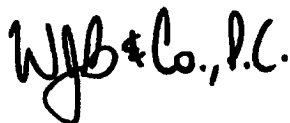

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2014

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization and Nature of Business

Wellford Capital Markets, LLC (the "Company") is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. ("FINRA"). The Company, a Delaware limited liability company ("LLC"), received its approval for membership on December 22, 2010.

The Company conducts business in the private placement of securities, merger and acquisition advisory services, and best efforts underwriting.

Since the Company is an LLC, the member is not liable for the debts, obligations, or liabilities of the Company, whether arising in contract, tort or otherwise, unless the member has signed a specific guarantee.

Basis of Presentation

The Company keeps its books and prepares its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Estimates

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Accounts receivable

Accounts receivable are uncollateralized customer obligations due under normal trade terms generally requiring payment within 30 days from the invoice date. Accounts receivable are stated at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. Management provides for probable uncollectable amounts through a charge to earnings and a credit to a valuation allowance based on its assessment of the current collectability status of accounts, which includes specific losses for known troubled accounts and other available evidence. At December 31, 2014, management considers all accounts receivable to be fully collectible, therefore no allowance for uncollectable amounts is necessary.

Goodwill

Goodwill is tested annually for impairment. At December 31, 2014, no impairment has been determined.

1. **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)**

Income Taxes

The Company is a single member limited liability company and as such, is not required to file its own tax return. Accordingly no provision for income taxes is provided in the financial statements as they are the responsibility of the individual member.

The Company has adopted the provisions of FASB Accounting Standards Codification 740-10, Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes. Under FASB ASC 740-10, the Company is required to evaluate each of its tax positions to determine if they are more likely than not to be sustained if the taxing authority examines the respective position. A tax position includes an entity's status and the decision not to file a return. The Company has evaluated each of its tax positions and has determined that it has no uncertain tax positions for which a provision or liability for income taxes is necessary.

The Company's parent files income tax returns in the U.S. in both federal and state jurisdictions. With few exceptions the Company is no longer subject to U.S. federal, state or local tax examinations by taxing authorities for years before 2011.

Revenue Recognition

Advisory fees are determined on a case by case basis according to the terms negotiated by management and are generally recognized at the time the services are completed and the income is reasonably determinable. Non-refundable retainers are generally recognized when received and are applied against transaction fees upon closing, if applicable.

Reimbursable expense income is recognized at the time the expenses are incurred.

Concentrations

During the year ended December 31, 2014, 78% of total revenues were earned from a single customer.

The Company maintains its cash in bank deposit accounts, which at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk for cash.

Prior Period Adjustment

During the year ended December 31, 2014, the Company recorded an adjustment decreasing reimbursable expense income for revenue recognized in the current year relating to expenses incurred during the prior year. The adjustment decreased reimbursable expense income by \$5,490 and increased Member's Equity by the same amount. There was no impact to net capital or aggregate indebtedness as a result of the adjustment.

2. NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

The Company is subject to the SEC Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. At December 31, 2014, the Company had net capital of \$606,839, which was \$601,839 in excess of its required net capital of \$5,000. The Company's percentage of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 11.62%.

3. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

During the year ended December 31, 2014, the Company received \$58,673 of contributions from Wellford Capital Partners, LLC, its sole member, which is included in the accompanying Statement of Changes in Member's Equity. The full amount was contributed in the form of a forgiven intercompany payable.

The Company has an expense sharing agreement with an entity under common control (the "Affiliate"), wherein the Company reimburses the Affiliate for expenses paid on its behalf. These expenses include, but are not limited to, employee salaries, rent, office and administrative supplies and travel. Such expenses are categorized accordingly and reflected on the accompanying Statement of Operations. The amount outstanding to the Affiliate under the agreement as of December 31, 2014 was \$39,807 and is reflected in the accompanying Statement of Financial Condition.

4. COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

The Company has evaluated commitments and contingencies in accordance with Accounting Standards Codification 450, *Contingencies* (ASC 450) and Accounting Standards Codification 440, *Commitments* (ASC 440). Management has determined that no significant commitments and contingencies exist as of December 31, 2013.

5. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through February 10, 2015, the date that its financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that there are no material subsequent events requiring adjustment to or disclosure in its financial statements.

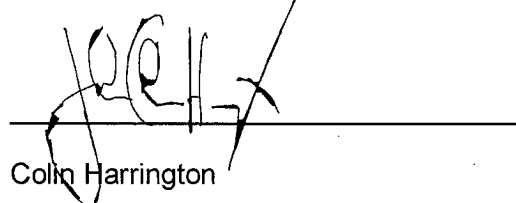

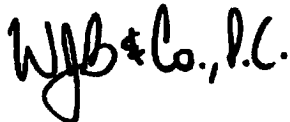
