-75kW nameplate capacity is planned to be our first model available to customers needing rugged turbines that can handle turbulent wind. With aircraft aluminum blades, galvanized steel rotor and tower, and concrete foundations, these energy-producing machines are expected to have a fatigue life of over 70 years. Wind Harvest plans to generate other income streams from customers in addition to the margins on sales, including turbine placement consulting, extended warranties, 24/7 fault monitoring, and maintenance contracts. We intend to sell the Wind Harvester brand of turbines to regional markets around the world through distributor and manufacturing licensees who have local

renewable energy project development experience and a reputation for excellent work. We anticipate that the Company's largest source of future revenue will come from royalty payments by major wind turbine manufacturers who license Wind Harvest's patents. Without these patents, it could be difficult and likely more costly to make VAWTs that can handle turbulent wind. With seven key patents pending and more being readied for filing, we view our strong patent portfolio as a key asset to the Company's future income. Our three primary target customer segments are as follows: Wind Farm Owners and Developers: Our turbines are designed to be installed under existing tall horizontal axis wind turbines ("HAWTs"). We estimate that 20% of the world's wind farms have excellent mid-level wind but need a product that can harvest this resource. Distributed Energy Developers and Facility Owners: Wind Harvesters are designed to fit inside the setback easements of hundreds of facilities that use large amounts of electricity, including windy airports and telecommunication tower sites on hilltops and ridgelines. Green Hydrogen Gas Producers: In the Solano, Tehachapi, and San Geronio wind resource areas in California, an estimated 14,000 mega watts ("MWs") of short VAWTs can be installed around the tall turbines. Adding transmission lines from these resource areas can be difficult and expensive, but we expect that making use of these wind resources to produce green hydrogen could create a large market for Wind Harvesters as the world's demand for non-fossil fuel gas increases.

Wind Harvest currently has 5 employees.

Risk Factors

7. Material factors that make an investment in Wind Harvest International, Inc. speculative or risky:

1. Investor Risks - Early Bird Discount: Investors who participate in the offering on or before 5:00pm April 29, 2024 U.S. EST will receive a \$0.01 early bird discount (approximately 14.3%) and be able to invest at a purchase price of \$0.06 per share, which equates to a \$15,358,900 pre-money valuation. Investors who participate in the offering after 5:00pm April 29, 2024 U.S. EST, will be able to invest at the normal purchase price of \$0.07 per share, which equates to a \$17,918,717 pre-money valuation.
2. Patent Risk: Of the seven patents filed with the USPTO, one has been granted with 19 of 20 claims accepted. Six are pending. Three that will be filed soon after additional capital is raised. The pending and soon to be filed patents may not be granted. The USPTO has indicated that some of the claims of the six pending patents will be granted but this is not guaranteed. Without the additional patents, the value of Wind Harvest will be lower.
3. Political Risk: It is possible that Republicans will take over Congress and the presidency in 2025. This could lead to a removal of the 40% tax credits that customers of Wind Harvester turbines would receive. Without this tax credit, the size of the US market for Wind Harvesters will be smaller.
4. We are highly dependent on our Chief Executive Officer: In the event of the death of our CEO, the Company's \$1 million "key man" insurance policy will help but the ability of the Company to rapidly

move forward will be hindered. The engineering team, patents, etc. would not be affected by such an event.

