




Basis for Opinion

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
December 31, 2017

1. ORGANIZATION AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

EP Securities, LLC ("we", "our", or the "Company") is registered as a broker-dealer with the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. ("FINRA"). The Company received its approval for membership on March 16, 2010. The Company earns advisory fee income for merger and acquisitions and capital-raising consulting.

Since the Company is a New York limited liability company ("LLC"), the Members are not liable for the debts, obligations or liabilities of the Company, whether arising in contract, tort or otherwise, unless the Members have signed a specific guarantee.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Company maintains its books and records on the accrual basis of accounting for financial reporting purposes, which is in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, which is required by the SEC and FINRA.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Company defines cash equivalents as highly liquid investments with original maturity dates of less than ninety days that are not held for sale in the ordinary course of business.

The Company maintains its cash in a bank deposit account which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts and management believes it is not subjected to any significant credit risk.

Revenue Recognition

Revenues from advisory services are recognized as earned, upon satisfaction of performance obligations. Non-refundable retainers are recognized as revenue and in some cases upon receipt, in accordance with terms of the contract, and are applied against transaction fees upon closing, if applicable. The Company is evaluating new revenue recognition standards and will implement as required.

Accounts receivable

Accounts receivable are uncollateralized customer obligations due under normal trade terms generally requiring payment within 30 days from the invoice date. Accounts receivable are stated

at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. At December 31, 2017 management considers all accounts receivable to be fully collectible, therefore no allowance for uncollectible amounts is necessary.

Fixed Assets

Fixed assets include furniture, fixtures and leasehold improvements and are stated at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets (five to seven years). The Company follows the policy of capitalizing all major additions, renewals and betterments. Minor replacements, maintenance, and repairs are expensed as incurred. Depreciation expense for 2017 was \$7,180.

Income Taxes

The Company is a limited liability company taxed as a partnership for income tax reporting purposes and as such, is not subject to income tax. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is provided in the financial statements.

The Company has adopted the provisions of FASB Accounting Standards Codification 740-10, Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes. Under FASB ASC 740-10, the Company is required to evaluate each of its tax positions to determine if they are more likely than not to be sustained if the taxing authority examines the respective position. The Company has evaluated its tax positions and has determined that it has no uncertain tax positions for which a provision or liability for income taxes is necessary.

3. LEASE COMMITMENTS

On June 5, 2012, the Company signed a seven year lease agreement for its main office that commenced in September 2012. During 2017, the Company paid \$213,312 in rent expense. The terms of the seven year lease are (i) base rent of \$14,933 per month for the period commencing on the Commencement Date through the third anniversary of the Commencement Date, and (ii) \$15,733 per month for the period commencing on the third anniversary of the Commencement Date and then increased through the expiration of the lease agreement in October of the year 2019. The Company estimates future rent expense using the straight-line method and estimates the below expense per year for five years and thereafter.

4. NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS

The Company is subject to the SEC Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. At December 31, 2017, the Company had net capital of \$119,598 which was \$114,598 in excess of its required net capital of \$5,000. The Company's percentage of aggregate indebtedness to net capital was 18.43%.

5. MANagements REVIEW

Subsequent events were evaluated through February 17, 2018, the date the financial statements were issued. The Company did not identify any material subsequent events requiring disclosure in its financial statements.

6. CONCENTRATION RISKS

Commission revenues earned from the largest customer of the Company's accounted for 45.0% of commission revenue in 2017.

7. RENTAL INCOME

On May 1, 2017 the Company entered into an office sublease agreement for a term of 12 months at \$4,250 per month. After the 12 month period, the lease will automatically continue on a month to month basis.




