Opinion on the Financial Statement

We have audited the accompanying statement of financial condition of Greystone Broker Dealer Corp (the Company) as of December 31, 2018, and the related notes to the financial statement (collectively, the financial statement). In our opinion, the financial statement presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Company as of December 31, 2018, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

This financial statement is the responsibility of the Company's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the Company's financial statement based on our audit. We are a public accounting firm registered with the Public Company Accounting Oversight Board (United States) (PCAOB) and are required to be independent with respect to the Company in accordance with U.S. federal securities laws and the applicable rules and regulations of the Securities and Exchange Commission and the PCAOB.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the standards of the PCAOB. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement is free of material misstatement, whether due to error or fraud. The Company is not required to have, nor were we engaged to perform, an audit of its internal control over financial reporting. 1. Organization and Business

Greystone Broker Dealer Corp (the "Company"), incorporated under the laws of the state of Delaware, is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority ("FINRA") and of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board ("MSRB"). The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Greystone BD Holdings LLC (the "Parent").

The Company's operations consist of underwriting municipal securities; acting as a municipal securities broker or dealer; investment advisory services; private placement of securities and acting as a U.S. registered broker-dealer intermediary pursuant to SEC Rule 15a-6 for private placement services.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

These financial statements were prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America which requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Cash

All cash deposits, which at times are in excess of Federally insured limits, are held by one financial institution and therefore are subject to the credit risk at that financial institution. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts and does not believe there to be any significant credit risk with respect to these deposits.

Income Taxes

The Company has elected to be treated as a Subchapter S Corporation for federal and New York State income tax purposes. As an S Corporation, the Company is subject to New York City General Corporation tax and a New York State tax surcharge, while the stockholder is liable for personal income taxes on the Company's taxable income.

The Company recognizes tax benefits or expense on the temporary differences between the tax basis and book basis of its assets and liabilities. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using enacted tax rates expected to apply to taxable income in the years in which those temporary differences are expected to be recovered or settled.

Management is responsible for determining whether a tax position taken by the Company is more likely than not to be sustained on the merits. Tax laws are complex and subject to different interpretations by the taxpayer and taxing authorities. Significant judgment is required when evaluating tax provisions and related uncertainties. Future events such as changes in tax legislation could require a provision for income taxes. Any such changes could significantly affect the amounts reported in the statement of operations. The Company remains subject to U.S. federal and state income tax audits for all periods since inception.

3. Transactions with Related Parties

The Company has entered into an Expense Sharing Agreement (“ESA”) with its Parent and an affiliate (the “ESA Parties”) whereby the ESA Parties provide office and administrative services, payroll and professional services at no charge to the Company. The ESA has a term of one year and is automatically renewed annually, unless terminated or modified by written notice. The Company does not have any obligation, direct or indirect, to reimburse or otherwise compensate the ESA Parties for any or all costs that the ESA Parties have paid on behalf of the Company. These costs have not been recorded on the books of the Company.

The terms of these arrangements may not be the same as those that would otherwise exist or result from agreements and transactions among unrelated parties.

4. Due from Clearing Broker

Pursuant to an agreement with a clearing broker, the Company is required to maintain a clearing deposit of \$50,000.

5. Regulatory Requirements

The Company is subject to the SEC Uniform Net Capital Rule 15c3-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. At December 31, 2018, the Company had net capital of \$224,929 which exceeded the required net capital by \$124,929.

The Company operates under the exemptive provision of Rule 15c3-3 paragraph (k)(2)(ii) under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Company does not handle cash or securities on behalf of customers.

6. Concentration

Substantially all of the cash assets of the Company are held by one bank and a single clearing broker dealer.

7. Indemnifications

In the normal course of its business, the Company indemnifies its clearing broker against specified potential losses in connection with their acting as an agent of, or providing services to, the Company. The maximum potential amount of future payments that the Company could be required to make under this indemnification cannot be estimated. However, the Company believes that it is unlikely it will have to make material payments under these arrangements and has not recorded any contingent liability in the financial statements for this indemnification.
