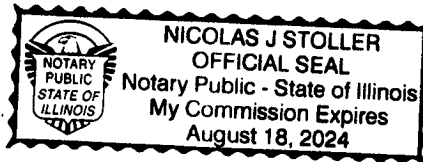

We have audited the accompanying statement of financial condition of CCM Securities, LLC (the Company) as of December 31, 2020, the related statements of operations, changes in member's equity, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes and supplemental schedules (collectively referred to as the financial statements). In our opinion, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of CCM Securities, LLC as of December 31, 2020, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

Notes to Financial Statements

1. Organization and Business

CCM Securities, LLC (the "Company"), an Illinois limited liability company, was formed on May 12, 2000 and is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Bluefin Markets Holdings, L.P. (the "Parent"). The Company is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority. The Company introduces clients to TJM Investments, LLC ("TJM") and receives a portion of the revenue generated by the introduced clients.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Revenue Recognition and Securities Valuation

Commission revenue and related expenses are recorded on a trade date basis. The carrying values of cash, receivables and payables approximate fair value due to the short maturities of these financial instruments.

The Company recognizes revenue in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification ("FASB ACS") Topic 606 Revenue from Contracts with Customers. That guidance was amended to require business entities to recognize revenue to depict the transfer of promised goods or services to customers in an amount that reflects the consideration to which the entity expects to be entitled in exchange for those goods or services.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with United States Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ("U.S. GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Income Taxes

No provision has been made for federal U.S. income taxes as the taxable income or loss of the Company is included in the respective income tax returns of the Parent.

In accordance with U.S. GAAP, the Company is required to determine whether its tax positions are more likely than not to be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority, based on the technical merits of the position. Generally, the Company is no longer subject to income tax examinations by major taxing authorities for the years before 2017. Based on its analysis, there were no tax positions identified by management which did not meet the "more likely than not" standard as of and for the year ended December 31, 2020.

3. Related Party Transactions

At December 31, 2020, the Company had payables to affiliated entities totaling approximately \$26,000. These represent amounts paid for shared expenses.

4. Concentration of Credit Risk

At December 31, 2020 a significant credit concentration consisted of cash deposited in bank accounts that exceeded federally insured limits by approximately \$41,000 which represents approximately 9% of the Company's equity. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts. Management believes the Company is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash.

5. Off-Balance Sheet Risk

Customer transactions are introduced to and cleared through the Company's brokers on a fully disclosed basis. Under the terms of its clearing agreements, the Company is required to guarantee the performance of its customers in meeting contracted obligations. In conjunction with the brokers, the Company seeks to control the risks associated with its customer activities by requiring customers to maintain collateral in compliance with various regulatory and internal guidelines and, pursuant to such guidelines, customers may be required to deposit additional collateral, or reduce positions, where necessary.

Commissions receivable represent a concentration of credit risk. The Company does not anticipate nonperformance by its customers or the brokers. In addition, the Company has a policy of reviewing, as considered necessary, the creditworthiness of the brokers with which it conducts business.

6. Net Capital Requirements

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (Rule 15(c)3-1) and various exchange rules. Under the highest requirement, the Company is required to maintain "net capital" equal to the greater of \$100,000 or 6⅔% of "aggregate indebtedness", as defined.

At December 31, 2020, the Company had net capital and net capital requirements of \$354,657 and \$100,000, respectively.

7. Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures

ASC 820 defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and establishes a fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. A fair value measurement assumes that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability occurs in the principal market for the asset or liability or, in the absence of a principal market, the most advantageous market. Valuation techniques that are consistent with the market, income or cost approach, as specified by ASC 820, are used to measure fair value.

The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels:

- Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities the Company has the ability to access.
- Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability and rely on management's own assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. The unobservable inputs should be developed based on the best information available in the circumstances and may include the Company's own data.

At December 31, 2020, the Company held no Level 1, Level 2 or Level 3 investments.

8. Guarantees

ASC 460, *Guarantees*, requires the Company to disclose information about its obligations under certain guarantee arrangements. ASC 460, defines guarantees as contracts and indemnification agreements that contingently require a guarantor to make payments to the guaranteed party based on changes in underlying (such as an interest or foreign exchange rate, security or commodity price, an index or the occurrence or nonoccurrence of a specified event) related to an asset, liability or equity security of a guaranteed party. This guidance also defines guarantees as contracts that contingently require the guarantor to make payments to the guaranteed party based on another entity's failure to perform under an agreement, as well as indirect guarantees of the indebtedness of others.

Other Guarantees

The Company has entered into clearing agreements with its brokers to guarantee the performance of its customers in meeting contracted obligations. As previously mentioned, the Company seeks to control the risks associated with its customer activities by requiring customers to maintain collateral in compliance with various regulatory and internal guidelines and, pursuant to such guidelines, customers may be required to deposit additional collateral, or reduce positions, where necessary. The maximum potential amount of future payments that the Company could be required to make under these guarantees cannot be estimated. However, the Company believes that it is unlikely it will have to make material payments under these arrangements and has not recorded any contingent liability in the financial statements.

9. Credit Losses on Financial Instruments

ASU 2016-13, *Financial Instruments -Credit Losses, Measurement of Credit Losses on Financial Instruments*, requires entities to establish an allowance for credit losses for most financial assets. Prior GAAP was based on an incurred loss methodology for recognizing credit losses on financial assets measured at amortized cost and available-for sale debt securities. The update is effective for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2019, including interim periods within those fiscal years. The Company has not taken any credit losses and the adoption of this rule did not have a significant impact on the Company's Financial Statements.

10. Subsequent Events

The Company's management has evaluated events and transactions through February 22, 2021, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, noting no material events requiring disclosure in the Company's financial statements.
