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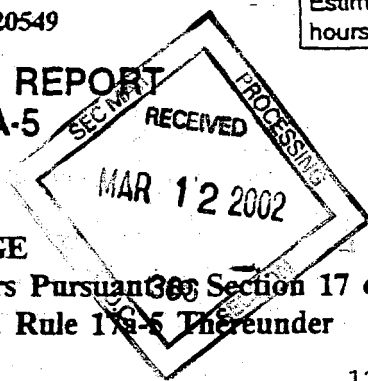

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

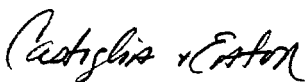
Gentlemen:

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Gould, Ambrosion & Associates Ltd., (the Company) is registered as a broker-dealer in securities and futures transactions under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Company is registered with the SEC and is approved by the N.A.S.D., Inc..

The Company clears all of its transactions through security clearing brokers. The Company acts as a broker-dealer and is exempt from Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c3-3 under paragraph k (2) (ii) since it uses other security firms for clearing.

Pursuant to an agreement between the Company and Clayton Securities Services, Inc., all individual security transactions of the Company and its customers are introduced and cleared on a fully disclosed basis through Clayton Securities Services, Inc. The Company is exempt from provisions of Rule 15c3-3 and is not responsible for compliance with Section 4(c) of Regulation T of the Board of governors of the Federal Reserve System, as all customers' accounts, as defined by such rules, are carried by Clayton Securities Services, Inc..

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies followed by the Company:

Securities Valuation

Marketable securities are valued at market value as determined by the last reported sales price on the last business day of the year, with related changes in unrealized appreciation or depreciation reflected in net income. At December 31, 2001, the Company did not maintain a position in any marketable securities.

Subchapter "S" Corporation

Federal and NYS Corporation taxes have not been provided, as the Company has elected Subchapter "S" status and the stockholders include the Company's earnings on their individual tax returns.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission's Uniform Net Capital Rule (Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital of \$50,000 for the N.A.S.D., Inc. and also requires that the ratio of aggregate Indebtness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. At December 31, 2001 the Company had net capital of \$60,478 which was \$10,478 in excess of the amount required.

NOTE 3 - RESERVE REQUIREMENTS

The Company does not hold funds or securities for, or owe money or securities to, customers. Therefore, the Company is exempt from the reserve requirements as defined by the Securities and Exchange Commission under Rule 15c3-3.

NOTE 4 - EXCESS NET CAPITAL

The computation of net capital was compared to the computation of net capital reported on the Unaudited Focus Report as of December 31, 2001. There were no material differences in the computation of net capital of Gould, Ambroson & Associates Ltd.

Gentlemen:

We have audited the financial statements of Gould, Ambrosion & Associates Ltd. for the year ended December 31, 2001 and have issued our report thereon dated January 30, 2002. As part of our audit, we made a study and evaluation of the Company's system of internal accounting controls to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards. The purpose of our study and evaluation, which included obtaining an understanding of the accounting system, was to determine the nature, timing, and extent of the auditing procedures necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements.

Also, as required by Rule 17a-5 (g) (1) of the Securities and Exchange Commission, we have made a study of the practices and procedures followed by Gould, Ambrosion & Associates Ltd., that we considered relevant to the objectives stated in Rule 17a-5 (g) and in making the periodic computations of aggregate indebtedness and net capital under Rule 17a-3 (a) (11).

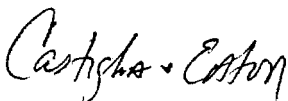
The management of the Company is responsible for establishing and maintaining a system of internal accounting controls and the practices and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgements by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of control procedures and of the practice and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph and to assess whether those practices and procedures can be expected to achieve the Commission's above mentioned objectives. The objectives of a system and the practices and procedures are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets for which the Company has responsibility are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Rule 17a-5 (g) lists additional objectives of the practices and procedures listed in the preceding paragraph.

Because of inherent limitations in any internal accounting control procedures or the practices and procedures referred to above, errors or irregularities may nevertheless occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of them to future periods is subject to the risk that they may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the degree of compliance with them may deteriorate.

Our study and evaluation made for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph would not necessarily disclose all material weaknesses in the system of internal accounting control of Gould, Ambrosion & Associates Ltd. taken as a whole. However, our study and evaluation disclosed no condition that we believed to be a material weakness.

We understand that practices and procedures that accomplish the objectives referred to in the second paragraph of this report are considered by the Commission to be adequate for its purpose in accordance with the Securities Exchange Commission Act of 1934 and related regulations, and that practices and procedures that do not accomplish such objectives in all material respects indicate a material inadequacy for such purposes. Based on this understanding, and on our study, we believe that the Company's practices and procedures were adequate at December 31, 2001 to meet the Commission's objectives.

This report is intended solely for the use of management, the Securities Exchange Commission and the National Association of Securities Dealers and should not be used for any other purpose.