5. Third parties might infringe upon our technology: We cannot assure you that the steps we have taken to protect our property rights will prevent misappropriation of our technology. To protect our rights to our intellectual property, we plan to rely on a combination of patents, trade secrets, confidentiality agreements and other contractual arrangements with our employees, affiliates, strategic partners, and others. We may be unable to detect inappropriate use of our technology. Failure to adequately protect our intellectual property could materially harm our brand, devalue our proprietary content and affect our ability to compete effectively. Further, defending any intellectual property rights could result in significant financial expenses and managerial resources. If we were to initiate legal proceedings against a third party to enforce a patent claiming one of our technologies, the defendant may assert that our patent is invalid and/or unenforceable or does not cover its processes, components or future products. Proving patent infringement can be difficult. Any loss of patent protection or difficulty in enforcing intellectual property rights would have a material adverse impact on our business.
6. Start-up investing is risky: Investing in early-stage companies is very risky, highly speculative, and should not be made by anyone who cannot afford to lose their entire investment. Later stage startups could be less risky the more technology readiness levels the products have achieved. Unlike an investment in a mature business where there is a track record of revenue and income, the success of a startup or pre-revenue venture often relies on the development of a new product or service that may or may not find a market. Before investing, you should carefully consider the specific risks and disclosures related to both this offering type and the Company.
7. Any valuation at this stage is difficult to assess: Unlike listed companies that are valued publicly through market-driven stock prices, the valuation of private companies, especially startups, is difficult to assess and you may risk overpaying for your investment. In addition, there may be additional classes of equity with rights that are superior to the class of equity being sold.
8. No governmental agency has reviewed the Company's offering and no state or federal agency has passed upon either the adequacy of the disclosure contained herein or the fairness of the terms of this Offering.
9. The Company does not anticipate paying any cash dividends for the foreseeable future: The Company currently intends to retain future earnings, if any, for the foreseeable future, to repay indebtedness and to support its business. The Company does not intend in the foreseeable future to pay any dividends to holders of its shares of common stock.
10. We are dependent on general economic conditions: Potential customers may be less willing to invest in innovation and technological improvements in an economic downturn. This may temporarily reduce our market size.
11. Our management may not be able to control costs in an effective or timely manner: The Company's management anticipates it can use reasonable efforts to assess, predict and control costs and expenses. However, implementing our business plan may require more employees, capital equipment, supplies or other expenditure items than management has predicted.
12. Our future growth depends on our ability to develop and retain customers: Our future growth depends to a large extent on our ability to effectively anticipate and adapt to customer requirements and offer services that meet customer demands. If we are unable to attract customers and/or retain customers, our business, results of operations and financial condition may be materially adversely affected.
13. Our ability to succeed depends on how successful we will be in our fundraising efforts: We rely on investment funds in order to use resources to build the necessary tech and business infrastructure to be successful in the long-term. Current and future competitors may be able to draw on substantially greater financial resources than those available to the Company to develop products that are easier to commercialize or become more popular with the potential consumers of our products.
14. We face risks related to health epidemics and other outbreaks, which could significantly disrupt the Company's operations and could have a material adverse impact on us: The outbreak of pandemics and epidemics could materially and adversely affect the Company's business, financial condition, and results of operations. If a pandemic occurs in areas in which we have material operations or sales, the Company's business activities originating from affected areas, including sales, materials, and supply

chain related activities, could be adversely affected. Disruptive activities could include the temporary closure of facilities used in the Company's supply chain processes, restrictions on the export or shipment of products necessary to run the Company's business, business closures in impacted areas, and restrictions on the Company's employees' or consultants' ability to travel and to meet with customers, vendors or other business relationships. The extent to which a pandemic or other health outbreak impacts the Company's results will depend on future developments, which are highly uncertain and cannot be predicted, including new information which may emerge concerning the severity of a virus and the actions to contain it or treat its impact, among others. Pandemics can also result in social, economic, and labor instability which may adversely impact the Company's business. If the Company's employees or employees of any of the Company's vendors, suppliers or customers become ill or are quarantined and in either or both events are therefore unable to work, the Company's operations could be subject to disruption. The extent to which a pandemic affects the Company's results will depend on future developments that are highly uncertain and cannot be predicted.

15. Your shares are not easily transferable: You should not plan on being able to readily transfer and/or resell your security. Currently there is no market or liquidity for these shares and the Company does not have any plans to list these shares on an exchange or other secondary market. At some point the Company may choose to do so, but until then you should plan to hold your investment for a significant period of time before a liquidation event occurs, if ever.
16. You may only receive limited ongoing disclosure: While the Company must disclose certain information, since the Company is at an early stage, it is only able to provide limited information about its business plan and operations because it does not have fully developed operations or a long history. The Company may also only be obligated to file information periodically regarding its business, including financial statements. A publicly listed company, in contrast, is required to file annual and quarterly reports and promptly disclose certain events — through continuing disclosure that you can use to evaluate the status of your investment.
17. The Company may never receive a future equity financing or undergo a liquidity event such as a sale of the Company or an initial public offering (IPO): If a liquidity event does not occur, such as a sale of the Company or an IPO, the purchasers could be left holding Company securities in perpetuity. The Company's securities have numerous transfer restrictions and will likely be highly illiquid, with potentially no secondary market on which to sell them. The securities have only a minority of voting rights and do not provide the ability to direct the Company or its actions.
18. Future fundraising may affect the rights of investors: The Company is raising funds to finance its expansion plans, and may raise additional funds in the future, either through offerings of securities or borrowing from banks or other lending sources. The terms of future capital raises or loan agreements may include covenants that give security holders or creditors greater control over the Company's ability to raise additional funds and use of its assets.
19. There is a slim chance that the Wind Harvester 4.0 turbine will not achieve certification. If it doesn't, the turbine may have to be remade and reinstalled to undergo the process again. This is highly unlikely to happen given the Company's computer modeling results from its Model 3.1, but anything is possible.
20. *The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission does not pass upon the merits of any securities offered or the terms of the offering, nor does it pass upon the accuracy or completeness of any offering document or literature.*

