Notes to Financial Statement

December 31, 2013

1. Organization

Philpott Ball & Werner, LLC (the Company), a Delaware limited liability company, is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Philpott Ball & Werner, Inc. (the Parent). The Company is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority ("FINRA"). The Company is an investment banking firm headquartered in Charlotte, NC, with an office in Manchester, MA serving small and middle-market companies. The Company offers unbiased advice and assistance to clients regarding mergers and acquisitions and select transaction financing.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Company considers all highly liquid investments, which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and have a maturity of three months or less when acquired to be cash equivalents. The Company's cash balances exceeded the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation's insured amount of \$250,000 by approximately \$553,000. Management believes the cash balances are not exposed to any significant credit risk.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are for amounts billed and receivable from clients in connection with investment banking activities. Credit is extended based on evaluation of the client's financial condition and, generally, collateral is not required. The Company provides an allowance for doubtful accounts based on review of receivables. No allowance was considered necessary at December 31, 2013.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Costs associated with major acquisitions are capitalized and depreciated. Depreciation is provided over the estimated lives of the depreciable assets. Assets are generally depreciated on the straight-line method.

Expenditures for repairs and maintenance costs are charged to expense as incurred. Upon asset disposition, the costs and related accumulated depreciation amounts are relieved and any resulting gain or loss is reflected in operations during the period of disposition.

Income Taxes

The Company is a limited liability company in which all elements of income and deductions are included in the tax return of the Parent. Therefore, no income tax provision is recorded by the Company. The Company has determined it does not have any material unrecognized tax benefits or obligations as of December 31, 2013. The Company believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2010.

Member's Equity

The Company has one class of member's equity and it is owned 100% by the Parent.

Management's Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the dates of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

The Company has analyzed its operations subsequent to December 31, 2013, through January 27, 2014, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

3. Property and Equipment

4. Related Party Transactions

The Company has a management agreement with the Parent for the reimbursement of administrative costs, including the use of office space, utilities, employees and telephones. Amounts due to the Parent at December 31, 2013 were \$116,290.

5. Net Capital Requirements

The Company is subject to the SEC's Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital of \$5,000 and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. At December 31, 2013, the Company had net capital of \$573,402 and its ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was .20 to 1.
