

Note 1 - Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Nature of Business

Brian Cohn, Inc. (the "Company") is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") as a broker-dealer and is primarily engaged in investment banking and advisory activities. The Company is a registered member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. ("NASD").

The Company operates under the provisions of Paragraph (k)(2)(I) of rule 15c3-3 of the SEC and, accordingly, is exempt from the remaining provisions of that rule.

(b) Investment Advisory Income

Investment advisory fees are recognized as earned on a pro rata basis over the term of the Company's agreement or contract.

(c) Investment Banking

Investment banking income includes gains, losses, and fees, net of syndicate expenses, arising from securities offerings in which the Company acts as an agent or underwriter. Also included are fees earned from providing merger-and-acquisition and financial restructuring advisory services. Fees are recorded on offering date, sales concessions on settlement date, and underwriting fees at the time the underwriting is completed and the income is reasonably determinable.

(d) Commissions

Commissions and related clearing expenses are recorded on a trade date basis as securities transactions occur.

(e) Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Company has defined cash equivalents as short-term, highly liquid debt instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less, other than securities held for sale in the ordinary course of business.

(f) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that effect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2 - Security Owned, at Market Value

Consists of corporate stock.

Note 3 - Net Capital Requirements

The capital ratio was 104%, versus an allowable maximum of 1500%, under the rules of the SEC. The Company's net capital requirement under SEC rule 15c3-1 is \$5,000. The net capital as computed was \$44,428, leaving capital in excess of requirements in the amount of \$39,428.

Note 4 - Cash Subordination Agreement

On March 31, 2003, a previous Cash Subordination Agreement of \$150,000, dated September 1987, with interest at 9% per annum, as agreed between the Company and Brian Cohn, the President, and its client and minority stockholder, Arthur H. Keyes, Jr., extended through February 2003, was paid in full.

Note 5 - Related Party Transactions

At March 31, 2003, the sole stockholder had an outstanding loan to the Company totaling \$40,309, paid in full on April 4, 2003.

During the year, the Company paid \$6,000 for administrative and other services to an affiliate owned by the same stockholder of the Company which has been reported as other expense in the statement of income.
