

In our opinion, the accompanying statement of financial condition, presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Man Investments Inc. (the "Company") at March 31, 2006 in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. This financial statement is the responsibility of the Company's management; our responsibility is to express an opinion on this financial statement based on our audit. We conducted our audit of this statement in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement is free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statement, assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, and evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Man Group USA Inc. (the "Parent"), and as disclosed in the footnotes to the financial statement, has extensive transactions and relationships with the Parent and its affiliates. Because of these relationships, it is possible that the terms of these transactions are not the same as those that would result from transactions among wholly unrelated parties.

1. Organization and Description of Business

Man Investments Inc. (the "Company") is a wholly owned subsidiary of Man Group USA Inc., (the "Parent") which, in turn, is ultimately a wholly owned subsidiary of Man Group plc, a United Kingdom public limited company.

The Company is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and is a member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. In addition, the Company is registered as a guaranteed introducing broker with the National Futures Association and the Commodity Futures Trading Commission. The Company's activities are limited to selling shares of limited partnerships, direct participation programs and registered investment companies sponsored by affiliates of the Parent.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statement has been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Cash

Cash includes non interest-bearing deposits.

Income Taxes

Income taxes are provided under the provisions of Statement of Financial Accounting Standards No. 109 "Accounting for Income Taxes."

The Company is included in the consolidated federal and state income tax returns filed by the Parent. Federal income taxes are determined on a separate return basis pursuant to a tax sharing agreement between the Company and the Parent. The Company accounts for income taxes under the liability method. Under this method, deferred taxes are provided for differences between financial reporting and tax bases of assets and liabilities and are measured using the enacted tax rates and laws that will be in effect when these differences are expected to reverse.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Contingencies

In the normal course of business, the Company enters into contracts that contain a variety of representations and warranties and which provide general indemnifications. The Company's maximum exposure under these arrangements is unknown, as this would involve future claims that may be made against the Company that have not yet occurred. However, based on experience, management expects the risk of loss to be remote.

3. Related Party Transactions

Man-Glenwood Inc. (the "Affiliate") provides the Company with technology support, legal and compliance as well as finance and administration services. The Company reimburses the Affiliate, generally on a monthly basis, for its share of the expenses incurred by the Affiliate based on the terms listed in the Administrative Services and Expense Funding Agreement. The expenses allocated to the Company by the Affiliate are management's best estimate of the amount of expenses the Company would incur on a stand-alone basis.

Substantially all of the Company's revenue is earned from related parties of Man Group plc.

4. Net Capital Requirement

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital shall not exceed 15 to 1. Net capital and aggregate indebtedness change daily. At March 31, 2006, the Company had net capital, as defined, of \$4,915,509, which was \$4,270,845 in excess of the required minimum net capital of \$644,664. The Company's ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 1.97 to 1.

5. Concentration of Credit Risk

The Company is engaged in various activities in which counterparties primarily include broker-dealers, affiliates and other financial institutions. In the event the counterparties do not fulfill their obligations, the Company may be exposed to risk. The risk of default depends on the creditworthiness of the counterparty. It is the Company's policy to review, as necessary, the credit standing of each counterparty. The Company expects the risk of loss to be remote.
