Explanation of Responses:

(1) These options were granted under the Issuer’s Stock Option Plans between 8/20/96 and 7/23/02 at exercise prices ranging from \$19.75 to \$35.25, in reliance upon the exemption provided by either old or new Rule 16(b)-3. Each option will expire 10 years from the date of its grant. Generally, the options become exercisable 50% annually after the grant date. The exercisability of some options which are intended to qualify as ISO’s may be further limited by the IRC.

(2) National City Corporation consolidated many of its deferred compensation components into one plan on September 30, 2001. The units of interest in the NCC stock fund under this plan represents the balance that were "invested" in these other plans together with the reinvestment of dividends credited to these investments.
