Hypothetical Examples of Amounts Payable at Maturity

The following examples illustrate how the payment at maturity is calculated under various hypothetical circumstances. You should review the following examples in conjunction with the hypothetical table set forth on the previous page, including the underlying assumptions described on the previous page. The hypothetical payments at maturity set forth below are for illustrative purposes only and may not be the actual payment at maturity applicable to a purchaser of the notes. The numbers appearing in the following examplés have been rounded for ease of analysis.

Example 1: The level of the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50® Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 4400 to an Ending Underlying Level of 4664, the FTSE™ 100 Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 6600 to an Ending Underlying Level of 6930, and the level of the Nikkei 225 Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 17000 to an Ending Underlying Level of 18360. Because the Ending Underlying Level of each Component Underlying is greater than its Starting Underlying Level, and each of the Underlying Return of 6.00% for the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index, 5.00% for the FTSE™ 100 Index and 8.00% for the Nikkei 225 Index, each multiplied by 2, does not exceed the applicable Maximum Return of 18.40%, 15.90% and 23.20%, respectively, the Basket Return is calculated as follows:

 $[(6\% \times 2) \times 45\%] + [(5\% \times 2) \times 30\%] + [(8\% \times 2) \times 25\%] = 12.40\%$

Accordingly, the investor receives a payment at maturity of \$1,124.00 per \$1,000 principal amount note, calculated as follows:

\$1,000 + (\$1,000 x 12.40%) = \$1,240.00

Example 2: The level of the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50® Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 4400 to an Ending Underlying Level of 5280, the FTSE™ 100 Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 6600 to an Ending Underlying Level of 8580, and the level of the Nikkei 225 Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 17000 to an Ending Underlying Level of 23800. Because the Ending Underlying Level of each Component Underlying is greater than its Starting Underlying Level, and each of the Underlying Return of 20.00% for the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index, 30.00% for the FTSE[™] 100 Index and 40.00% for the Nikkei 225 Index, each multiplied by 2, exceeds the applicable Maximum Return of 18.40%, 15.90% and 23.20%, respectively, the Basket Return is calculated as follows:

 $(18.40\% \times 45\%) + (15.90\% \times 30\%) + (23.20\% \times 25\%) = 18.85\%$

Accordingly, the investor receives a payment at maturity of \$1,188.50 per \$1,000 principal amount note, which reflects the maximum payment at maturity, calculated as follows:

\$1,000 + (\$1,000 x 18.85%) = \$1,188.50

Example 3: The level of the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 4400 to an Ending Underlying Level of 4840, the FTSE™ 100 Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 6600 to an Ending Underlying Level of 6996, and the level of the Nikkei 225 Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 17000 to an Ending Underlying Level of 18700. Because the Ending Underlying Level of each Component Underlying is greater than its Starting Underlying Level, and the Underlying Return of 10.00% for the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index multiplied by 2 exceeds the applicable Maximum Return of 18.40%, while each of the Underlying Return of 6.00% for the FTSE™ 100 Index and 10.00% for the Nikkei 225 Index, each multiplied by 2, does not exceed the applicable Maximum Return of 15.90% and 23.20%, respectively, the Basket Return is calculated as follows:

 $(18.40\% \times 45\%) + [(6\% \times 2) \times 30\%] + [(10\% \times 2) \times 25\%] = 16.88\%$

Accordingly, the investor receives a payment at maturity of \$1,168.80 per \$1,000 principal amount note, calculated as follows:

\$1,000 + (\$1,000 x 16.88%) = \$1,168.80

Example 4: The level of the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 4400 to an Ending Underlying Level of 3960, the FTSETM 100 Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 6600 to an Ending Underlying Level of 5940, and the level of the Nikkei 225 Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 17000 to an Ending Underlying Level of 15300. Because the Ending Underlying Level of each Component Underlying is less than its Starting Underlying Level by not more than 10%, the investor receives a payment at maturity of \$1,000 per \$1,000 principal amount note.

Example 5: The level of the Dow Jones ÉURO STOXX 50® Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 4400 to an Ending Underlying Level of 3080, the FTSE™ 100 Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 6600 to an Ending Underlying Level of **5280, and the level of the Nikkei 225 Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 17000 to an Ending Underlying Level of 10200.** Because the Ending Underlying Level of each Component Underlying is less than its Starting Underlying Level by more than 10%, the Basket Return is calculated as follows:

{[(-30% + 10%) x 1.1111] x 45%} + {[(-20% + 10%) x 1.1111] x 30%} + {[(-40% + 10%) x 1.1111) x 25%} = -21.666% Accordingly, the investor receives a payment at maturity of \$783.34 per \$1,000 principal amount note, calculated as follows:

Example 6: The level of the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 3080, the FTSE™ 100 Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 6600 to an Ending Underlying Level of the Nikkei 225 Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 17000 to an Ending Underlying Level of 10200. Because the Ending Underlying Level of the FTSE[™] 100 Index is less than its Starting Underlying Level by not more than 10% and the Ending Underlying Level of each of the other Component Underlyings is less than its Starting Underlying Level by more than 10%, the Basket Return is calculated as follows:

 $\{[(-30\% + 10\%) \times 1.1111] \times 45\%\} + 0\% + \{[(-40\% + 10\%) \times 1.1111) \times 25\%\} = -18.333\%$

Accordingly, the investor receives a payment at maturity of \$816.67 per \$1,000 principal amount note, calculated as follows:

\$1,000 + (\$1,000 x -18.333%) = \$816.67 Example 7: The level of the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index increases from a Starting Underlying Level of 4400 to an Ending Underlying Level of 4708, the FTSE™ 100 Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 6600 to an Ending Underlying Level of **5280, and the level of the Nikkei 225 Index decreases from a Starting Underlying Level of 17000 to an Ending Underlying Level of 11190.** Because the Ending Underlying Level of the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index is greater than its Starting Underlying Level, and the Underlying Return of 7.00% multiplied by 2 does not exceed the applicable Maximum Return of 18.40%, and the Ending Underlying Level of each of the other Component Underlyings is less than its Starting Underlying Level by more than 10%, the Basket Return is calculated as follows:

[(7% x 2)x 45%] + {[(-20% + 10%) x 1.1111] x 30%} + {[(-30% + 10%) x 1.1111) x 25%} = -2.589% Accordingly, the investor receives a payment at maturity of \$974.11 per \$1,000 principal amount note, calculated as follows:

 $(1,000 + (1,000 \times -2.589\%) = 974.11$

Selected Purchase Considerations

- APPRECIATION POTENTIAL The notes provide the opportunity to enhance equity returns by multiplying a positive Underlying Return for each Component Underlying by two, up to the Maximum Return of 18.40% for the Dow Jones EURO STOXX 50[®] Index, 15.90% for the FTSE[™] 100 Index and 23.20% for the Nikkei 225 Index. Accordingly, your maximum payment at maturity is \$1,188.50 for every \$1,000 principal amount note. Because the notes are our senior unsecured obligations, payment of any amount at maturity is subject to our ability to pay our obligations as they become due.
- LIMITED PROTECTION AGAINST LOSS Payment at maturity of the principal amount of the notes is protected against a decline in the Ending Underlying Level of each Component Underlying, as compared to the applicable Starting Underlying Level, of up to 10%. If the Ending Underlying Level of a Component Underlying declines by more than 10%, for every 1% decline of the Component Underlying beyond 10%, the Component Return for the Basket Component linked to such Component Underlying will be reduced by 1.1111%.
