Notes to Financial Statement December 31, 2015

#### 1. Organization

Matrix Capital Group, Inc. ("the Company") is a registered broker dealer with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority ("FINRA"). The Company is incorporated under the laws of the state of New York. The Company, like other broker dealers, is directly affected by general economic and market conditions, including fluctuations in volume and price level of securities, changes in interest rates and securities brokerage services, all of which have an impact on the Company's liquidity.

Matrix 360 Holdings, LLC, a holding company, owns 71% of Matrix Capital Group, Inc. as of February 25, 2016.

#### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Company in the preparation of its financial statements. The policies are in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Revenue – Private placement and advisory fees include fees earned from providing merger and acquisition and financial advisory services. These fee revenues are recognized when earned based on the terms of the related contracts. Fee revenue related to financial transactions is recognized when the transaction closes. Revenue from the sale and distribution of mutual funds is recognized when it is earned.

Cash and cash equivalents – The Company includes as cash and cash equivalents amounts invested in money market mutual funds.

Deferred Income Taxes - The Company provides for amounts of current and deferred taxes payable or refundable as of the date of the financial statements, utilizing currently enacted tax laws and rates. Deferred tax expenses or benefits are recognized in the financial statements for the changes in deferred tax assets or liabilities between years. A valuation allowance is recognized if, based on the available evidence, it is more likely than not that some portion of the deferred tax asset will not be realized.

The Company recognizes and discloses uncertain tax positions in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). As of, and during the year ended December 31, 2015 the Company did not have liability for unrecognized tax benefits. The Company is no longer subject to examination by federal and state taxing authorities prior to 2012.

Use of estimates — The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Subsequent events - Management has evaluated the impact of all subsequent events through February 26, 2016 the date the financial statements were available to be issued and has determined that there were no subsequent events requiring disclosure in these financial statements.

### 3. Related Party Transactions

A note receivable was executed by an officer/shareholder in the amount of \$406,000. The note is payable in full on December 31, 2019 with an interest rate of 4% per annum. At December 31, 2015, the loan balance was \$194,984. Interest receivable on the note was \$79,899 at December 31, 2015.

#### 4. Computation for Determination of Reserve Requirements

The Company will operate in accordance with the exemptive provisions of paragraph (k)(2)(ii) of SEC Rule 15c3-3. All customer transactions except for direct purchases of mutual funds, variable annuities, and private placements are cleared through Penson Financial Services, Inc.

#### 5. Net Capital Requirements

The Company is a member of the FINRA and is subject to the SEC Uniform Net Capital Rule 15c3-1. This Rule requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. Net capital and the related net capital ratio may fluctuate on a daily basis. At December 31, 2015 the Company had net capital and net capital requirements, respectively, of \$55,692 which was \$50,692 in excess of its required net capital of \$5,000. The Company's net capital ratio was 0.90 to 1.

#### 6. Income Taxes

The Company has available a loss carry-forward of approximately \$383,492 due to the uncertainty of future profits. A full valuation is provided.
