1. NOTES ON SIGNIFICANT BUSINESS ACTIVITIES

Astoria Capital Markets, Inc. (the "Company") was organized in the State of Delaware in March 1998 and began doing business as a registered broker-dealer in securities with the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC") in November 1998. The Company is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. ("FINRA"), The NASDAQ Stock Market LLC, and the NYSE Arca Inc. In this capacity, the Company operates an electronic order management system to facilitate order management of exchange listed and over-the-counter securities,

In the normal course of its business, the Company enters into financial transactions where the risk of potential loss due to changes in market (market risk) or failure of the other party to the transaction to perform (credit risk) exceeds the amounts recorded for the transaction.

The Company's policy is to continuously monitor its exposure to market and counterparty risk through the use of a variety of financial, position and credit exposure reporting and control procedures. In addition, the Company has a policy of reviewing the customer and/or other counterparty with which it conducts business.

The Company has agreed to indemnify its clearing broker, Jefferies and Company, Inc., for losses that the clearing broker may sustain related to the Company's customers. As of December 31, 2008, there were no customer accounts with debit balances that presented any material risk of loss.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Company records securities transactions and related revenues and expenses on a trade date basis.

Security transactions and financing with the clearing broker are classified as operating activities on the statement of cash flows since this is the Company's principal business.

The Company maintains its books and records on an accrual basis in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The Company considers all highly liquid instruments purchased with a maturity date of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

The Company maintains its cash in bank deposit accounts, which at times may exceed federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts. Cash equivalents consist of money market accounts.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reported period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

As of January 1, 2008, the Company adapted FAS 157 which has had no material effect on the financial statements.

3. CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents include \$48,761 being held in a money market fund.

4. INCOME TAXES

The Company is recognized as an S-Corporation by the Internal Revenue Service. As an S-Corporation, the Company is subject to New York City General Corporation Tax and a New York State surcharge, while the shareholders are liable for federal and state income taxes on the Company's taxable income.

5. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Company reimburses Sutton Consulting Group, Inc., a related party, for its share of telephone usage and other sundry services. The Company subleases its office space from the same related party, subject to the related party's master lease and pays \$500 per month in rent to them.

6. RULE 15C3-3

The Company is exempt from the provisions of Rule 15c3-3 under paragraph (k)(2)(ii) in that the Company carries no margin accounts, promptly transmits all customer funds and delivers all securities received, does not otherwise hold funds or securities for or owe money or securities to customers and effectuates all financial transactions on behalf of customers on a fully disclosed basis.

7. NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission's Net Capital Rule 15c3-1, which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. At December 31, 2008, the Company had net capital of \$289,435, which exceeded the minimum requirement of \$5,000 by \$284,435. The Company's ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was .03 to 1.
