# KAHN FINANCIAL SECURITIES, LLC (an Illinois Limited Liability Company) Notes to Financial Statements For the Year Ended December 31, 2006

#### NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the significant accounting policies which have been followed in preparing the accompanying financial statements is set forth below.

#### Nature of Business

Kahn Financial Securities, LLC was organized as a Limited Liability Company ("Company") on February 10, 2000 in the State of Illinois for various purposes including, but not limited to, the sale of direct participation programs ("DPPs"). The Company's income is derived primarily from fees received in conjunction with its marketing of DPPs. The Company's Sole Member is Mr. Douglas Kahn.

The Company is registered as a broker/dealer with the Securities and Exchange Commission and became a member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. ("NASD") on November 6, 2000. Its activities are limited to the sale of DPPs.

The Company does not hold customer funds or securities. Consequently, it is not subject to the Reserve Requirement as defined in Rule 15c3-3 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

#### Income Taxes

The Company is a single member LLC. Consequently, for federal and state income tax purposes it is treated as a sole proprietorship and any taxable income/(loss) of the Company is recognized directly by its Sole Member.

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities (and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities) at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

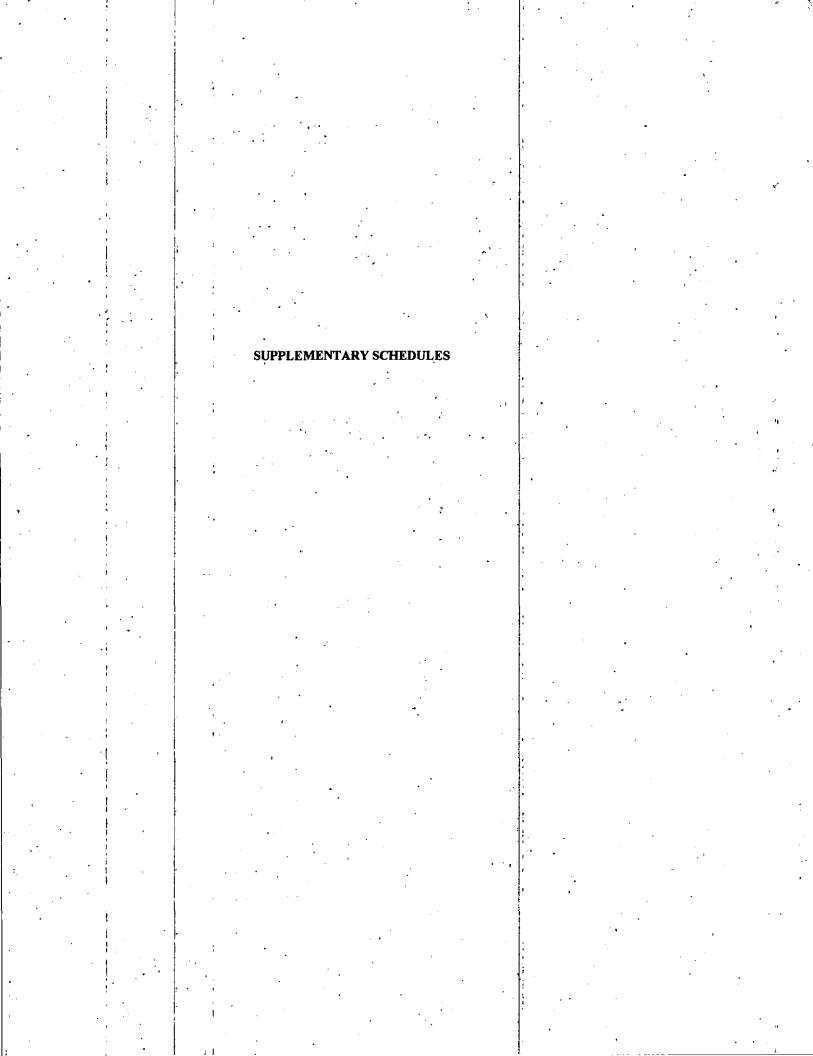
#### NOTE 2 - MINIMUM CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

As a registered "DPP" securities dealer the Company is subject to a minimum net capital requirement under (Rule 15c3-1) under the Exchange Act of 1934. The minimum is the greatest of \$5,000 or one-fifteenth of aggregate indebtedness, as defined. As of December 31, 2006 the Company had net capital requirements and net capital of \$5,000 and \$7,152, respectively.

The net capital requirements could effectively restrict the payment of cash distributions and the making of unsecured loans to the Sole Member.

#### NOTE 3 - OFF BALANCE SHEET RISK AND CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Company does not carry customer securities accounts as defined by Rule 15c3-3 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. DPP transactions are processed by their respective managers on a fully-disclosed basis.

### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT ON INTERNAL ACCOUNTING CONTROL REQUIRED BY SEC RULE 17a-5

To the Sole Member Kahn Financial Securities, LLC Chicago, Illinois

We have examined the financial statements of Kahn Financial Securities, LLC ("the Company"), for the year ended December 31, 2006, and issued our report thereon dated February 23, 2007. As part of our examination, we made a study and evaluation of the Company's system of internal accounting control (which includes the procedures for safeguarding securities) to the extent we considered necessary to evaluate the system as required by generally accepted auditing standards. The purpose of our study and evaluation, which included obtaining an understanding of the accounting system, was to determine the nature, timing, and extent of the auditing procedures necessary for expressing an opinion on the financial statements. Due to the small size of the Company and the limited number of accounts, we placed little reliance on the Company's internal controls and we tested 100% of the accounts.

Also, as required by rule 17a-5(g)(1) of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Commission"), we have made a study of the practices and procedures followed by the Company including tests of such practices and procedures that we considered relevant to the objectives stated in rule 17a-5(g), (1) in making the periodic computations of aggregate indebtedness and net capital under rule 17a-3(a)(11) and the procedures for determining compliance with the exemptive provisions of rule 15c3-3. We did not review the practices and procedures followed by the Company in making the quarterly securities examinations, counts, verifications and comparisons, and the recordation of differences required by rule 17a-13 or in complying with requirement for prompt payment for securities under section 8 of Regulation T of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, because the Company does not currently carry securities accounts for customers or perform custodial functions relation to customer securities.

The management of the Company is responsible for establishing and maintaining a system of internal accounting control and the practices and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of control procedures and of the practices and procedures can be expected to achieve the Commission's above-mentioned objectives. The objectives of a system and the practices and procedures are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets for which the Company has responsibility are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Rule 17a-5(g) lists additional objectives of the practices and procedures listed in the preceding paragraph.

Because of inherent limitations in any internal accounting control structure or the practices and procedures referred to above, errors or irregularities may occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of them to future periods is subject to the risk that they may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the effectiveness of their design and operation may deteriorate.

Our consideration of the internal control structure would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control structure that might be material weaknesses under standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. A material weakness is a condition in which the design or operation of the specific internal control structure elements does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that errors or irregularities in amounts that would be material in relation to the financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions.

We understand that the practices and procedures that accomplish the objectives referred to in the second paragraph of this report are considered by the Commission to be adequate for its purposes in accordance with the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and related regulations, and that practices and procedures that do not accomplish such objectives in all material respects indicate a material inadequacy for such purposes. Based on this understanding and on our study, we believe that the Company's practices and procedures were adequate at December 31, 2006 to meet the Commission's objectives.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the members, management, the Securities and Exchange Commission and the National Association of Securities Dealers and should not be used for any other purpose.
