







NOTE 1 - ORGANIZATION AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

Burke Trading Limited Partnership (the Company) is a limited partnership, which was formed on May 2, 1991 and is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and is a member of the Chicago Stock Exchange. The Company operates as an off the floor trader of securities.

NOTE 2 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Securities Transactions

Proprietary securities transactions in regular-way trades are recorded on the trade date, as if they had settled. Profit and loss arising from all securities and commodities transactions are entered into for the account and risk of the Company, and are therefore recorded on a trade date basis. Marketable securities, held by the Company, are valued at quoted market value.

Income Taxes

The Company's income flows to its partners' tax returns, therefore no federal income tax provision is made by the Company. The Company is liable, however, for the Illinois replacement tax of 1.5% of net prescribed income. The Illinois replacement tax for the year ended December 31, 2004 was estimated at \$10,000. This liability was not recorded on the Company's books as of December 31, 2004.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash Flows

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Company has defined cash equivalents as highly liquid investments, with original maturities of less than ninety days, that are not held for sale in the ordinary course of business.

NOTE 3 - FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Derivative financial instruments used for trading purposes, including hedges of trading instruments, are carried at quoted market value. Unrealized gains or losses on these derivative contracts are recorded on the same basis as the underlying assets or liabilities, that is, marked to market.

NOTE 4 - FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS WITH OFF BALANCE SHEET RISK

The Company enters into various transactions involving derivatives and other off-balance sheet financial instruments. These financial instruments include futures and options. Derivative transactions are entered into for trading purposes or to hedge other positions or transactions. In addition, the Company has sold securities that it does not currently own and will therefore be obligated to purchase such securities at a future date. The Company has recorded these obligations in the financial statements at December 31, 2004, at market values and will incur a loss if the market value of the securities increases subsequent to December 31, 2004.

NOTE 5 - CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Company is engaged in various trading and brokerage activities in which counterparties primarily include broker-dealers, clearing firms and other financial institutions. In the event counterparties do not fulfill their obligations, the Company may be exposed to risk. The risk of default depends on the creditworthiness of the counterparty or issuer of the instrument. It is the Company's policy to review, as necessary, the credit standing of each counterparty.

NOTE 6- RECONCILIATION OF AUDITED AND UNAUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The audit of the unaudited financial statements revealed no significant discrepancies. Therefore, no adjustments to the financial statements were required.

NOTE 7- NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (Rule 15c3-1). The Company is required to maintain "adjusted net capital" equivalent to \$100,000 or one eighth of aggregate indebtedness, whichever is greater, as these terms are defined. At December 31, 2004 the Company had net capital and net capital requirements of \$2,870,098 and \$100,000 respectively. The ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 4.49%. The net capital requirement may restrict the payment of dividends or the withdrawal of equity.
