The Company's fiscal year-end is December 31.

STICKY FINGERS SWEETS & EATS, INC. (NAICS) is a Washington DC based vegan baked goods and casual dining establishment. **Sticky Fingers Sweets & Eats, Inc.** offers their clients customizable vegan, cholesterol, nut and gluten free, Kosher sweet and savory products for dining in, take away and catering options.

STICKY FINGERS SWEETS & EATS, INC. began operations in June 2002. For FY21, the Company generated \$676,864 in revenue and \$197,631 of net income. During 2020 the company posted \$1,017,274 in revenues/sales and net income of \$193,343. These financial results are historical and not representative of what investors should expect in the future.

Milestones

STICKY FINGERS SWEETS & EATS, INC. was started in 1999 in Doron's kitchen before growing into a basement storefront and more recently into a bakery and casual eating establishment that is a haven for foodies and the health conscious alike. Doron Petersan is a two-time winner of the Food Network's Cupcake Wars, and Sticky Fingers Sweets & Eats, Inc. has been featured in the Washingtonian, The Daily Planet and Veg News. Doron Petersan is a graduate of University of Maryland with a degree in Dietetics.

Historical Results of Operations

- Revenues and gross margin. During FY20 and FY21, the Company generated revenues of \$1,017,274 and \$676,864, respectively, while gross margins were 70% and 84%, respectively. This change reflected the impact of the pandemic, which drove deterioration in demand for most of the Company's products and services.
- Net income. For FY20 and FY21, the business generated earnings of \$193,343 and \$197,631, respectively, as the decline in overall revenue was counteracted by increased efficiency in operating expenses.
- Assets. Total assets changed from \$563,930 at year-end FY20 to \$898,954 at year-end FY21.

- Debt. Total debt was \$719,857 at year-end FY20 and \$511,520 at year-end FY21.


