

Notes to Statement of Financial Condition

Note 1. Nature of Operations and Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of operations: Brauin Securities, Inc. (the Company) is an Illinois corporation formed on December 3, 1983. The Company is a securities broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (the SEC) and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA). The Company earns all income by acting as an agent for an affiliate, related by common ownership.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Revenue recognition: Commissions and related expenses are recognized at the time the transaction is completed and the income is reasonably determinable.

Note 2. Transactions with Affiliates

As of December 31, 2011, the Company has a receivable of \$2,877 from an affiliate related by common ownership.

Office space and other services are provided to the Company by another affiliate, related by common ownership. This affiliate has agreed to make capital contributions for the net expenses incurred by the Company.

Note 3. Income Taxes

The Company has a deferred tax asset of approximately \$13,000 available for use in the future due to approximately \$52,000 in net operating losses incurred for income tax purposes, which the Company has fully reserved as realization is not assured. Such losses expire in various years beginning in 2024.

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) has issued guidance for how uncertain tax positions should be recognized, measured, disclosed and presented in the financial statements. This requires the evaluation of tax positions taken or expected to be taken in the course of preparing the Company's tax returns to determine whether the tax positions are "more-likely-than-not" of being sustained "when challenged" or "when examined" by the applicable tax authority. Tax positions not deemed to meet the more-likely-than-not threshold would be recorded as a tax benefit or expense and liability in the current year. Through December 31, 2011, management has determined there are no material uncertain tax positions. The Company is generally not subject to U.S. federal, state or local income tax examinations for tax years before 2008.

Note 4. Net Capital Requirements

The Company, as a registered broker-dealer, is subject to the SEC's Uniform Net Capital Rule (Rule 15c3-1) and is required to maintain minimum net capital. Under this rule, the Company is required to maintain "minimum net capital" equivalent to the greater of \$5,000 or 6-2/3 percent of "aggregate indebtedness," as these terms are defined, and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, not to exceed 15 to 1. The rule also provides that equity capital may not be withdrawn if the resulting net capital ratio would exceed 10 to 1.

At December 31, 2011, the Company had net capital and net capital requirements of \$22,096 and \$5,000, respectively. The net capital requirements may effectively restrict the payment of cash dividends.

Note 4. Net Capital Requirements (Continued)

The Company operates under the provisions of Paragraph (k)(2)(i) of Rule 15c3-3 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and accordingly, is exempt from the remaining provisions of that Rule. Essentially, the requirements of paragraph (k)(2)(i) provide that the Company carry no margin accounts, promptly transmit all customer funds and deliver all securities received in conjunction with its activities as a broker-dealer and does not hold funds or securities for or owe money or securities to customers.
