## Ownership and Capital Structure

### THE OFFERING

The SAFEs. We are offering securities in the form of a Simple Agreement for Future Equity ("SAFE"), which provides Investors the right to **preferred stock** in the Company ("**Preferred Stock**"), when and if the Company sponsors an equity offering that involves **Preferred Stock**, on the standard terms offered to other Investors.

*Conversion to Preferred Equity.* Based on our SAFEs, when we engage in an offering of equity interests involving **Preferred Stock**, **Investors will receive a number of shares of Preferred Stock** calculated using the method that results in the greater number of **Preferred Stock**:

(i) the total value of the Investor's investment, divided by (a) the price of **Preferred Stock** issued to new Investors multiplied by (b) the **discount rate** (90%), or (ii) if the valuation for the company is more than **\$25 million** (the "Valuation Cap"), the amount invested by the Investor divided by the quotient of (a) the Valuation Cap divided by (b) the total amount of the Company's capitalization at that time. (iii) for investors up to the first **\$250,000** of the securities, investors will receive a valuation cap of **\$25,000,000** and a discount rate of 80%

*Additional Terms of the Valuation Cap.* For purposes of option (ii) above, the Company's capitalization will be measured as all **shares of stock** outstanding at the time, not including any SAFEs or convertible notes, plus any **common stock** reserved and available for future grant under any equity incentive or similar plan of the Company or to be created or increased in connection with our equity offering at that time.

Investors who receive shares subject to the Valuation Cap will receive a per



share liquidation preference and conversion price designed to provide protection against the price of the **Preferred Stock** being diluted to a value below the price per share at the time they receive **Preferred Stock**. This dilution would mainly occur due to the issuance of additional stock by the Company.

Investors who receive **Preferred Stock** subject to the Valuation Cap will also receive dividend rights.

*No Voting Rights.* Investors will have no voting rights. Instead, the Company's CEO will be provided a proxy to vote on the Investor's behalf.

*Private Sales for Major Investors.* Investors who invest at least \$25,000 and are "accredited investors" will receive the right to purchase a pro-rata share of privately placed securities occurring after an equity offering covered by the SAFEs. *Major Investor Threshold* Definition: A major investor is one who invests a minimum of \$25,000.00 and are "accredited investors" as defined by Rule 501 of Regulation D (17 C.F.R. §230.501(a)). Execution. Investors who invest less than \$25,000.00 will typically not execute transaction documents in order to receive Units at the time of an applicable equity offering. Instead, a "Designated Lead Investor" will execute the documents for them, provided that the documents are consistent with the Units received by new investors in the Company, modified, if applicable, based on the terms of the SAFE.

*Liquidity Events.* If the Company has an initial public offering or is acquired by, merged with, or otherwise taken over by another company or new owners prior to Investors in the SAFEs receiving **Preferred Stock**, Investors will receive

- shares of common stock equal to the amount invested by the Investor in the SAFEs divided by the quotient of (a) the Valuation Cap divided by (b) the number of outstanding shares of the Company's **common stock and Preferred Stock**, but excluding any shares of **common stock** reserved and available for future grant under any equity incentive or grant, SAFEs, and/or convertible promissory notes.

Our current projects include the first smart tech building in Jersey City, an AI-powered co-living building by Temple University, and the first minority-owned high rise in Jersey City. All investments in this campaign will go towards the operations of NYCE Companies, Inc. NYCE Companies, Inc. wholly owns the subsidiaries that hold each piece of real estate.

## Milestones

NYCE Companies, Inc. was incorporated in the State of Delaware in January 2020.

Since then, we have:

- Grown from \$850K in seed capital to \$10.2M in assets (through subsidiaries) —all without debt.
- Subsidiaries of NYCE Companies, Inc. have \$57M in projects under development, featured in Forbes, Entrepreneur and BiggerPockets.
- Co-founder is a bonafide soccer star for FC Barcelona with over 500,000 followers on Instagram.
- Founded by bestselling author, award-winning entrepreneurs, and a World Cup/FC Barcelona star.
- Just began construction on 1st AI-powered smart tech building in Philadelphia, as seen in Forbes.
- C-level and all-star advisory board of award-winning real estate professionals and Forbes 30 under 30 alumni.
- NYCE zoning lawyer is behind approvals for 85% of Jersey City skyline projects.

