


JPMorgan Auto Callable Contingent Interest Notes linked to the Common Stock of Wynn Resorts Ltd due May 21, 2014

The notes are designed for investors who seek a Contingent Interest Payment with respect to each Review Date for which the closing price of one share of the Reference Stock is greater than or equal to the Interest Barrier.

Trade Details/Characteristics	
Reference Stock	The common stock, par value \$0.010 per share, of Wynn Resorts Ltd (WYNN)
Contingent Interest Payments:	<p>If the notes have not been previously called and the closing price of one share of the Reference Stock on any Review Date is greater than or equal to the Interest Barrier, you will receive on the applicable Interest Payment Date for each \$1,000 principal amount note a Contingent Interest Payment equal to \$30.625 (equivalent to an interest rate of 12.25% per annum, payable at a rate of 3.0625% per quarter).</p> <p><i>If the closing price of one share of the Reference Stock on any Review Date is less than the Interest Barrier, no Contingent Interest Payment will be made with respect to that Review Date.</i></p>
Interest Barrier / Trigger Level:	75% of the Initial Stock Price (subject to adjustments)
Interest Rate:	12.25% per annum, payable at a rate of 3.0625% per quarter, if applicable
Automatic Call:	If the closing price of one share of the Reference Stock on any Review Date (other than the final Review Date) is greater than or equal to the Initial Stock Price, the notes will be automatically called for a cash payment, for each \$1,000 principal amount note, equal to (a) \$1,000 <i>plus</i> (b) the Contingent Interest Payment applicable to that Review Date, payable on the applicable Call Settlement Date.
Payment at Maturity:	<p>If the notes have not been previously called and the Final Stock Price is greater than or equal to the Trigger Level, you will receive a cash payment at maturity, for each \$1,000 principal amount note, equal to (a) \$1,000 <i>plus</i> (b) the Contingent Interest Payment applicable to the final Review Date. If the notes have not been previously called and the Final Stock Price is less than the Trigger Level, at maturity you will lose 1% of the principal amount of your notes for every 1% that the Final Stock Price is less than the Initial Stock Price. Under these circumstances, your payment at maturity per \$1,000 principal amount note will be calculated as follows: \$1,000 + (\$1,000 × Stock Return).</p> <p><i>If the notes have not been automatically called and the Final Stock Price is less than the Trigger Level, you will lose more than 25% of your initial investment and may lose all of your initial investment at maturity.</i></p>

What Are the Payments on the Notes, Assuming a Range of Performances for the Reference Stocks?

The following table illustrates payments on the notes, assuming a range of performance for the Reference Stock on a given Review Date. The hypothetical payments set forth below assume an Initial Stock Price of \$130.00, an Interest Barrier and a Trigger Level of \$97.50 (equal to 75% of the hypothetical Initial Stock Price) and reflect the Interest Rate of 12.25% per annum (payable at a rate of 3.0625% per quarter). The hypothetical total returns set forth below are for illustrative purposes only and may not be the actual total returns applicable to a purchaser of the notes. The numbers appearing in the following table and examples have been rounded for ease of analysis.