21. *Neither the Offering nor the Securities have been registered under federal or state securities laws, leading to an absence of certain regulation applicable to the Company.*

The securities being offered have not been registered under the Securities Act of 1933 (the "Securities Act"), in reliance on exemptive provisions of the Securities Act. Similar reliance has been placed on

apparently available exemptions from securities registration or qualification requirements under applicable state securities laws. No assurance can be given that any offering currently qualifies or will continue to qualify under one or more of such exemptive provisions due to, among other things, the adequacy of disclosure and the manner of distribution, the existence of similar offerings in the past or in the future, or a change of any securities law or regulation that has retroactive effect. If, and to the extent that, claims or suits for rescission are brought and successfully concluded for failure to register any offering or other offerings or for acts or omissions constituting offenses under the Securities Act, the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, or applicable state securities laws, the Company could be materially adversely affected, jeopardizing the Company's ability to operate successfully. Furthermore, the human and capital resources of the Company could be adversely affected by the need to defend actions under these laws, even if the Company is ultimately successful in its defense.

22. The Company has the right to extend the Offering Deadline, conduct multiple closings, or end the Offering early.

The Company may extend the Offering Deadline beyond what is currently stated herein. This means that your investment may continue to be held in escrow while the Company attempts to raise the Minimum Amount even after the Offering Deadline stated herein is reached. While you have the right to cancel your investment up to 48 hours before an Offering Deadline, if you choose to not cancel your investment, your investment will not be accruing interest during this time and will simply be held until such time as the new Offering Deadline is reached without the Company receiving the Minimum Amount, at which time it will be returned to you without interest or deduction, or the Company receives the Minimum Amount, at which time it will be released to the Company to be used as set forth herein. Upon or shortly after release of such funds to the Company, the Securities will be issued and distributed to you. If the Company reaches the target offering amount prior to the Offering Deadline, they may conduct the first of multiple closings of the Offering prior to the Offering Deadline, provided that the Company gives notice to the investors of the closing at least five business days prior to the closing (absent a material change that would require an extension of the Offering and reconfirmation of the investment commitment). Thereafter, the Company may conduct additional closings until the Offering Deadline. The Company may also end the Offering early; if the Offering reaches its target offering amount after 21-calendar days but before the deadline, the Company can end the Offering with 5 business days' notice. This means your failure to participate in the Offering in a timely manner, may prevent you from being able to participate – it also means the Company may limit the amount of capital it can raise during the Offering by ending it early.

23. The Company's management may have broad discretion in how the Company uses the net proceeds of the Offering.

Despite that the Company has agreed to a specific use of the proceeds from the Offering, the Company's management will have considerable discretion over the allocation of proceeds from the Offering. You may not have the opportunity, as part of your investment decision, to assess whether the proceeds are being used appropriately.

24. The Securities issued by the Company will not be freely tradable until one year from the initial purchase date. Although the Securities may be tradable under federal securities law, state securities regulations may apply, and each Investor should consult with his or her attorney.

You should be aware of the long-term nature of this investment. There is not now and likely will not be a public market for the Securities. Because the Securities offered in this Offering have not been registered under the Securities Act or under the securities laws of any state or non-United States jurisdiction, the Securities have transfer restrictions and cannot be resold in the United States except pursuant to Rule 501 of Regulation CF. It is not currently contemplated that registration under the Securities Act or other securities laws will be affected. Limitations on the transfer of the shares of Securities may also adversely affect the price that you might be able to obtain for the shares of

Securities in a private sale. Investors should be aware of the long-term nature of their investment in the Company. Investors in this Offering will be required to represent that they are purchasing the Securities for their own account, for investment purposes and not with a view to resale or distribution thereof.

