Zachary is the founder and CEO of Deshyo. Originally from Denver, CO he graduated from the University of Colorado at Boulder with a degree in Political Science. Immediately following his graduation he worked in local and state politics in Denver. In November 2014, he started working for a startup called Education Funding Partners as a utility player (Sales Associate/Operations/Accounting/Marketing were all under his purview). He then found a position as the Birthright Recruitment Manager for Texas Hillel Foundation in Austin, Texas starting in August of 2015. He began working on his startup in December of 2016 and now works on it full time in Los Angeles, CA.

Business and Anticipated Business Plan

6. Describe in detail the business of the issuer and the anticipated business plan of the issuer.

My company is a web application with the intention of becoming a mobile app as well. It is a content aggregation platform based on timestamp publishing (no algorithm and no curation through an editorial board). The main objective of the company is to increase discoverability and engagement of content creators and content by giving more control back to the content creators and to general users. Anyone who publishes original content (journalists, photographers, podcasts, musicians, bloggers, YouTube personalities, etc.) will have their own personal feed where they can paste the URL links from the various publishing platforms that they use, thereby consolidating all of their audiences into a single location. If someone is a general user, they will be able to create personally curated feeds based upon the content creators they follow. These personally curated feeds will be populated by the content published from the content directors of which they follow, thereby allowing users to engage with the content they only wish to see at any given moment. Content will be discovered and shared throughout the platform through personal recommendations, both passive and active. Passive personal recommendations will come through rating each piece of content, and active recommendations will be achieved by "sending" the content to another user's inbox for them to engage and rate. Content creators will be able to eventually opt into a native ad platform where brands/marketers will have the ability to purchase ads directly onto the feeds of the content creators. The content creators and the company will then split the revenue generated from the specific advertisement.

Risk Factors

A crowdfunding investment involves risk. You should not invest any funds in this offering unless you can afford to lose your entire investment.

7. Material factors that make an investment in Deshyo LLC speculative or risky:

1. If Deshyo is unable to raise additional capital on acceptable terms, it may be unable to maintain sufficient growth or commercialize its products. Deshyo will require substantial future capital in order to continue to conduct research and development as well as marketing required to scale the business. There can be no assurance that additional funding will be available on acceptable terms. Failure to satisfy our capital requirements will adversely affect the Company's business, financial condition and results of operations because the Company would be left without the capital required to complete product development, obtain regulatory approvals, or establish sales and marketing capabilities.
2. Because Deshyo has a history of operating losses, and expects to generate operating losses for the foreseeable future, it may not achieve profitability for some time, if at all. Deshyo is in an early stage of development and, therefore, has a limited history of operations.
3. Deshyo is faced with all of the risks associated with a company in the early stage of development. In addition, Deshyo's business is subject to numerous risks associated with a new company engaged in content, media, and entertainment. Such risks include, among other things, competition from well-established and well-capitalized companies and unanticipated development difficulties and risks associated with the need for regulatory approval. Because Deshyo is focused on product development, the Company has not generated significant product revenues to date. The Company has incurred losses each year of its operations and expects to continue to incur losses for the foreseeable future.
4. The process of developing Deshyo's products requires significant research and development which is costly and does not result in revenues or profits. There can be no assurance that Deshyo will ever generate sufficient commercial sales or achieve profitability. Should this be the case, investors could lose their entire investment.
5. Our future growth depends on our ability to develop and retain customers. Our future growth depends to a large extent on our ability to effectively anticipate and adapt to customer requirements and offer services that meet customer demands. If we are unable to attract customers and/or retain customers, our business, results of operations and financial condition may be materially adversely affected.
6. Any valuation at this stage is difficult to assess. Unlike listed companies that are valued publicly through market-driven stock prices, the valuation of private companies, especially startups, is difficult to assess and you may risk overpaying for your investment. In addition, there may be additional classes of equity with rights that are superior to the class of equity being sold.
7. The Company does not anticipate paying any cash dividends for the foreseeable future. The Company currently intends to retain future earnings, if any, for the foreseeable future, to repay indebtedness and to support its business. The Company does not intend in the foreseeable future to pay any dividends to holders of its membership units.
8. We are highly dependent on the Services of our founder. Our future business and results of operations depend in significant part upon the continued contributions of our CEO and founder. If we lose those services or if he fails to perform in his current position, or if we are not able to attract and retain skilled employees in addition to our CEO and the current team, this could adversely affect the development of our business plan and harm our business.
9. Our management may not be able to control costs in an effective or timely manner. The Company's management anticipates it can use reasonable efforts to assess, predict and control costs and expenses. However, implementing our business plan may require more employees, capital equipment, supplies or other expenditure items than management has predicted. Likewise, the cost of compensating employees and consultants or other operating costs may be higher than management's estimates, which could lead to sustained losses.
10. Investment in personnel. An early-stage investment is also an investment in the entrepreneur or

