Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Organization

Affiliated Bankers Capital, L.L.C. (the "Company") was incorporated as a subchapter S corporation in February 1997 under the laws of the state of Texas. In September 1999, the Company was reorganized as a limited liability company. The duration of the Company shall be perpetual, unless terminated earlier in accordance with regulations of the Company. The equity interest of the Company are owned by an individual and two trusts which are related through common ownership to entities listed in Note 4 to these financial statements. The Company processes securities transactions involved in raising capital in the banking industry solely for ASCIB, L.P. ("ASCIB"). The Company is a broker-dealer in securities registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority ("FINRA"). The Company operates under (SEC) Rule 15c3-3(k)(3) involving the sale of corporate securities and business brokerage activities.

Securities Transactions

The Company does not intend to carry or clear customer accounts, and will not hold customer funds or securities. Customer transactions will be executed between the buying and selling parties.

Income Taxes

The Company elected to be taxed as a partnership under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. As a result, all federal income tax liability or expense is paid by the members of the Company.

Revenue Recognition

The Company records professional services revenue related to commissions once the related transaction is completed, the fee is fixed and determinable, persuasive evidence of an arrangement exists, and collectibility is probable.

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2 - Net Capital Requirements

Pursuant to the net capital provisions of Rule 15c3-1 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the Company is required to maintain a minimum net capital, as defined under such provisions. Net capital and the related net capital ratio may fluctuate on a daily basis. At December 31, 2007, the Company had net capital of approximately \$101,795 and net capital requirements of \$20,013. The Company's ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 2.95 to 1. The Securities and Exchange Commission permits a ratio of no greater than 15 to 1.

In compliance with FINRA's interpretations of financial and operational rules, the Company has determined net capital by excluding accounts accrued for discretionary incentive bonuses from aggregate indebtedness and adding such accounts back to net worth.

Note 3 - Possession or Control Requirements

The Company does not have any possession or control of customer funds or securities. There were no material inadequacies in the procedures followed in adhering to the exemptive provisions of (SEC) Rule 15c3-3(k)(3).

Note 4 - Related Party Transactions/Economic Dependency

The Company is affiliated with several other companies through common ownership. These companies are Alex Sheshunoff Management Services, L.P. ("ASM"), ASCIB, and AS Agency, L.L.C. ("ASA").

Note 4 - Related Party Transactions/Economic Dependency, continued

The Company and its affiliates are under common control and the existence of that control creates operating results and financial position significantly different than if the companies were autonomous.

The Company earned \$509,877 of its professional services revenue during 2007 from ASCIB and \$1,935 from ASA. At December 31, 2007 \$273,536 was owed to ASCIB, \$16,457 was owed to ASM and \$165 was owed to ASA.

The Company is economically dependent on its affiliates.

Note 5 - Concentration Risk

The Company during the year had concentration of credit risk arising from cash deposits with banks in excess of Federally insured limits.

To the Board of Directors of

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements and supplemental information of Affiliated Bankers Capital, L.L.C. (the "Company"), as of and for the year ended December 31, 2007 in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, we considered the Company's internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal control.

Also, as required by rule 17a-5(g)(1) of the Securities Exchange Commission (SEC), we have made a study of the practices and procedures followed by the Company including consideration of control activities for safeguarding securities. This study included tests of such practices and procedures that we considered relevant to the objectives stated in rule 17a-5(g) in making the periodic computations of aggregate indebtedness and net capital under rule 17a-3(a)(11) and for determining compliance with the exemptive provisions of rule 15c3-3. Because the Company does not carry securities accounts for customers or perform custodial functions relating to customer securities, we did not review the practices and procedures followed by the Company in any of the following:

1. Making quarterly securities examinations, counts, verifications, and comparisons and recordation of differences required by rule 17a-13
2. Complying with the requirements for prompt payment for securities under Section 8 of Federal Reserve Regulation T of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System

The management of the Company is responsible for establishing and maintaining internal control and the practices and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of controls and of the practices and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph and to assess whether those practices and procedures can be expected to achieve the SEC's above-mentioned objectives. Two of the objectives of internal control and the practices and procedures are to provide management with reasonable but not absolute assurance that assets for which the Company has responsibility are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial

statements in conformity with accounting principles. Rule 17a-5(g) lists additional objectives of the practices and procedures listed in the preceding paragraph.

Because of inherent limitations in internal control and the practices and procedures referred to above, error or fraud may occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of them to future periods is subject to the risk that they may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the effectiveness of their design and operation may deteriorate.

A control deficiency exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent or detect misstatements on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a control deficiency, or combination of control deficiencies, that adversely affects the entity's ability to initiate, authorize, record, process, or report financial data reliably in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles such that there is more than a remote likelihood that a misstatement of the entity's financial statements that is more than inconsequential will not be prevented or detected by the entity's internal control.

A material weakness is a significant deficiency, or combination of significant deficiencies, that results in more than a remote likelihood that a material misstatement of the financial statements will not be prevented or detected by the entity's internal control.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first and second paragraphs and would not necessarily identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control and control activities for safeguarding securities that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above.

We understand that practices and procedures that accomplish the objectives referred to in the second paragraph of this report are considered by the SEC to be adequate for its purposes in accordance with the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and related regulations, and that practices and procedures that do not accomplish such objectives in all material respects indicate a material inadequacy for such purposes. Based on this understanding and on our study, we believe that the Company's practices and procedures, as described in the second paragraph of this report, were adequate at December 31, 2007, to meet the SEC's objectives.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Board of Directors, management, the SEC, the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, and other regulatory agencies that rely on rule 17a-5(g) under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in their regulation of registered brokers and dealers, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.
