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

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2008

NOTE 1 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization - The Company, a limited liability company, was organized in the state of Illinois on May 3, 2002. The duration of the Company is perpetual. The Company is registered as a broker/dealer with the Securities and Exchange Commission and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA), formerly known as the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (NASD). The Company's principal business activity is the referral of customers to hedge funds.

Concentration of Risk - The Company's cash is on deposit at one financial institution and the balance at times may exceed the federally insured limit. Due to the strong credit rating of this financial institution, the Company believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk to cash.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Depreciation - Depreciation of office furniture and equipment is provided using the straight line method over five and seven year periods.

NOTE 2 - NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

As a registered broker/dealer and member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, the Company is subject to the Uniform Net Capital Rule, which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregated indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 1500%. At September 30, 2008 the Company's net capital and required net capital were \$97,481 and \$5,000 respectively. The ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 3%.

NOTE 3 - INCOME TAXES

As a limited liability company with only one member, the Company has elected to file as a sole proprietorship for federal income tax purposes. Income taxes are therefore the responsibility of the sole member of the Company.

NOTE 4 - RELATED PARTIES

The Company paid \$12,000 to the sole member for use of office space.

The sole member has provided administrative assistance to the Company without reimbursement.

NOTE 5 - OTHER

The Company earns fees from a hedge fund by referring customers to that hedge fund. All of the fee revenue on the statement of income was generated by the sole member of the Company. No compensation has been paid or incurred by the Company for the production of this revenue.
