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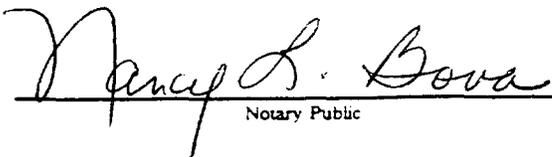

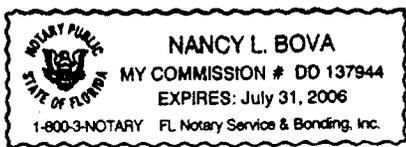

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED NOVEMBER 30, 2002

- 1) **BASIS OF ACCOUNTING**
The Company's policy is to prepare financial statements on the basis of generally accepted accounting principles. This basis of accounting involves the application of accrual accounting, consequently revenues and gains are recognized when earned and expenses and losses are recognized when incurred. Financial statement items are recorded at historical costs and they therefor do not necessarily represent current values.
- 2) **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**
Security transactions are recorded on a trade date as prescribed by generally accepted accounting principles, the SEC and NASD.
- 3) **TRADE RECEIVABLES**
These represent amounts due from Penson Financial Services, Inc. applicable to commissions and clearing deposits. Penson Financial Services, Inc. is the Company clearing facility as of 11-30-02.
- 4) **SECURITIES OWNED**
The inventory of bonds owned at November 30, 2002 are valued at fair market value as of that date. Mark-to-market procedures and adjustments were materially complied with, however, further adjustments may be necessary subsequent to the balance sheet date.
- 5) **REGULATORY MATTERS**
In accordance with (g) and (j) of Rule 17a5, all material issues of the Company's accounting system were noted during our audit, and there were no material inadequacies, at November 30, 2002, in the Company accounting system or in procedures regarding computations, counts, verifications and recordations under Rule 17a5(g); however, due to limited Company personnel and the segregation of duties thereabout, additional audit procedures were necessary to assure that the flow of cash transactions was adequate.
- 6) **CONTINGENCIES**
Although there were two lawsuits pending at November 30, 2002, the legal staffs for the Company did not evaluate these two matters unfavorably at the balance sheet date to an extent that the Company would face a year 2003 "going concern" problem.
