NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2004

Note 1. SUMMARY OF ORGANIZATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

R. Hobman Securities, Inc. was incorporated on January 27, 1995 under the laws of the State of Nevada. On October 1, 2002, the Company was authorized to do business in the State of Arizona. The Company was formed to provide general securities broker-dealer services to investors in securities and other investments. The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (NASD) approved R. Hobman Securities, Inc. for membership as of December 20, 1995.

The Company engages in consulting activities for two broker dealers and other institutional clients. Commissions are earned when clients utilize the information. The Company does not hold funds or securities for or owe money or securities to customers.

Property and Equipment

Depreciation of property and equipment is provided using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets, ranging from three to seven years. Property and equipment are recorded at cost.

Revenue and Cost Recognition

Commission revenues from securities transactions are recognized as earned, and expenses are recognized as incurred.

Accounts Receivable

No allowance for uncollectible accounts has been provided. Management has evaluated the accounts and believes they are fully collectible.

Compensated Absences

Compensated absences for sick and personal time have not been accrued since they can not be reasonably estimated.

Note 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Income Taxes

The Company has elected to be treated as an S Corporation. Therefore, no provision for federal income taxes is included in the financial statements since all income and losses are allocated to the stockholders for inclusion in their individual tax returns. Nevada does not impose a state income tax on corporations. Arizona assesses tax on passive income, capital gain income and certain built in gain income at a rate of 6.968% on S corporations. There were no items giving rise to Arizona tax for the year ended December 31, 2004.

Management Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Depreciation expense for the year ended December 31, 2004 was \$6,865.

Note 3. COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

The company leases a vehicle under an operating lease. The lease requires monthly payments of \$529 through December 31, 2006. For the year ended December 31, 2004, lease expense totaled \$6,036.

Note 4. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Company leases its office space from its shareholder on an annual renewable basis. The Company paid \$6,917 in office rent and \$1,215 in utilities for the year. As of December 31, 2004, the Company also had an amount due from the shareholder of \$4,761.

Note 5. NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to the net capital provisions of Rule 15c3-1 of the Securities and Exchange Act, the Company is required to maintain a net capital ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, as defined, not to exceed 15 to 1. Aggregate indebtedness and net capital change from day to day, but as of December 31, 2004, the Company's net capital ratio was approximately 0.02 to 1. Net capital was \$28,940, aggregate indebtedness was \$541, and required net capital was \$5,000.

Note 6. ANNUAL AUDITORS' REPORT FORM X-17A-5, DECEMBER 31, 2004

The Statement of Financial Condition and related statements of the annual audit pursuant to Rule 17a-5 are available for examination at the principal office of R. Note 7. RETIREMENT PLAN

The Company adopted a SEP IRA retirement plan effective January 1, 1999. The plan covers all employees who are at least 21 years of age with three years of service. The Company's contribution is based on 15% of eligible salary for each eligible employee. The Company's contribution for the year ended December 31, 2004 was \$0 (employee has reached age where required to take withdrawals).

Note 8. ANTI-MONEY LAUNDERING COMPLIANCE PROGRAM

The Company has adopted an anti-money laundering compliance program as required by the USA Patriot Act of 2001. The program requires management to perform certain procedures, primarily in connection with the opening of new accounts and reviewing questionable activity in all accounts. The company is in compliance with the program.