## Runway & Short/Mid Term Expenses

NYCE Companies, Inc.'s cash on hand is \$0 as of February 2020. Over the last

three months, revenues have averaged \$0/month, cost of goods sold has averaged \$0/month, and operational expenses have averaged \$0/month, for an average burn rate of \$0 per month. Our intent is to be profitable in 12 months.

Our current revenues are from one tenant. We only have one tenant right now as we're in the process of constructing a brand-new building. Once the construction is complete, we expect to lease out the building around November 2020, at which point we expect (although cannot guarantee) that it'll generate about \$140k of income annually. That'll be the first brand-new multi-unit property we rent out. We also plan to develop and rent out another property by Summer 2021. That property is approximately 4x the size of our under-construction building, so we estimate it'll generate a lot more revenue. Our costs to rent out are about 20% of the revenue.

Given the Company's limited operating history, the Company cannot reliably estimate how much revenue it will receive in the future, if any.

#### **Milestones**

Riding Phat LLC was incorporated in the State of Arizona in July 2020. The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Phat Scooters, Inc.

Since then, we have:

- 5 year deal with Sony
- Top tier athletes and actors lining up to appear.
- Huge audience for our content

#### **Historical Results of Operations**

Our company was organized in July 2020 and has limited operations upon which prospective investors may base an evaluation of its performance.

- *Revenues & Gross Margin.* For the period ended July 31, 2020, the Company had revenues of \$0.
- *Assets.* As of July 31, 2020, the Company had total assets of \$51,353, including \$5,000 in cash.
- *Net Loss.* The Company has had net losses of \$85 for 2020.
- *Liabilities.* The Company's liabilities totaled \$36,438 for 2020.

#### **Liquidity & Capital Resources**

To-date, the company has been financed with \$36,267 in debt.

After the conclusion of this Offering, should we hit our minimum funding target, our projected runway is no months before we need to raise further capital.

We plan to use the proceeds as set forth in this Form C under "Use of Funds". We don't have any other sources of capital in the immediate future.

We will likely require additional financing in excess of the proceeds from the Offering in order to perform operations over the lifetime of the Company. Except as otherwise described in this Form C, we do not have additional sources of capital other than the proceeds from the offering. Because of the complexities and uncertainties in establishing a new business strategy, it is not possible to adequately project whether the proceeds of this offering will be sufficient to enable us to implement our strategy. This complexity and uncertainty will be increased if less than the maximum amount of securities offered in this offering is sold. The Company intends to raise additional capital in the future from investors. Although capital may be available for early-stage companies, there is no guarantee that the Company will receive any investments from investors.

#### **Runway & Short/Mid Term Expenses**

Riding Phat LLC cash in hand is \$5,000, as of August 2020. Over the last three months, revenues have averaged \$0/month, cost of goods sold has averaged \$0/month, and operational expenses have averaged \$12,000/month, for an

average burn rate of \$12,000 per month. Our intent is to be profitable in 6 months.

We are a brand new LLC. So have limited operating history, no revenues and no guarantee that the show will be a hit or even a moderate success.

We are unsure of the revenues the company will produce. Much of the success is based on viewership. The network sells ads on a CPM basis to ad agencies. The more views the more we get paid.

The Company's main revenue stream will be fees collected from the licensure of its television production. The Company signed a five-year contract for the licensure of the docuseries to Screen Media Ventures, LLC ("the licensee"). The Company is required to deliver the production to the licensee by November 15, 2020. Gross receipts from the release of the docuseries will be allocated among the following:

- A. 25% of all gross receipts for distribution fees paid to the licensee
- B. Reimbursement of distribution costs incurred by the licensee
- C. 60% of the remainder will be remitted to the Company, 40% will be retained by the licensee

We are reliant upon the success of the show, merchandise and our efforts around product placement for further capital. The company expects to begin generating revenue in Q4 2020 from product placements. The company could rely on additional founder funding or a loan from Phat Scooters, Inc. if short term capital was needed.

4. the issuer or another party purchases or repurchases all of the securities issued pursuant to Section 4(a)(6), including any payment in full of debt securities or any complete redemption of redeemable securities; or the issuer liquidates or dissolves in accordance with state law.
