These factors may include but are not limited to: changes in general economic conditions; changes in the regulatory environment that makes it more difficult to operate as planned; the Company's ability to expand its customer base and retain key customers; and reduced margins caused by competitive pressures. In particular, the Company provides services to enterprise customers whose needs may change over any given period of time and which changes could decrease the customers' need for the Company's services. These conditions may have a material adverse effect upon the Company's business, operating results, and financial condition.

Early Stage Company. There can be no assurance that the Company can realize its plans on the projected timetable to reach sustainable or profitable operations. Any material deviation from the Company's timetable could require that the Company seek additional capital. There can be no assurance that such capital shall be available at reasonable cost, or that it would not materially dilute the investment of investors in this Offering if it is obtained. Investment in an early stage company such as this Company is inherently subject to many risks, and investors should be prepared to withstand a complete loss of their investments. The Company only has a limited operating history upon which investors may base an evaluation of its performance; therefore, it is still subject to the entire risks incident to the creation and development of a new business.

Licenses and Permits. In accordance with the laws of the United States, the Company is required to maintain various licenses and permits related to our business, and the loss of or failure to renew any or all of these licenses and permits may require the temporary or permanent suspension of some or all of our operations.

Limited Protection of Proprietary Rights; Potential Costs of Enforcement. The Company's ability to compete effectively with other companies could depend, in part, on its ability to obtain and maintain sufficient legal rights to import and/or license to its customers' intellectual property, e.g., patents, trademarks, copyrights. The Company's success shall also depend, in part, on its ability to obtain and/or enforce intellectual property protection for these assets in the United States and other countries. The Company, in such circumstances, may file applications for patents, copyrights and trademarks, as management deems appropriate. There can be no assurances as to the degree of protection offered by any intellectual property issued to or licensed by the Company. There can be no assurances that competitors, many of whom have substantial resources and substantial investments in competing technologies, shall not seek to apply for and obtain patents that shall prevent, limit or interfere with the Company's ability to make and sell its products and or services. In addition, the laws of certain countries do not protect the Company's proprietary rights to the same extent as do the laws of the United States. The defense and prosecution of patent suits may be both costly and time consuming even if the outcome is favorable to the Company. An adverse outcome could subject the Company to significant liabilities to third parties, require disputed rights to be licensed from third parties, or require the Company to cease selling certain of its products or services. There can be no assurances that confidentiality agreements entered into by the Company's employees and consultants, advisors and collaborators shall provide meaningful protection for the Company's trade secrets, know-how or other proprietary information in the event of any unauthorized use or disclosure of such trade secrets, know-how or other proprietary information.

Rapid Technological Change may Adversely Affect the Company's Business. The Company's ability to become competitive may depend in part upon its ability to develop and introduce its products and services in a timely and cost-effective manner. Interruptions in supply of key components and technologies and/or problems in the Company's relationships with any of its third party vendors may interfere with the Company's ability to deliver its services. Product and service introductions or enhancements by the Company's competitors or the use of other technologies could cause a decline in revenue for the Company's planned products and services. The success of the Company in developing, introducing, selling and supporting new and enhanced products or services depends upon a variety of factors, including timely and efficient completion of service and product research and development and timely and efficient implementation of product and service offerings. Because new product and service commitments may be made well in advance of sales, new product or service decisions must anticipate changes in the industries served. The Company cannot predict the outcome of

ongoing research, and any one or more developments could reduce or eliminate the desirability of the Company's products and services.

Competition. The implementation services industry is highly competitive. The success of the Company's business will depend on the effective and efficient operation of the Company, which is affected by direct competition from other clean technology solutions companies. Most of the Company's principal competitors have greater financial resources than those available to the Company and thus, are in a better position to attract talent, initiate projects and effect changes in cutting edge technologies that are more cost competitive. There can be no assurances that the Company consistently shall be able to undertake technology updates that shall prove profitable to the Company in view of the intense competition to be encountered by the Company in all significant phases of its activities. Competition may preclude, limit or adversely affect the ability of the Company to generate revenues or realize profits.

