

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Business

Global Credit Partners, LLC (the Company) is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and is a member of various exchanges and became a member of the National Association of Securities Dealers (NASD) on June 20, 2005. The Company is located in New Jersey. The Company was organized as a Delaware limited liability company (LLC).

Basis of Presentation

The Company is engaged in a single line of business as a securities broker-dealer, which comprises several classes of services.

Commissions

Commissions and related clearing expenses are recorded on a trade-date basis as securities transactions occur. The transactions recorded on a settlement-date basis will not be materially different from the trade-date basis.

Income Taxes

The Company is a limited liability company for income tax reporting purposes, and as such, is not subject to income tax. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is provided in the financial statements.

Depreciation and Amortization

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis using estimated useful lives of five and seven years. Amortization is provided on a straight-line basis using an estimated useful life of five years.

Estimates

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES, CONTINUED

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Company defines cash equivalents as highly liquid investments with original maturities of less than ninety days that are not held for sale in the ordinary course of business.

Concentration of Credit Risk

The Company maintains its cash in bank deposit accounts, which at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk for cash.

2. COMMISSIONS RECEIVABLE AND PAYABLE

Commission revenue is derived as the Company acting as an agent buying and selling securities on behalf of its customers. In return for such services, the Company charges a commission. Each time a customer enters into a buy or sell transaction a commission is earned by the Company for its selling and administrative efforts. For securities purchased, the commission is recorded as a receivable from customers; for securities sold, it is recorded as reductions in the payable to customers. Commissions receivable for the year ended December 31, 2009 is \$550,051. Commissions payable for the year ended December 31, 2009 is \$417,769.

3. RECEIVABLE - CLEARING ORGANIZATION

The amounts receivable from the clearing organization for the year ended December 31, 2009 is \$253,522. The Company clears all of its customer transactions through a broker-dealer independent of the Company on a fully disclosed basis.

4. DUE FROM GCP, U.K.

In 2009, the Company started a broker-dealer in the United Kingdom, Global Credit Partners (UK) LLP (GCP UK). GCP UK is a limited liability partnership in the United Kingdom. The Company owns 98% of GCP UK. GCP UK was formed on August 16, 2009 to provide broker-dealer services in the United Kingdom.

The financial activity of GCP UK is regulated by the Financial Services Authority (FSA), which granted authorization as a broker-dealer in the United Kingdom on November 18, 2009.

The Company made an initial investment in GCP UK of \$254,785, \$134,785 of start-up expenses that are reported within the Statement of Operations. At December 31, 2009, GCP UK owes the Company an additional \$120,000 and is reflected on the Statement of Financial Condition.

4. DUE FROM GCP, U.K. - continued

GCP UK is regulated in the United Kingdom, and became self-sustaining on November 18, 2009. There is no expense sharing arrangement between the Company and GCP UK, and no additional capital or expenses are expected to be paid by the Company beyond the initial investment noted above.

Since the Company is regulated by FINRA and the SEC, and GCP UK is regulated by FSA, consolidated statements are not provided.

The following is a summary of the balance sheet of GCP UK at December 31, 2009:

GCP UK had \$55,534 of revenue for the year-ended December 31, 2009. GCP UK's expenses totaled \$15,012 for the year-ended December 31, 2009.

GCP UK's assets and liabilities are denominated in a foreign currency and are translated at year-end rates of exchange.

There is no flow-through opinion of counsel included in this report. The Company does not guarantee, endorse nor assume direct or indirect obligations or liabilities of GCP UK. At December 31, 2009 GCP UK did not have any direct or indirect obligations or liabilities. Except for the expenses and debt, above, the Company will not incur expenses or receive revenue from GCP UK, thus there is no capital benefit and will not result in any increase nor decrease in the Company's minimum net capital.

5. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Members' compensation was \$3,273,021 for the year ended December 31, 2009 2009 which is reflected on the statement of operations as employee compensation and benefits.

In June, 2009, one key employee was offered a 10% interest in the Company for his valuable and faithful service. The offer was accepted. There are a total of two members of the Company as of December 31, 2009.

6. NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1 (and the rule of the "applicable" exchange also provides that equity capital may not be withdrawn or cash dividends paid if the resulting net capital ratio would exceed 10 to 1). At December 31, 2009, the Company had net capital of \$549,068, which was \$517,855 in excess of its required net capital of \$31,213. The Company's percentage of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 85.27%.

7. EXEMPTIVE PROVISION

The Company meets all of the requirements for exemption from SEC Rule 15c3-3 with regard to the computation for determination of reserve requirements. The Company does not hold funds or securities for, or owe money or securities to, customers.

8. SUBSEQUENT EVENT

On January 15, 2010 the Company entered into an obligation under an operating lease with initial non-cancelable terms in excess of one year. Aggregate annual rentals for office space at December 31, 2009 are as listed below:

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements and supplementary schedule of Global Credit Partners, LLC (the "Company"), as of and for the year ended December 31, 2009, we considered its internal control, including control activities for safeguarding securities, in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements and not to provide assurance on internal control.

Also, as required by Rule 17a-5(g)(1) of the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"), we have made a study of the practices and procedures followed by the Company, including tests of such practices and procedures that we considered relevant to the objectives stated in Rule 17a-5(g) in making the periodic computations of aggregate indebtedness (or aggregate debits) and net capital under Rule 17a-3(a)(11) and for determining compliance with the exemptive provisions of Rule 15c3-3. Because the Company does not carry securities accounts for customers or perform custodial functions relating to customer securities, we did not review the practices and procedures followed by the Company in any of the following:

1. Making quarterly securities examinations, counts, verifications, and comparisons
2. Recordation of differences required by Rule 17a-13
3. Complying with the requirements for prompt payment for securities under Section 8 of Federal Reserve Regulation T of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System

Two of the objectives of internal control and the practices and procedures are to provide management with reasonable but not absolute assurance that assets for which the Company has responsibility are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Rule 17a-5(g) lists additional objectives of the practices and procedures listed in the preceding paragraph.
