NOTE 1 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization – Forest Securities, Inc. (the “Company”) was incorporated in the state of Iowa on June 16, 1992. The Company is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA). The Company's principal business activity is the purchase and sale of securities.

Securities Transactions - Securities transactions are recorded on a trade date basis. Marketable securities are valued at market value. The resulting difference between cost and market value is included in income.

Concentrations of Credit Risk - The Company is engaged in various brokerage activities in which the counterparties primarily include broker/dealers, banks, other financial institutions and the Company's own customers. In the event the counterparties do not fulfill their obligations, the Company may be exposed to risk. The risk of default depends on the creditworthiness of the counterparty or issuer of the instrument. It is the Company's policy to review, as necessary, the credit standing of each counterparty.

In addition, the Company's cash is on deposit at one financial institution and the balance at times may exceed the federally insured limit. The Company believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk to cash.

Depreciation - Depreciation of furniture and equipment is computed using straight line and accelerated methods over 5 and 7 year periods.

Cash Equivalents - For purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, the Company has defined cash equivalents as highly liquid investments, with original maturities of less than three months that are not held for sale in the ordinary course of business.

NOTE 1 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - *(Continued)*

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events - The Company evaluated all significant events or transactions that occurred through the audit report date, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

FASB ASC 820 defines fair value, creates a framework for measuring fair value, and establishes a fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. A fair value measurement assumes that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability occurs in the principal market for the asset or liability or, in the absence of a principal market, the most advantageous market. Valuation techniques that are consistent with the market, income or cost approach, as specified by FASB ASC 820, are used to measure fair value.

The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels:

- Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities the Company has the ability to access.
- Level 2 inputs are inputs (other than quoted prices included within level 1) that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.

NOTE 2 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT - *(Continued)*

- Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability and rely on management's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. *(The unobservable inputs should be developed based on the best information available in the circumstances and may include the Company's own data.)*

Level 1 inputs have been applied to value cash and cash equivalents on the statement of financial condition. In addition, securities owned, consisting entirely of equity securities have been valued using Level 1 inputs, as follows.

No valuation techniques have been applied to all other assets and liabilities included in the statement of financial condition. Due to the nature of these items, all have been recorded at their historic values.

NOTE 3 - NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

As a registered broker/dealer and member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, the Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregated indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 1500%. At December 31, 2011, the Company's net capital and required net capital were \$21,268 and \$5,000 respectively. The ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 10%.

NOTE 4 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Other assets of \$1,200 consist of a security deposit for office space which shareholders of the Company have leased to the Company. The expense incurred relating to this lease for the year ended December 31, 2011 was \$17,700. The lease is on a month to month basis.

NOTE 5 - INCOME TAXES

Included in income are unrealized losses on securities transactions of \$10,089. These losses are not recognized for federal income tax purposes. No income tax provision has been provided on the statement of income since the resulting federal taxable income is not material.

The Company accounts for any potential interest or penalties related to possible future liabilities for unrecognized income tax benefits as interest/other expense. The Company is no longer subject to examination by tax authorities for federal, state or local income taxes for periods before 2008.

NOTE 6 - CLEARING AGREEMENT WITH OFF-BALANCE-SHEET RISK

The Company has entered into an agreement with another broker/dealer (Clearing Broker/dealer) whereby the Company forwards (introduces) customer securities transactions to the Clearing Broker/dealer, fully disclosing the customer name and other information. The processing and, if applicable, any financing pertaining to the introduced securities transactions is performed by the Clearing Broker/dealer. The customer account is therefore maintained and recorded in the books and records of the Clearing Broker/dealer on the Company's behalf. In consideration for introducing customers to the Clearing Broker/dealer, the Company receives commissions and other consideration, less the processing and other charges of the Clearing Broker/dealer. The agreement prohibits the Company from entering into a similar agreement with another broker/dealer except with respect to transactions not covered by this agreement or accounts rejected by the Clearing Broker/dealer. The Company is required to have \$50,000 in cash and/or securities on deposit with the Clearing Broker/dealer to assure the Company's performance under the agreement.

NOTE 6 - CLEARING AGREEMENT WITH OFF-BALANCE-SHEET RISK - *(Continued)*

Additional provisions of the agreement state that the Company is to be held responsible for any losses arising when the customers introduced by the Company to the Clearing Broker/dealer fail to meet their contractual commitments pertaining to the purchase, sale and possible financing of securities transactions. The Company may therefore be exposed to off-balance-sheet risk in the event the customer is unable to fulfill its contracted obligations and it is necessary for the Clearing Broker/dealer to purchase or sell the securities at a loss. The Company's exposure to risk would consist of the amount of the loss realized and any additional expenses incurred pertaining to the transaction or other customer activity.

The Company entered into a new clearing agreement with a different firm effective March 2, 2012. The term of the agreement is 36 months. Under this new agreement, the Company will be required to have a \$25,000 deposit in cash and/or securities on deposit with the Clearing Broker/dealer. In addition, the Company is restricted from entering into another agreement for similar services without prior written consent from the Clearing Broker/dealer. The terms of the remainder of this new agreement are similar to those of the former agreement enumerated above.
