

NOTE 1 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization - The Company, was incorporated in the state of North Carolina on October 20, 1995. The Company is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission and is a member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. The Company's principal business activity is the sale of securities.

Securities - Marketable securities are valued at market value and securities not readily marketable are valued at fair value as determined by the Board of Directors. The resulting difference between cost and market value (or fair value) is included in income.

Securities Transactions - Commission revenue and related expense arising from securities transactions are recorded on a trade date basis, which is the same business day as the transaction date.

Cash Equivalents - Cash equivalents are defined as certificates of deposit and U.S. government obligations with an original maturity date, when acquired by the Company, of less than 90 days, and those securities registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 which are comprised of cash and other short-term debt instruments and are commonly referred to as "money market funds."

Concentration of Risk - Substantially all the Company's cash is on deposit at one financial institution and the balance at times exceeds the federally insured limit. Due to the strong credit rating of this financial institution, the Company believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk to cash.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Depreciation - Depreciation of auto, furniture and equipment is provided for using the straight-line method over five year periods.

NOTE 2 - NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

As a registered broker/dealer and member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc., the Company is subject to the Uniform Net Capital Rule, which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 1500%. At December 31, 2006 the Company's net capital and required net capital were \$669,285 and \$100,000 respectively. The ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 28%.

NOTE 3 - COMMITMENTS

Lease Commitments - Minimum annual rentals under noncancellable leases, classified as operating leases, for office space, expiring June 14, 2008 and an auto expiring in May 2007, exclusive of additional payments which may be required for certain increases in operating and maintenance costs, are as follows:

NOTE 6 - 401 (k) PLAN

Effective January 1, 2006, the Company amended its deferred compensation plan commonly referred to as a profit sharing plan to include provisions under IRS code section 401(k) whereby employees may contribute a percentage of their compensation within specified legal limits. The Company will match 100% of employee contributions up to 3% of their compensation. The Company may also contribute a discretionary profit sharing contribution. The plan covers substantially all employees age 21 years or older, after completing one year of service. Company contributions to the plan for the year ended December 31, 2006 were \$59,979.

NOTE 7 - STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS - SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

Interest paid during the year ended December 31, 2006 was \$14,350.

NOTE 8 - OFF-BALANCE SHEET RISK AND CLEARING AGREEMENT

The Company enters into various transactions involving derivatives and other off-balance sheet financial instruments. These financial instruments include the purchase of exchange-traded options. These derivative financial instruments are used to meet the needs of customers and conduct investment and trading activities and are, therefore, subject to varying degrees of market and credit risk.

As a writer of options, the Company receives a premium in exchange for giving the counterparty the right to buy or sell the security at a future date at a contracted price. The contractual or notional amounts related to these financial instruments reflect the volume and activity and do not reflect the amounts at risk. The credit risk for options is limited to the unrealized market valuation gains recorded in the statement of financial condition. Market risk is substantially dependent upon the value of the underlying financial instruments and is affected by market forces such as volatility and changes in interest and foreign exchange rates.

In addition, the Company and its customers may sell securities that they do not currently own and will therefore be obligated to purchase such securities at a future date.

In order to facilitate securities transactions, including the aforementioned transactions, the Company has entered into an agreement with another broker/dealer (Clearing Broker/dealer) whereby the Company forwards (introduces) customer securities transactions to the Clearing Broker/dealer, fully disclosing the customer name and other information. The processing and, if applicable, any financing pertaining to the introduced securities transactions is performed by the Clearing Broker/dealer. The customer account is therefore maintained and recorded in the books and records of the Clearing Broker/dealer on the Company's behalf. In consideration for introducing customers to the Clearing Broker/dealer, the Company receives commissions and other consideration, less the processing and other charges of the Clearing Broker/dealer. As part of the terms of the agreement between the Company and Clearing Broker/dealer, the Company is held responsible for any losses arising

when the customers introduced by the Company to the Clearing Broker/dealer fail to meet their contractual commitments pertaining to the purchase, sale and possible financing of securities transactions. The Company may therefore be exposed to off-balance-sheet risk in the event the customer is unable to fulfill its contracted obligations and it is necessary for the Clearing Broker/dealer to purchase or sell the securities at a loss. The Company's exposure to risk would consist of the amount of the loss realized and any additional expenses incurred pertaining to the transaction or other customer activity.

Under the terms of the agreement, the Company is prohibited from entering into a similar agreement with any other broker/dealer without first obtaining written consent from its Clearing Broker/dealer. The Company is also required to maintain a deposit of \$100,000 with the Clearing Broker/dealer.

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
