NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2013

1. **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Nature of Business

Global Credit Partners, LLC (the "Company") is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and is a member of various exchanges as well as the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. ("FINRA"). The Company is organized as a Delaware limited liability company ("LLC").

Since the Company is an LLC, the Members are not liable for the debts, obligations or liabilities of the Company, whether arising in contract, tort or otherwise, unless the Members have signed a specific guarantee.

Basis of Presentation

The Company is engaged in a single line of business as a securities broker-dealer, which comprises several classes of services.

Commissions

Commissions and related clearing expenses are recorded on a trade-date basis as securities transactions occur. The transactions recorded on a settlement-date basis will not be materially different from the trade-date basis.

Income Taxes

The Company is an LLC for income tax reporting purposes, and as such, is not subject to income tax. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is provided in the financial statements.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis using estimated useful lives of five and seven years.

Estimates

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES, CONTINUED

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Company defines cash equivalents as highly liquid investments with original maturities of less than ninety days that are not held for sale in the ordinary course of business.

Concentration of Credit Risk

The Company maintains its cash in bank deposit accounts, which at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk for cash.

2. DEPOSIT WITH CLEARING ORGANIZATION

The Company clears all of its customer transactions through another broker-dealer on a fully disclosed basis (the "clearing organization"). The Company is contractually obligated to maintain a cash deposit with the clearing organization. The amount deposited with the clearing organization as of December 31, 2013 is \$325,212.

3. COMMISSIONS RECEIVABLE AND PAYABLE

Commission revenue is derived by the Company acting as an agent buying and selling securities on behalf of its customers. In return for such services, the Company charges a commission. Each time a customer enters into a buy or sell transaction, a commission is earned by the Company for its selling and administrative efforts. Commissions receivable as of December 31, 2013 is \$152,752.

The Company pays a portion of its commissions earned to its representatives. Commissions payable to representatives as of December 31, 2013 is \$109,827.

4. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Members' compensation was \$1,503,669 for the year ended December 31, 2013 which is reflected on the Statement of Operations within employee compensation and benefits.

5. NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1 (and the rule of the "applicable" exchange also provides that equity capital may not be withdrawn or cash dividends paid if the resulting net capital ratio would exceed 10 to 1). At December 31, 2013, the Company had net capital of \$562,299, which was \$554,348 in excess of its required net capital of \$7,951. The Company's percentage of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 21.21%.

6. EXEMPTIVE PROVISION

The Company meets all of the requirements for exemption from SEC Rule 15c3-3 with regard to the computation for determination of reserve requirements. The Company does not hold funds or securities for, or owe money or securities to, customers.

7. COMMITMENTS

The Company has an obligation under an operating lease with an initial non-cancelable term in excess of one year. The Company's rent expense for the year ended December 31, 2013 was \$67,319.

8. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through the date that its financial statements were issued, and determined that there are no material subsequent events requiring adjustment to, or disclosure in its financial statements.

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements and supplementary schedule of Global Credit Partners, LLC (the "Company"), as of and for the year ended December 31, 2013, we considered its internal control, including control activities for safeguarding securities, in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements and not to provide assurance on internal control.

Also, as required by Rule 17a-5(g)(1) of the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"), we have made a study of the practices and procedures followed by the Company, including tests of such practices and procedures that we considered relevant to the objectives stated in Rule 17a-5(g) in making the periodic computations of aggregate indebtedness (or aggregate debits) and net capital under Rule 17a-3(a)(11) and for determining compliance with the exemptive provisions of Rule 15c3-3. Because the Company does not carry securities accounts for customers or perform custodial functions relating to customer securities, we did not review the practices and procedures followed by the Company in any of the following:

1. Making quarterly securities examinations, counts, verifications, and comparisons
2. Recordation of differences required by Rule 17a-13
3. Complying with the requirements for prompt payment for securities under Section 8 of Federal Reserve Regulation T of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System

The management of the Company is responsible for establishing and maintaining internal control and the practices and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of controls and the practices and procedures referred to in the preceding paragraph, and to assess whether those practices and procedures can be expected to achieve the SEC's above mentioned objectives. Two of the objectives of internal control and the practices and procedures are to provide management with reasonable but not absolute assurance that assets for which the Company has responsibility are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Rule 17a-5(g) lists additional objectives of the practices and procedures listed in the preceding paragraph.

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Because of inherent limitations in any internal control or the practices and procedures referred to above, errors or fraud may occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of them to future periods is subject to the risk that they may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or the effectiveness of their design and operation may deteriorate.

Our consideration of the internal control would not necessarily disclose all matters in internal control that might be material weaknesses under standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. A material weakness is a condition in which the design or operation of the specific internal control components does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that error or fraud in amounts that would be material in relation to the financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions. However, we noted no matters involving the internal control, including control activities for safeguarding securities that we consider to be material weakness as defined above.

We understand that practices and procedures that accomplish the objectives referred to in the second paragraph of this report are considered by the SEC to be adequate for its purposes in accordance with the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and related regulations, and that practices and procedures that do not accomplish such objectives in all material respects indicate a material inadequacy for such purposes. Based on this understanding and on our study, we believe that the Company's practices and procedures were adequate as of December 31, 2013 to meet the SEC's objectives.

This report recognizes that it is not practicable in an organization the size of the Company to achieve all the division of duties and cross-checks generally included in a system of internal accounting control, and that alternatively, greater reliance must be placed on surveillance by management.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Board of Directors, management, the SEC, and other regulatory agencies that rely on Rule 17a-5(g) under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in their regulation of registered brokers and dealers and is not intended to be used by anyone other than these specified parties.
