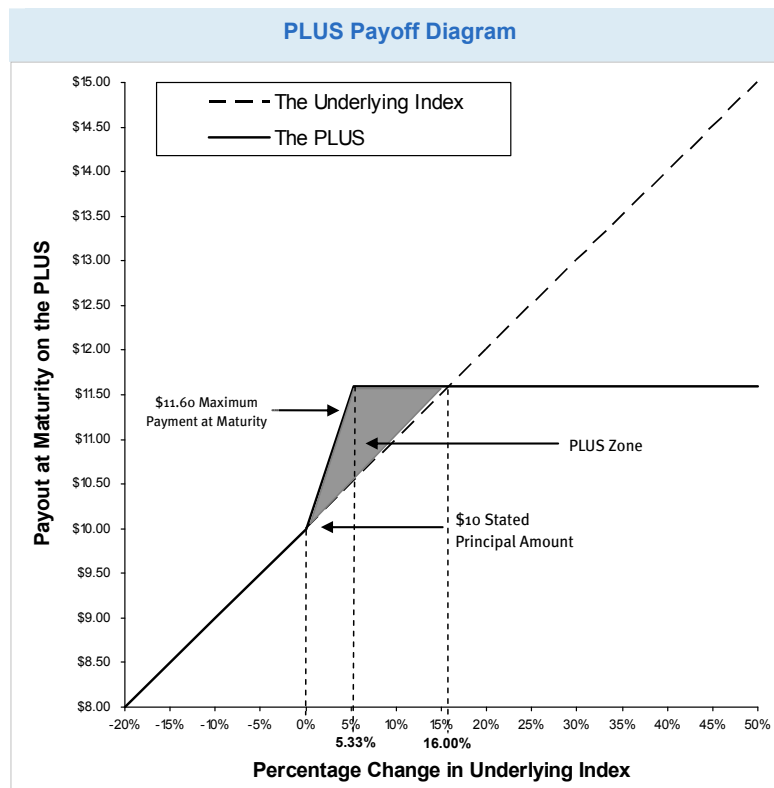
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How PLUS Work

Payoff Diagram

The payoff diagram below illustrates the payment at maturity on the PLUS based on the following terms:

Stated principal amount:	\$10 per PLUS
Leverage factor:	300%
Maximum payment at maturity:	\$11.60 (116% of the stated principal amount)



How it works

- If the final index value is greater than the initial index value, for each \$10 principal amount PLUS investors will receive the \$10 stated principal amount plus 300% of the appreciation of the underlying index over the term of the PLUS, subject to the maximum payment at maturity. In the payoff diagram, an investor will realize the maximum payment at maturity at a final index value of approximately 105.33% of the initial index value.
 - If the underlying index appreciates 4%, the investor would receive a 12% return, or \$11.20.
 - If the underlying index appreciates 30%, the investor would receive only the maximum payment at maturity of \$11.60, or 116% of the stated principal amount.
- If the final index value is less than or equal to the initial index value, the investor would receive an amount less than or equal to the \$10 stated principal amount, based on a 1% loss of principal for each 1% decline in the underlying index.
- If the underlying index depreciates 10%, the investor would lose 10% of their principal and receive \$9 at maturity, or 90% of the stated principal amount.

Payment at Maturity

Because the index performance factor will be less than or equal to 1.0, this payment will be less than or equal to \$10.

Risk Factors

The following is a non-exhaustive list of certain key risk factors for investors in the PLUS. For further discussion of these and other risks, you should read the section entitled "Risk Factors" beginning on page PS-6 of the accompanying product supplement no. MS-1-A-III. We also urge you to consult your investment, legal, tax, accounting and other advisers in connection with your investment in the PLUS.

- **PLUS do not pay interest or guarantee return of principal and your investment in PLUS may result in a loss.** The terms of the PLUS differ from those of ordinary debt securities in that the PLUS do not pay interest nor guarantee payment of the principal amount at maturity. If the final index value is less than the initial index value, the payout at maturity will be an amount in cash that is less than the \$10 stated principal amount of each PLUS by an amount proportionate to the decrease in the value of the underlying index.
- **Appreciation potential is limited to the maximum payment at maturity.** The appreciation potential of PLUS is limited by the maximum payment at maturity of \$11.60 (116% of the stated principal amount) per PLUS. Although the leverage factor provides 300% exposure to any increase in the final index value as compared to the initial index value at maturity, because the payment at maturity will be limited to 116.00% of the stated principal amount for the PLUS, any increase in the final index value by more than 11.60% of the initial index value will not increase the return on the PLUS.

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Information about the Underlying Index

The S&P 500® Index. The S&P 500® Index, which is calculated, maintained and published by Standard & Poor's, a division of The McGraw-Hill Companies, Inc. ("Standard & Poor's"), consists of 500 component stocks selected to provide a performance benchmark for the U.S. equity markets. The calculation of the S&P 500® Index is based on the relative value of the float adjusted aggregate market capitalization of the 500 component companies as of a particular time as compared to the aggregate average market capitalization of the 500 similar companies during the base period of the years 1941 through 1943. The S&P 500® Index is described under the heading "The S&P 500® Index" in the accompanying product supplement no. MS-1-A-III.

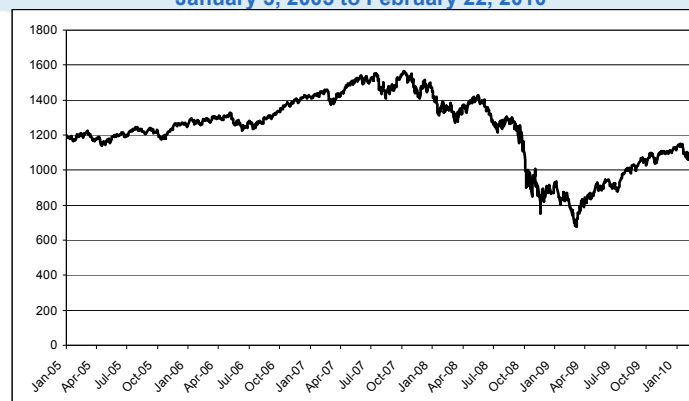
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Historical Information