management of the company. Being able to execute on the business plan is often an important factor in whether the business is viable and successful. You should be aware that a portion of your investment may fund the compensation of the company's employees, including its management. You should carefully review any disclosure regarding the company's use of proceeds.

11. You may only receive limited disclosure. While the company must disclose certain information, since the company is at an early-stage they may only be able to provide limited information about its business plan and operations because it does not have fully developed operations or a long history. The company may also only be obligated to file information periodically regarding its business, including financial statements. A publicly listed company, in contrast, is required to file annual and quarterly reports and promptly disclose certain events — through continuing disclosure that you can use to evaluate the status of your investment.
12. Third parties might infringe upon our technology. We cannot assure you that the steps we take to protect our property rights will prevent misappropriation of our technology. To protect our rights to our intellectual property, we plan to rely on a combination of trade secrets, confidentiality agreements and other contractual arrangements with our employees, affiliates, strategic partners and others. We may be unable to detect inappropriate use of our technology. Failure to adequately protect our intellectual property could materially harm our brand, devalue our proprietary content and affect our ability to compete effectively. Further, defending any technology rights could result in significant financial expenses and managerial resources.
13. Any forecasts we make about our operations may prove to be inaccurate. We must, among other things, determine appropriate risks, rewards, and level of investment in our product lines, respond to economic and market variables outside of our control, respond to competitive developments and continue to attract, retain, and motivate qualified employees. There can be no assurance that we will be successful in meeting these challenges and addressing such risks and the failure to do so could have a materially adverse effect on our business, results of operations, and financial condition. Our prospects must be considered in light of the risks, expenses, and difficulties frequently encountered by companies in the early stage of development. As a result of these risks, challenges, and uncertainties, the value of your investment could be significantly reduced or completely lost.
14. Failure to comply with laws and contractual obligations related to data privacy and protection could have a material adverse effect on our business, financial condition and operating results.
15. Risk of Security Breach: We could be liable for breaches of security on our website, fraudulent activities of our users, or the failure of third party vendors to deliver credit card transaction processing services. A fundamental requirement for operating an Internet-based business is the secure transmission of confidential information and media over public networks. Although we design our systems and processes to protect consumer information and prevent fraudulent credit card transactions and other security breaches, failure to mitigate such fraud or breaches may adversely affect our operating results.
16. Technological Risk: We operate in an emerging market that is characterized by rapid changes in customer requirements, frequent introductions of new and enhanced products, and continuing and rapid technological advancement. Our technology may under perform the technology utilized by our competitors.
17. Reputation Risk: Maintaining our reputation is critical to our ability to attract and retain clients, and our failure, or perceived failure, to appropriately operate our business or deal with matters that give rise to reputation risk may materially and adversely harm our business, prospects and results of operations. Our failure to deliver appropriate standards of service and quality could result in customer dissatisfaction, litigation and heightened regulatory scrutiny, all of which can lead to lost revenue, higher operating costs and harm to our reputation. Further, negative publicity regarding us, whether or not true, may be detrimental to our business.
18. Competition Risk: Intense competition in the markets in which we compete could prevent us from generating or sustaining revenue growth and generating or maintaining profitability. Our business is competitive, and we expect it to become increasingly competitive in the future as more startups enter the industry. We may also face competition from large companies, any of which might have more capital than we have, and launch its own business that competes with us.
19. Your units are not easily transferable. You should not plan on being able to readily transfer and/or resell your security. Currently, there is no market or liquidity for these units and the