A Failure, Disruption, Cyberattack, Or Other Breach In The Security Of An Information Technology System Or Infrastructure That The Company Utilizes Could Adversely Affect Its Business And Reputation And Increase Its Costs. The Company's information systems store and process confidential user, employee, and other sensitive personal and business data, and therefore maintaining our network security is of critical importance. We use third-party technology and systems for a variety of information systems operations, including encryption and authentication technology, employee email, domain name registration, content delivery to customers, back-office support, and other functions. The Company's systems, and those of third parties upon which its business relies, may be vulnerable to interruption or damage that could result from natural disasters, fires, power outages, acts of terrorism or other similar events, or from deliberate attacks such as computer hacking, computer viruses, worms or other destructive or disruptive software, process breakdowns, denial of service attacks, malicious social engineering or other malicious activities, or any combination of the foregoing. Such an event could result in a disruption of the Company's services or improper disclosure of personal data or confidential information, which could harm the Company's reputation, require it to expend resources to remedy such a security breach or defend against further attacks, divert management's attention and resources, or subject the Company to liability under laws that protect personal data, resulting in increased operating costs or loss of revenue. The Company has implemented controls and taken other preventative measures designed to strengthen its systems against disruptions and attacks, including measures designed to reduce the impact of a security breach at its third-party vendors. Although the costs of the controls and other measures the Company has taken to date have not had a material effect on its financial condition, results of operations, or liquidity, there can be no assurance as to the cost of additional controls and measures that the Company may conclude are necessary in the future.

We operate in a highly competitive industry that is dominated by a number of exceptionally large, well-capitalized market leaders and the size and resources of some of our competitors may allow them to compete more effectively than we can. The level of competition in the business implementation services industry is high, with multiple exceptionally large, well-capitalized competitors. Many of the companies have longer operating histories, larger customer bases, significantly greater financial, technological, sales, marketing, and other resources than we do. At any point, these companies may decide to devote their resources to creating a competing technology solution which will impact our ability to maintain or gain market share in this industry. Further, such companies may be able to respond more quickly than we can to new or changing opportunities, technologies, standards, or client requirements, more quickly develop new products or devote greater resources to the promotion and sale of their products and services than we can. Likewise, their greater capabilities in these areas may enable them to better withstand periodic downturns in the eligibility enrollment industry and compete

periodic downturns in the eligibility enrollment industry and compete more effectively on the basis of price and production. In addition, new companies may enter the markets in which we compete, further increasing competition in the eligibility enrollment industry. We believe that our ability to compete successfully depends on a number of factors, including the type and quality of our solutions and the strength of our brand, as well as many factors beyond our control. We may not be able to compete successfully against current or future competitors, and increased competition may result in price reductions, reduced profit margins, loss of market share and an inability to generate cash flows that are sufficient to maintain or expand the development and marketing of new solutions, any of which would adversely impact our results of operations and financial condition.

Our business does not currently have an enterprise valuation, and we cannot assure you of an adequate conversion value. We have not engaged an independent third party to provide a valuation of our business. We have also not conducted any prior financing establishing a valuation of the Company. We cannot predict the terms of any future financing, including any future financing that would cause the conversion of the SAFE into equity securities of the Company. Therefore, we give no assurances that conversion of the SAFE into equity securities of the Company will occur at all or would yield adequate value to the holder of the SAFE.

SAFE holders may never get a financial return and may lose all of their investment. The SAFE is a general unsecured obligation of the Company, subordinated by its terms to all debt (as defined in the Agreement). It is possible that the Company will never have the financial resources to be able to pay its obligations under the SAFE. Even if the SAFE converts into equity securities of the Company, we cannot provide any assurance that there will ever be a market for such equity securities or that such equity securities will ever yield any value to the investor.

Need for Additional Financing. Assuming the maximum investment is received, the Company believes that the net proceeds from this Offering and any concurrent offering shall be sufficient to fund the Company's operations as currently conducted for at least the next 12 months. Such belief, however, cannot give rise to an assumption that the Company's cost estimates are accurate or that unforeseen events would not occur that would require the Company to seek additional funding to meet its operational needs. As a result, the Company may require substantial additional financing to implement its business objectives. There can be no assurances that the Company shall be able to obtain additional funding when needed, or that such funding, if available, shall be available on terms acceptable to the Company. Should the Company's operations not generate sufficient cash flow, or the Company cannot acquire additional funds if and when needed, the Company may be forced to curtail or cease its activities which would likely result in the loss to investors of all or a substantial portion of their investments.

Tax Risks. No representation or warranty of any kind is made by the Company, the officers, directors, counsel to the Company, or any other professional advisors thereto with respect to any tax consequences of any investment in the Company. Dilution. After completion of the Offering, and if an Equity Financing follows this Offering and the SAFEs are converted to equity, the Company's then existing equity holders may have their interests diluted through any future issuance of securities by the Company to raise capital. Moreover, equity holders may experience further dilution to the extent that future shares may be issued for a value less than the price paid in this offering. Subsequent investment into the Company may dilute each investor's percentage of ownership in the future. The purchase of equity in this offering does not confer on the investor any rights or protection against this dilution.

