

NOTE 1. ORGANIZATION, OPERATIONS

Synergy Capital I, LLC (the "Company") was originally organized as a Subchapter S corporation in January 1996 in the State of New York. In January 2002, the Company completed a stock purchase agreement ("Purchase Agreement") pursuant to which it converted to a Delaware Limited Liability Company. At that time, CSG III, LLC ("CSG III") purchased all of the outstanding membership interests of the company, formerly known as Synergy Capital Inc., upon the terms and conditions set forth in the Purchase Agreement. The Company is a securities broker-dealer, registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority Inc. ("FINRA").

The Company maintains its books and records on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTE 2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Income Taxes

The Company is not subject to income taxes. The member is individually liable for the taxes on the Company's income or loss. However, the Company is subject to New York City Unincorporated Business Tax and when applicable a provision will be included on the Statement of Operations. The Company recognizes tax benefits or expenses of uncertain tax positions in the year such determination is made when the position is "more likely than not" to be sustained assuming examination by tax authorities. The tax years that remain subject to examination are 2015, 2014, and 2013. The Company determined that there are no uncertain tax positions which would require adjustments or disclosures on the financial statements.

NOTE 2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Statement of Cash Flows

For purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, the Company has defined cash equivalents as highly liquid investments, with original maturities of less than three months, which are held for sale in the ordinary course of business.

Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures bears no material effect on the financial statements as presented.

Revenue Recognition

The Company recognizes revenue upon rendering of services. Advisory fees are billed upon completion of services and annual representative income is billed annually to cover the cost of maintaining licenses with the Company.

NOTE 3. COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The Company had no lease or equipment rental commitments, no underwriting commitments, no contingent liabilities and had not been named as defendant in any lawsuit at December 31, 2016 or during the year then ended.

NOTE 4. GUARANTEES

FASB ASC 460, Guarantees, requires the Company to disclose information about its obligations under certain guarantee arrangements. FASB ASC 460 defines guarantees as contracts and indemnification agreements that contingently require a guarantor to make payments to the guaranteed party based on changes in an underlying value (such as an interest or foreign exchange rate, security or commodity price, an index or the occurrence or nonoccurrence of a specified event) related to an asset, liability or equity security of a guaranteed party. This guidance also defines guarantees as contracts that contingently require the guarantor to make payments to the guaranteed party based on another entity's failure to perform under an agreement, as well as indirect guarantees of the indebtedness of others.

The Company has issued no guarantees effective at December 31, 2016 or during the year then ended.

NOTE 5. NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENT

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (rule 15c3-1), which requires maintaining a minimum net capital and requires that the rate of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. The Company is required to maintain minimum net capital equal to \$5,000. At December 31, 2016, the Company had net capital of \$49,685 and \$44,685 of excess net capital. At December 31, 2016, the Company's ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital ratio was .30 to 1.

NOTE 6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

For the year ended December 31, 2016, the Company shared office space with its sole member, CSG III. CSG III allocates a percentage of the rent and certain other overhead and administrative expenses to the Company. In lieu of cash payments, these amounts are recorded as capital contributions of CSG III. CSG III has adequate resources independent of the Company to pay these expenses, and the Company has no additional obligation, either direct or indirect, to compensate a third party for these expenses.

NOTE 7. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated and no events have been identified which require disclosure.
