

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization and Business

Hamilton Miller Investments, LLC (the “Company”) is a Delaware limited liability company organized on March 4, 1998. The Company is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. In this capacity, the Company participates in private placements of capital into various limited partnerships and other investment vehicles and directs trading to other broker-dealers. The Company’s sole member is Hamilton Miller, LLC (the “Parent”).

15c3-3 Exemption

The Company, under Rule 15c3-3(k)(2)(i), is exempt from the reserve and possession or control requirements of Rule 15c3-3 of the Securities and Exchange Commission. The Company does not carry or clear customer accounts.

Revenue Recognition

The Company’s primary sources of revenue are fees and commissions earned from various limited partnerships and other investment vehicles. These fees represent a portion of the management and performance fees charged by the managers of these entities. The Company records these fees when earned.

Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Company considers all highly liquid investments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Income Taxes

The financial statements do not include a provision for income taxes because the Company is not a taxable entity. The Company’s members are taxed on the Company’s earnings.

The Company is required to determine whether a tax position is more likely than not to be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority, including resolution of any tax related appeals or litigation processes, based on the technical merits of the position. The Company files an income tax return in the U.S. federal jurisdiction, and may file income tax returns in various U.S. states. The Company is not subject to income tax return examinations by major taxing authorities for years before 2010. The tax benefit recognized is measured as the largest amount of benefit that has a greater than fifty percent likelihood of being realized upon ultimate settlement. De-recognition of a tax benefit previously recognized results in the Company recording a tax liability that reduces net assets. However, the Company’s conclusions regarding this policy may be subject to review and adjustment at a later date based on factors including, but not limited to, on-going analyses of and changes to tax laws, regulations and interpretations thereof.

Income Taxes (concluded)

The Company recognizes interest accrued related to unrecognized tax benefits and penalties related to unrecognized tax benefits in income taxes payable, if assessed. No interest expense or penalties have been recognized as of and for the year ended December 31, 2013.

Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The Company measures its financial assets and liabilities in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The Company's financial instruments, including cash, commissions receivable, other assets, commissions payable and due to Parent are carried at amounts which approximate fair value due to the short-term nature of those instruments.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to the net capital provisions of Rule 15c3-1 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the Company is required to maintain a minimum net capital, as defined under such provisions. At December 31, 2013, the Company had net capital and net capital requirements of \$104,536 and \$5,456, respectively. The Company's net capital ratio (aggregate indebtedness to net capital) was 0.78 to 1. According to Rule 15c3-1, the Company's net capital ratio shall not exceed 15 to 1.

NOTE 3 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Company has an expense sharing agreement with its Parent in which the Company pays all expenses related to the use of the Parent's facility, employees and other operating expenses directly allocable to the Company. For the year ended December 31, 2013, the Company incurred \$1,732,910 to its Parent in connection with the expense sharing agreement. Included in this amount is \$861,691 for salaries and wages and \$33,169 in rent expense. The Parent leases office space under a non-cancellable operating lease through September 30, 2016. At December 31, 2013, the Company has a payable to its Parent of \$26,530.

NOTE 4 - FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS, OFF-BALANCE SHEET RISK AND CONTINGENCIES

The Company introduces client accounts to unrelated investment managers. The Company does not take discretionary control over any account. The Company receives a portion of the fees generated by the investment managers. The Company bears the risk of financial failure of these investment managers. If the investment managers should cease doing business, the amounts due from these investment managers could be subject to forfeiture.

NOTE 5 - SUBSEQUENT REVIEW

The Company has performed an evaluation of subsequent events through the date the financial statements were issued. The evaluation did not result in any subsequent events that required disclosures and/or adjustments.
