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



NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2005**

1. BUSINESS

Kramer Securities Corporation (the "Company") was incorporated in Florida on April 15, 1969. The Company is a fully disclosed, introducing NASD broker-dealer transacting business in stocks, mutual funds and direct participation programs. The Company maintains its records in conformity with the requirements of the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. ("NASD"). The Company office is located in Miami, Florida.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Cash and cash equivalents – The Company considers all highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents for the purposes of the statement of cash flows.

Receivables from broker dealers – Receivables from broker dealers are for commissions and dealer discounts. No allowance for doubtful collections has been recorded and bad debt is recorded when determinable.

Property and equipment – Property and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation is provided over the estimated useful lives of the respective assets using the straight-line method. When equipment is disposed of, the cost and accumulated depreciation are written off at the time of disposal.

Investments – Investments consist of warrants acquired during April 2000 and shares of the NASDAQ Stock Market, Inc. acquired during 2005. Investments are stated at cost, which is the same as the estimated net realizable value. There is no market for these securities at this time.

Revenue recognition – Commission revenue and expense associated with transactions in securities, mutual funds and other products are recorded on a trade date basis.

Income taxes – The Company, with the consent of its stockholders, elected to be an S Corporation under the Internal Revenue Code. All taxable income or loss flows through to the stockholders. Accordingly, no income tax expense or liability is recorded in the accompanying financial statements.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Depreciation expense for the year ended December 31, 2005 was \$1,596.

4. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTION AND LEASE COMMITMENT

The Company leases office space from its stockholder on a month-to-month basis, at \$700 per month. Rent expense for the year ended December 31, 2005, was \$8,538 including safe deposit rental.

5. NET CAPITAL PROVISION OF RULE 15c3-1

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 1500%. At December 31, 2005, the Company had net capital of \$83,312, which was \$78,312 in excess of its required net capital of \$5,000. The Company's ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital is 1%.

I. EXEMPTION PURSUANT TO RULE 15c3-3

Kramer Securities Corporation operates pursuant to the (k)(2)(ii) exemption under SEC Rule 15c3-3 and does not hold funds or securities. The Company is, therefore, exempt from the reserve formula calculations and possession and control computations.

II. LIABILITIES SUBORDINATED TO CLAIMS OF CREDITORS

During the year ended December 31, 2005, the Company had no liabilities subordinated to the claims of general creditors.

**III. RECONCILIATION OF THE COMPUTATION OF NET CAPITAL UNDER

REPORT ON INTERNAL CONTROL STRUCTURE REQUIRED BY SEC RULE 17a-5 FOR A BROKER-DEALER CLAIMING AN EXEMPTION FROM SEC RULE 15c3-3

To the Board of Directors
Kramer Securities Corporation

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of Kramer Securities Corporation (the "Company") for the year ended December 31, 2005, we considered its internal control structure, including procedures for safeguarding securities, in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements and not to provide assurance on the internal control structure.

Also, as required by rule 17a-5(g)(1) of the Securities and Exchange Commission, we have made a study of the practices and procedures (including tests of compliance with such practices and procedures) followed by the Company, including tests of such practices that we considered relevant to the objectives stated in rule 17a-5(g), (1) in making the periodic computations of aggregate indebtedness and net capital under rule 17a-3(a)(11) and the procedures for determining compliance with the exemptive provisions of rule 15c3-3. Because the Company does not carry security accounts for customers or perform custodial functions relating to customer securities, we did not review the practices and procedures followed by the Company in any of the following:

1. making the quarterly securities examinations, counts, verifications and comparisons
2. recordation of differences required by rule 17a-13
3. complying with the requirements for prompt payment for securities under Section 8 of Regulation T of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System

The management of the Company is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure and the practices and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of internal control structure policies and procedures and of the practices and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph and to assess whether those practices and procedures can be expected to achieve the Commission's above-mentioned objectives. Two of the objectives of an internal control structure and the practices and procedures are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets for which the Company has responsibility are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Rule 17a-5(g) lists additional objectives of the practices and procedures listed in the preceding paragraph.

Because of inherent limitations in any internal control structure or the practices and procedures referred to above, errors or irregularities may occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of them to future periods is subject to the risk that they may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the effectiveness of their design and operation may deteriorate.

Our consideration of the internal control structure would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control structure that might be material weaknesses under standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. A material weakness is a condition in which the design or operation of the specific internal control structure elements does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that errors or irregularities in amounts that would be material in relation to the financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions. However, we noted no matters involving the internal control structure, including procedures for safeguarding securities that we consider to be material weaknesses as defined above.

We understand that practices and procedures that accomplish the objectives referred to in the second paragraph of this report are considered by the Commission to be adequate for its purposes in accordance with the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and related regulations, and the practices and procedures that do not accomplish such objectives in all material respects indicate a material inadequacy for such purposes. Based on this understanding and on our study, we believe that the Company's practices and procedures were adequate at December 31, 2005, to meet the Commission's objectives.

This report is intended solely for the use of management, the Securities and Exchange Commission, the National Association of Securities Dealers, and other regulatory agencies which rely on rule 17a-5(g) under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in their regulation of registered brokers and dealers, and should not be used for any other purpose.