Control by Existing Stockholders. Following the Offering and if the securities are converted to equity, the founders and principal stockholders of the Company will continue to own a majority of the common stock of the Company. As a result, such founders and principal stockholders shall have a significant influence on the affairs and management of the Company, as well as on all matters requiring stockholder approval. Such concentration of ownership and control including electing and removing members of the Company's board of directors (the "Board"), causing or restricting the sale or merger of the could have the effect of delaying, deferring or preventing a change in control of the Company even when such a change of control would be in the best interests of the Company's other stockholders.

Limited Liquidity in the Absence of a Public Market. There is no public market in which the equity in this offering may be sold, and it is not guaranteed that any such market shall develop in the foreseeable future. Therefore, purchasers should be prepared to hold their positions indefinitely.

Restrictions on Transfer. After an Equity financing, Investors shall own unregistered securities. The securities may not be transferable under certain securities laws, which require registration or qualification. In such cases, the subscribers desiring to dispose of securities must deliver to the Company an opinion of counsel satisfactory to the Company to the effect that the proposed disposition of securities shall not violate the registration or qualification requirement of relevant state securities law. Because of potential restrictions on transferability of the securities, and the fact that no trading market exists or is guaranteed to develop for the securities, holders of the securities are not likely to be able to liquidate their investments or pledge the securities as security on a loan in the event of an emergency. Thus, the securities should be considered only as a long-term investment. There can be no assurances that the Company will be able to later affect a public registration of its shares (in which the securities may convert). In order to affect value from a public offering, a suitable underwriter must be located and a public market must be maintained following such offering. Typically, in an initial public offering existing shareholders are not permitted to sell their shares in such an offering, and are frequently required by the underwriter to "lock-up" their shares for a period of time thereafter.

Determination of Offering Terms. The offering terms were determined arbitrarily by the Company based upon several factors. Such price is based primarily on the amount of funds sought from this financing and the number of securities the Board is willing to ultimately issue in order to raise such funds. Accordingly, there is no relationship between the price of the Offering and the assets, earnings or book value of the Company, the market value of the Company's stock, or any other recognized criteria of value. As such, the price does not necessarily indicate the current value of the Company and should not be regarded as an indication of any future market price of the Company's capital stock.

Use of Proceeds. The Company intends to use the proceeds from this Offering for general corporate purposes and retains the right to use the proceeds in whatever manner it deems appropriate.

Risk of Managing Growth. As the Company transitions to what the Company hopes will be a company generating substantial revenues, the Company may not be able to manage its growth effectively, which could adversely affect its operations and financial performance. The anticipated growth of the Company could place a strain on the Company's management, and operational and financial resources. Effective management of the anticipated growth will require expanding the Company's management and financial controls, hiring additional appropriate personnel as required, and developing additional expertise by existing management personnel. However, there can be no assurances that these or other measures implemented by the Company shall effectively increase the

implemented by the Company shall effectively increase the Company's capabilities to manage such anticipated growth or to do so in a timely and cost-effective manner. Moreover, management of growth is especially challenging for a company with a short operating history and limited financial resources, and the failure to effectively manage growth could have a material adverse effect on the Company's operations.

Dependence on Key Personnel. The Company is highly dependent on the services of Nish Fonseca, Arun MS, Prasanna Sai, and Punna Paramasivan, and the loss of their services could have an adverse effect on the future operations of the Company. Although the Company does not currently maintain a key-person life insurance policy insuring the lives of these key personnel, the Company may apply for such life insurance policies.

Attraction and Retention of Professional and Qualified Personnel. The Company's ability to realize its objectives shall be dependent on its ability to attract and retain new and qualified marketing, service and administrative personnel. Competition for such personnel can be intense and international hiring regulations can be difficult and complicated, and there can be no assurance that the Company's results shall not be adversely affected by difficulty in attracting and/or retaining qualified personnel. The loss of any key personnel or the failure to hire and retain such personnel successfully in the future could have a material adverse effect on our business, operating results and financial condition. Furthermore, the Company plans to require all personnel to enter into confidentiality agreements as a condition of employment. The Company's management has entered into employment agreements that include confidentiality requirements. However, there can be no assurance that such agreements shall fully protect the Company from competitive injury if any of these individuals leave the Company.

Risks Associated with Financial Projections. The financial projections discussed in our offering materials have been prepared by management and are based upon assumptions that the Company believes to be reasonable. The projected results are dependent on the successful implementation of management's growth strategies and are based on hypothetical assumptions and events over which the Company has only partial or no control. Such assumptions may, however, be incomplete or inaccurate, and unanticipated events and circumstances may occur. The selection of assumptions underlying such projected information has required the exercise of judgment, and the projections are inherently subject to significant uncertainty because that economic, legislative, political or other changes may have on future events. Changes in the facts or circumstances underlying such assumptions could materially affect our ability to achieve the projected results. For these reasons, actual results achieved during the periods covered may be materially and adversely different. Even if the assumptions underlying the Company's plans prove to be correct, there can be no assurances that the Company shall not incur substantial operating losses in attaining its goals. The Company's plans are based on the premise that customers desire the advantages provided by the Company's products and services. However, there can be no assurances that the Company's objectives shall be realized if any of the assumptions underlying its plans prove to be incorrect. Investors should also be aware that no independent market studies have been conducted by the Company regarding the Company's plan, nor are any such studies currently planned.

