

**(1) Organization**

TrustCore Investments, Inc (the “Company”) is a wholly-owned subsidiary of TrustCore Financial, Inc. and is engaged in the securities business. The Company is a broker-dealer which sells general securities on a fully disclosed basis through a clearing broker, direct participation programs and variable contracts on a “best efforts” and subscription basis, and mutual funds with all orders cleared through the sponsoring institution. The Company is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (“FINRA”).

**(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**(a) Cash and Cash Equivalents**

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, the Company considers all cash and highly liquid debt instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents. The Company maintains its cash in bank accounts which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Company places its cash and cash equivalents with financial institutions management considers to be of a high quality. There were no bank deposits in excess of the federally insured limits at December 31, 2016.

**(b) Revenue Recognition**

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis. The Company recognizes commission income on a trade date basis.

**(c) Income Taxes**

The Company files consolidated federal and state income tax returns with its parent company and other subsidiaries. The policy of the Company's parent is to charge or credit the Company with an amount equivalent to federal and state income taxes or benefit on a separate return basis. The consolidated federal and state income tax returns associated with the Company's parent for 2016, 2015, 2014, and 2013 are subject to examination by the federal and state tax authorities generally for three years after they were filed.

**(d) Uncertain Tax Positions**

The Company evaluates all significant tax positions as required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. As of December 31, 2016, the Company does not believe that it has taken any positions that would require the recording of any additional tax liability, nor does it believe that there are any unrealized tax benefits that would either increase or decrease within the next year.

(e) *Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(f) *Advertising Costs*

Advertising costs are expensed as incurred.

(g) *Fair Value of Financial Instruments*

Accounting Standards Codification No. 820, "Fair Value Measurement", requires disclosures of information about the fair value of certain financial instruments for which it is practicable to estimate that value. For purposes of this disclosure, the fair value of a financial instrument is the amount at which the instrument could be exchanged in a current transaction between willing parties, other than a forced sale or liquidation. The carrying amounts of the Company's short-term financial instruments approximate fair value due to the relatively short maturity period for these instruments.

(3) *Net Capital Requirements and Other Restrictions*

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (15c3-1) which requires the maintenance of minimum capital equal to \$50,000. At December 31, 2016, the Company had net capital as defined of \$116,672, which was \$66,672 in excess of its required net capital of \$50,000.

The Company maintains an agreement for clearing services with a clearing broker registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. In accordance with the agreement between these parties, a \$50,000 cash balance is maintained with the clearing broker and is reflected as a deposit with clearing organization in the statement of financial condition. In addition, the clearing agreement established a minimum capital requirement of \$100,000 to be maintained by the Company.

(4) *Due To Parent Company*

The amount of \$170,016 at December 31, 2016 represents unsecured non-interest bearing advances made from its 100% shareholder. The account is used for clearing of expense allocation between the Company and its affiliates.

(5) *Related Party Transactions*

Substantially all expenses of the Company, except commission expense and clearing charges represent allocations of such expenses from its parent company. The allocation is determined through an established expense sharing agreement between the Company and the parent company. Expenses allocated to the Company for the year ended December 31, 2016, were approximately \$550,000. Included within the current year allocation associated with salaries and benefits is an amount of \$22,029 that represents salaries of the parent company's directors. Current year advertising costs of \$7,728, as allocated to the Company, were included in the expense category of office expense.

In addition, the parent company has entered into a line of credit note agreement with a financial institution. Under the terms of the line of credit agreement, the parent company may borrow up to a principal amount of \$500,000. The maturity date of the line of credit agreement is June 1, 2018. Interest on the line of credit is due monthly based on the outstanding principal at a variable rate determined by the financial institution. The underlying promissory note associated with the line of credit is unsecured. However, four of the parent company directors serve as guarantors of the obligation. As of December 31, 2016, the outstanding principal balance on the parent company's line of credit was \$284,636. The effective interest rate at December 31, 2016 was 3.75%.

Effective January 9, 2014, the parent company entered into a promissory note agreement with a financial institution as a means of financing furniture and equipment additions in connection with the facilities relocation. The principal amount of the loan of \$400,000 is to be paid in equal monthly installments of \$5,526, including interest at 4.25%, through January, 2021. The loan is collateralized by the furniture and equipment additions made in connection with the proceeds of the loan. In addition, the parent company directors serve as guarantors of this promissory note. The outstanding balance of the loan at December 31, 2016 was \$247,825.

The Company shares in the rental obligation and note payable interest charges through the parent company's allocation of expenses. Rental expense of \$62,860, associated with the sublease agreement was allocated to the Company during 2016, net of a related amount of \$40,695 allocated to registered representatives, and is included within office expense. The Company's share of interest expense on debt obligations was \$2,423, of which \$1,198 was associated with the promissory note and \$1,225 was associated with the line of credit agreement, and is reflected in net interest expense.

(5) **Related Party Transactions, Continued**

Effective January 1, 2014, the parent company along with affiliated companies relocated their operations to a building owned in part by directors of the parent company. Associated with this move, the parent company entered into a ten-year lease agreement with the owner beginning January 1, 2014. After the initial 10-year lease term, the parent company will have three consecutive options to renew the lease for a three-year period associated with each option. Lease payments, under this agreement beginning January, 2014, are scheduled as follows:

(6) **Provision for Income Taxes**

The provision for income taxes at December 31, 2016 of (\$18,046) represents a current income tax benefit.

Included in the provision is a current year recognition of the change in the previous year's deferred tax obligation.

During 2016, three registered representatives (all of which are directors of parent company and officers of the Company) accounted for approximately 43% of the total commission revenue for the current year of \$1,338,313 and approximately 43% of the total commission expense for the current year of \$686,816.

**(9) Legal**

The Company, from time to time, may be involved in litigation, disputes and claims arising in the ordinary course of business. These matters arise from a variety of sources including the day-to-day operations of the business, governmental compliance and contracts/agreements related to its customers and vendors. There were no matters outstanding as of December 31, 2016, that were known to management.

**(10) Exemption of SEC Rule 15c3-3 Reserve Requirement**

The Company is exempt from the provisions of SEC Rule 15c3-3, because the Company does not carry security accounts for customers or perform custodial functions relating to customer securities.

**(11) Material Change in Business**

In December 2016, the Board of Directors of TrustCore Financial, Inc, the parent company of the Company, approved a strategic change of direction for the Company. This change will involve a strategic de-emphasis of the broker-dealer business in favor of an increased emphasis on TrustCore Financial, Inc.'s registered investment advisory business housed in TrustCore Financial Services, Inc., a subsidiary. A primary result of this change is that over the course of 2017, client accounts will be converted from having the current clearing broker serve as the client custodian over to another broker as client custodian. Another key outcome is that the Company will no longer have a clearing agreement with the current clearing broker and will change its FINRA filing status to that of a limited-use broker dealer. The result of this change will be that the Company's net capital requirement will decline to \$5,000 from \$50,000.

**(12) Subsequent Events**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through February 28, 2017, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