company does not have any plans to list these securities on an exchange or other secondary market. At some point the company may choose to do so, but until then you should plan to hold your investment for a significant period of time before a “liquidation event” occurs. A “liquidation event” is when the company either lists their securities on an exchange, is acquired or goes bankrupt.

The Offering

Deshyo LLC (“Company”) is offering securities under Regulation CF, through Netcapital Funding Portal Inc. (“Portal”). Portal is a FINRA/SEC registered funding portal and will receive cash compensation equal to 4.9% of the value of the securities sold through Regulation CF. Investments made under Regulation CF involve a high degree of risk and those investors who cannot afford to lose their entire investment should not invest.

The Company plans to raise between \$10,000 and \$100,000 through an offering under Regulation CF. Specifically, if we reach the target offering amount of \$10,000, we may conduct the first of multiple or rolling closings of the offering early if we provide notice about the new offering deadline at least five business days prior to such new offering deadline (absent a material change that would require an extension of the offering and reconfirmation of the investment commitment). Oversubscriptions will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Changes to the offering, material or otherwise, occurring after a closing, will only impact investments which have yet to be closed.

In the event The Company fails to reach the offering target of \$10,000, any investments made under the offering will be cancelled and the investment funds will be returned to the investor.

8. What is the purpose of this offering?

The main focus of the funds (60%+) is expected to be on web development, attracting a Chief Technology Officer and rounding out the development team. Another use of funds is expected to be content management. When the site is built, we believe it will be critical that the first content published falls within the terms and conditions set forth by the company and are up to the standards of quality (i.e. nothing inappropriate). We'll need 1-2 people who can monitor the site and remove any inappropriate content or content that violates our terms and conditions. Next, we plan to focus on customer acquisition, specifically recruiting more content creators to join the site. Finally, legal research and IP protection.

10. How will the issuer complete the transaction and deliver securities to the investors?

In entering into an agreement on the Netcapital Funding Portal to purchase securities, both investors and Deshyo LLC must agree that a transfer agent, which keeps records of our outstanding Units (the "Securities"), will issue digital Securities in the investor's name (a paper certificate will not be printed). Similar to other online investment accounts, the transfer agent will give investors access to a web site to see the number of Securities that they own in our company. These Securities will be issued to investors after the deadline date for investing has passed, as long as the targeted offering amount has been reached. The transfer agent will record the issuance when we have received the purchase proceeds from the escrow agent who is holding your investment commitment.

11. How can an investor cancel an investment commitment?

You may cancel an investment commitment for any reason until 48 hours prior to the deadline identified in the offering by logging in to your account with Netcapital, browsing to the Investments screen, and clicking to cancel your investment commitment. Netcapital will notify investors when the target offering amount has been met. If the issuer reaches the target offering amount prior to the deadline identified in the offering materials, it may close the offering early if it provides notice about the new offering deadline at least five business days prior to such new offering deadline (absent a material change that would require an extension of the offering and reconfirmation of the investment commitment). If an investor does not cancel an investment commitment before the 48-hour period prior to the offering deadline, the funds will be released to the issuer upon closing of the offering and the investor will receive securities in exchange for his or her investment. If an investor does not reconfirm his or her investment commitment after a material change is made to the offering, the investor's investment commitment will be cancelled and the committed funds will be returned.

12. Can the Company perform multiple closings or rolling closings for the offering?

If we reach the target offering amount prior to the offering deadline, we may conduct the first of multiple closings of the offering early, if we provide notice about the new offering deadline at least five business days prior (absent a material change that would require an extension of the offering and reconfirmation of the investment commitment). Thereafter, we may conduct additional closings until the offering deadline. We will issue Securities in connection with each closing. Oversubscriptions will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Changes to the offering, material or otherwise, occurring after a closing, will only impact investments which have yet to be

closed.