Risks Related to Economic Conditions. Economic recessions or downturns may have an adverse effect on the Company, its financial condition, results of operations and the Company performance. Negative general economic conditions could continue to reduce the overall amount of demand, which may in turn adversely affect our revenues.

Government and Regulatory Risks. Costs imposed pursuant to U.S. and other nations' governmental laws and regulations may reduce the Company's net income and the cash available for distributions to Investors. In the U.S., privacy issues are subject to federal, state and

In addition, the Company may never undergo a liquidity event such as a sale of the Company or an IPO. The Securities have numerous transfer restrictions and will likely be highly illiquid, with no secondary market on which to sell them. The holders of a majority-in-interest of voting rights in the Company could limit the Investor's rights in a material way. In the future, we will perform valuations of our **stock (including both common stock and Preferred Stock)** that take into account, as applicable, factors such as the following:

- unrelated third party valuations;
- the price at which we sell other securities in light of the relative rights, preferences and privileges of those securities;
- our results of operations, financial position and capital resources;
- current business conditions and projections;
- the marketability or lack thereof of the securities;

- the hiring of key personnel and the experience of our management;
- the introduction of new products;
- the risk inherent in the development and expansion of our products;
- our stage of development and material risks related to our business;
- the likelihood of achieving a liquidity event, such as an initial public offering or a sale of our company given the prevailing market conditions and the nature and history of our business;
- industry trends and competitive environment;
- trends in consumer spending, including consumer confidence;
- overall economic indicators, including gross domestic product, employment, inflation and interest rates; and
- the general economic outlook.

We will analyze factors such as those described above using a combination of financial and market-based methodologies to determine our business enterprise value. For example, we may use methodologies that assume that businesses operating in the same industry will share similar characteristics and that the Company's value will correlate to those characteristics, and/or methodologies that compare transactions in similar securities issued by us that were conducted in the market.

22. What are the risks to purchasers of the securities relating to minority ownership in the issuer?

An Investor in the Company will likely hold a minority position in the Company, and thus be limited as to its ability to control or influence the governance and operations of the Company.

The marketability and value of the Investor's interest in the Company will depend upon many factors outside the control of the Investor. The Company will be managed by its officers and be governed in accordance with the strategic direction and decision-making of its Board Of Directors, and the Investor will have no independent right to name or remove an officer or member of the Board Of Directors of the Company.

Following the Investor's investment in the Company, the Company may sell interests to additional investors, which will dilute the percentage interest of the Investor in the Company. The Investor may have the opportunity to increase its investment in the Company in such a transaction, but such opportunity cannot be assured.

The amount of additional financing needed by the Company, if any, will depend upon the maturity and objectives of the Company. We plan to use the proceeds as set forth in this Form C under "Use of Funds". We don't have any other sources of capital in the immediate future.

We will likely require additional financing in excess of the proceeds from the Offering in order to perform operations over the lifetime of the Company. We plan to raise capital in 12 months. Except as otherwise described in this Form C, we do not have additional sources of capital other than the proceeds from the offering. Because of the complexities and uncertainties in establishing a new business strategy, it is not possible to adequately project whether the proceeds of this offering will be sufficient to enable us to implement our strategy. The Company intends to raise additional capital in the future from investors. Runway & Short/Mid Term Expenses

Evonsys, Inc cash in hand is \$2,684,155, as of February 2022. Over the last three months, revenues have averaged \$1,200,000/month, cost of goods sold has averaged \$0/month, and operational expenses have averaged \$1,000,000/month, for an average net margin of \$200,000 per month. Our intent is to be profitable in 0 months.

Since the date our financial statements cover, our subsidiaries are making more revenue (~\$1m in 2020, ~\$2m in 2021), which will help our consolidated revenue for the year of 2021.

In the next 3-6 months we anticipate our average revenue and expenses to be the same as current trends. We will be seeing a significant increase in closer to march 2023, where new budgets will be available from clients.

We are a profitable organization and we pay taxes from the inception of the business. From a growth standpoint, we were at least growing at 20-30% and 100% during COVID, where there was an increase in digital transformation projects.

We have constant revenue from the 15 clients, where we perform services. On top of it, we have credit lines available to cover the business expenses for 3 months even if there is no revenue at all.