25. *Investors will not be entitled to any inspection or information rights other than those required by Regulation CF.*

Investors will not have the right to inspect the books and records of the Company or to receive financial or other information from the Company, other than as required by Regulation CF. Other security holders of the Company may have such rights. Regulation CF requires only the provision of an annual report on Form C and no additional information – there are numerous methods by which the Company can terminate annual report obligations, resulting in no information rights, contractual, statutory or otherwise, owed to Investors. This lack of information could put Investors at a disadvantage in general and with respect to other security holders.

26. *The shares of Securities acquired upon the Offering may be significantly diluted as a consequence of subsequent financings.*

Company equity securities will be subject to dilution. Company intends to issue additional equity to future employees and third-party financing sources in amounts that are uncertain at this time, and as a consequence, holders of Securities will be subject to dilution in an unpredictable amount. Such dilution may reduce the purchaser's economic interests in the Company.

27. The amount of additional financing needed by Company will depend upon several contingencies not foreseen at the time of this Offering. Each such round of financing (whether from the Company or other investors) is typically intended to provide the Company with enough capital to reach the next major corporate milestone. If the funds are not sufficient, Company may have to raise additional capital at a price unfavorable to the existing investors. The availability of capital is at least partially a function of capital market conditions that are beyond the control of the Company. There can be no assurance that the Company will be able to predict accurately the future capital requirements necessary for success or that additional funds will be available from any source. Failure to obtain such financing on favorable terms could dilute or otherwise severely impair the value of the investor's Company securities.

28. *There is no present public market for these Securities and we have arbitrarily set the price.*

The offering price was not established in a competitive market. We have arbitrarily set the price of the Securities with reference to the general status of the securities market and other relevant factors. The Offering price for the Securities should not be considered an indication of the actual value of the Securities and is not based on our net worth or prior earnings. We cannot assure you that the Securities could be resold by you at the Offering price or at any other price.

29. In addition to the risks listed above, businesses are often subject to risks not foreseen or fully appreciated by the management. It is not possible to foresee all risks that may affect us. Moreover, the Company cannot predict whether the Company will successfully effectuate the Company's current business plan. Each prospective Investor is encouraged to carefully analyze the risks and merits of an investment in the Securities and should take into consideration when making such analysis, among other, the Risk Factors discussed above.

The Offering

Wind Harvest International, Inc. (“Company”) is offering securities under Regulation CF, through Netcapital Funding Portal Inc. (“Portal”). Portal is a FINRA/SEC registered funding portal and will receive cash compensation equal to 4.9% of the value of the securities sold through Regulation CF. Investments made under Regulation CF involve a high degree of risk and those investors who cannot afford to lose their entire investment should not invest.

The Company plans to raise between \$10,000 and \$2,500,000 through an offering under Regulation CF. Specifically, if we reach the target offering amount of \$10,000, we may conduct the first of multiple or rolling closings of the offering early if we provide notice about the new offering deadline at least five business days prior to such new offering deadline (absent a material change that would require an extension of the offering and reconfirmation of the investment commitment). The Company is headquartered in Sacramento, California. On April 7, 2020, the Company formed a wholly-owned subsidiary, Wind Harvest Pilot Project, Inc., a Delaware public benefit corporation. Results of Operations: The Company is in its pre-revenue stage. During the year ended December 31, 2023, the Company recorded operating expenses of approximately \$1,200,000. This amount has not been audited or reviewed by a CPA. Operating expenses for the year ended December 31, 2022 increased by \$145,272 to \$2,010,628, as compared to \$1,865,356 reported for the year ended December 31, 2021. Interest expense for the year ended December 31, 2022 decreased by \$33,584 to \$772,502, as compared to \$738,918 reported for the year ended December 31, 2021. Other income for the year ended December 31, 2022 increased by \$1,967,932 to \$2,017,675, as compared to \$49,743 reported for the year ended December 31, 2021. Liquidity & Capital Resources: During March 2024, the Company had approximately \$86,000 of cash in the bank. On December 31, 2022, the Company recorded convertible notes payables of \$5,102,487. From January 1, 2023 through March 26, 2024, the balance of the convertible notes payables increased by \$1,401,039. As a result, the outstanding balance of the convertible notes payables is now \$6,504,526. On December 31, 2022, the Company recorded promissory notes payables of \$532,841.