Ownership and Capital Structure

The Offering

13. Describe the terms of the securities being offered.

We are issuing Securities at an offering price of \$0.10 per share.

14. Do the securities offered have voting rights?

The Securities are being issued with voting rights. However, so that the crowdfunding community has the opportunity to act together and cast a vote as a group when a voting matter arises, a custodian will cast your vote for you. Please refer to the custodian agreement that you sign before your purchase is complete.

15. Are there any limitations on any voting or other rights identified above?

You are giving your voting rights to the custodian, who will vote the Securities on behalf of all investors who purchased Securities on the Netcapital crowdfunding portal.

16. How may the terms of the securities being offered be modified?

We may choose to modify the terms of the securities before the offering is completed. However, if the terms are modified, and we deem it to be a material change, we need to contact you and you will be given the opportunity to reconfirm your investment. Your reconfirmation must be completed within five business days of receipt of the notice of a material change, and if you do not reconfirm, your investment will be canceled and your money will be returned to you.

Restrictions on Transfer of the Securities Offered

The securities being offered may not be transferred by any purchaser of such securities during the one-year period beginning when the securities were issued, unless such securities are transferred:

- to the issuer;
- to an accredited investor;
- as part of an offering registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission; or
- to a member of the family of the purchaser or the equivalent, to a trust controlled by the purchaser, to a trust created for the benefit of a member of the family of the purchaser or the equivalent, or in connection with the death or divorce of the purchaser or other similar circumstance.

Deshyo's Operating Agreement can be amended by the majority holder of the Member Units. As minority owners, the Netcapital investors are subject to the decisions made by the majority owner. The issued and outstanding membership interest units give management voting control of the company. As a minority owner, you may be outvoted on issues that impact your investment, such as the issuance of new units, or the sale of debt, convertible debt or assets of the company.

As the holder of a majority of the voting rights in the company, our CEO may make decisions with which you disagree, or that negatively affect the value of your investment in the company, and you will have no recourse to change those decisions. The issuance of additional membership interest units will dilute the ownership of the Netcapital

investors. If we repurchase securities, so that the above risk is mitigated, and there are fewer units outstanding, we may not have enough cash available for marketing expenses, growth, or operating expenses to reach our goals. If we do not have enough cash to operate and grow, we anticipate the market price of our membership units would decline. A sale of our company or of the assets of our company may result in an entire loss of your investment. Financial Condition of the Issuer

27. Does the issuer have an operating history?

Yes.

28. Describe the financial condition of the issuer, including, to the extent material, liquidity, capital resources and historical results of operations.

Deshyo's financial history is not long, but it has key indicators of financial responsibility and early buy-in. Founder Zach Silverman has shown he is extremely cautious with money, never spending capital he has not already obtained prior to its expenditure. With half of the historical investment coming from Zach Silverman himself, he has shown a willingness to place his money at equal risk as his investors due to his belief in the mission and vision of the company. Deshyo received its first outside investment of \$5,000 in November of 2017 with no working product, which was critical for completion of the first iteration of the Minimum Viable Product (MVP). When the company realized the first iteration would not be enough, it sought further investment to complement the existing funds originating from the founder in order to complete the MVP; Deshyo obtained two more outside investments totaling \$8,000 in order to complete the MVP and to provide extra runway. This extra runway with an additional investment by the founder will lead to the finalization of the MVP for the sake of a beta test in the next 6-8 weeks. At this juncture, Deshyo needs an extremely large injection of capital in order to properly test the MVP, and to accrue and analyze the data necessary to entice larger capital investments. The Founder wishes to utilize the proceeds from this offering immediately to complement founder equity to build out a full time development team, take the necessary steps to protect intellectual property, acquire customers, and to provide runway until the next round of fundraising begins.
