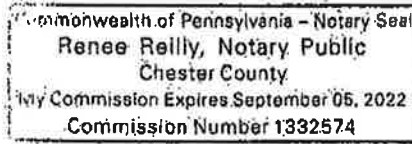

**NOTE 1. ORGANIZATION AND NATURE OF BUSINESS**

Bryant Park Capital Securities, Inc. (the "Company") is a broker-dealer registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. ("FINRA") and the Securities Investor Protection Corporation ("SIPC"). The Company's primary business activities include investment banking, advisory and consulting services, and merger and acquisition assignments and valuations. The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Bryant Park Capital LLC (the "Parent").

**NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Revenue from Contracts With Customers

The Company provides mostly advisory services on mergers and acquisitions (M&A). Revenue for advisory arrangements is generally recognized at the point in time that performance under the arrangement is completed (the closing date of the transaction) or the contract is cancelled. However, for certain contracts, revenue may be recognized over time for advisory arrangements in which the performance obligations are simultaneously provided by the Company and consumed by the customer. In some circumstances, significant judgment is needed to determine the timing and measure of progress appropriate for revenue recognition under a specific contract. Retainers and other fees received from customers prior to recognizing revenue are reflected as contract liabilities.

There are no open contracts as of December 31, 2021.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on deposit and money market accounts.

**NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

Income Taxes

The Parent has elected to treat the Company as a Qualified Subchapter S Subsidiary ("QSSS"). As a QSSS, all items of taxable income, deductions, and tax credits are passed through to and are reported by the owners of the Parent on their respective income tax returns. Accordingly, these financial statements do not reflect a provision for income taxes and the Company has no other tax positions which must be considered for disclosure.

For the year ended December 31, 2021, the Company did not incur any interest and penalties from taxing authorities for returns filed in prior years.

The following are the major tax jurisdictions for the Company: Federal, New York State, New York City and Pennsylvania. The Company's tax returns are subject to examination by taxing authorities in the jurisdictions in which it operates in accordance with normal statutes of limitations in the applicable jurisdiction. The statute of limitations for state purposes is generally three years, but many exceed this limitation depending upon the jurisdiction involved. Returns that were filed within the applicable statute remain subject to examination. As of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021, the IRS has not proposed any adjustment to the company's tax position.

The Company recognizes and measures its unrecognized tax benefits in accordance with FASB Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 740, Income Taxes. Under that guidance, the Company assesses the likelihood, based on their technical merit, that tax positions will be sustained upon examination based on the facts, circumstances and information available at the end of each period. The measurement of unrecognized tax benefits is adjusted when new information is available, or when an event occurs that requires a change. There were no unrecognized tax benefits at December 31, 2021.

Leases

The Company is not subject to ASC 842 therefore, the adoption of ASC 842 did not have a significant effect on the Company's financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2021.

**NOTE 3. REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS**

The Company is subject to the SEC's Uniform Net Capital Rule, which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, not exceed 15 to 1. Net capital and aggregate indebtedness change from day to day. At December 31, 2021, the Company had net capital of \$267,206, which was \$262,206 in excess of the required minimum net capital of \$5,000. The aggregate indebtedness to net capital ratio was 0.08 to 1 which is less than 15 to 1 maximum allowed.

**NOTE 4. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

In August 2016, the Parent and Company entered into a service agreement under which the Parent allocates administrative expenses to the Company. The Parent allocated \$114,000 in administrative allocable expenses under the agreement during the year ended December 31, 2021. It is possible that the terms of certain of the related party transactions are not the same as those that would result for similar transactions among wholly unrelated parties.

From time to time, the Company may receive stock warrants or other securities from clients as compensation for services. Such warrants and other securities received are ultimately distributed to the Parent. No warrants or other securities were received or distributed to the Parent in 2021.

**NOTE 5. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Management has evaluated the activity of the Company through the date these financial statements were issued and has concluded that no subsequent events have occurred that would require recognition in the financial statements or disclosure in the notes to the financial statements.

**NOTE 6. COVID-19**

The worldwide outbreak of coronavirus (Covid-19) may lead to an adverse impact on the financial markets and the overall economy. In the event such an impact were to occur and last for a sustained period of time, the operations and financial performance of the Company may be adversely affected. At this point, however, the severity of such an event is highly uncertain and cannot be predicted.

**NOTE 7. RECENTLY ISSUED ACCOUNTING PRONOUNCEMENTS**

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (the “FASB”) has established the Accounting Standards Codification (“Codification” or “ASC”) as the authoritative source of generally accepting accounting principles (“GAAP”) recognized by the FASB. The principles embodied in the Codification are to be applied by nongovernmental entities in the preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP in the United States. New accounting pronouncements are incorporated into the ASC through the issuance of Accounting Standards Updates (“ASU’s”).

For the year ending December 31, 2021, various ASU’s issued by the FASB were either newly issued or had effective implementation dates that would require their provisions to be reflected in the financial statements for the year then ended.

The Company has either evaluated or is currently evaluating the implications, if any, of each of these pronouncements and the possible impact they may have on the Company’s financial statements. In most cases, management has determined that the pronouncement has either limited or no application to the Company and, in all cases, implementation would not have a material impact on the financial statements taken as a whole.

**NOTE 8. COMMITMENTS AND GUARANTEES**

The Company had no commitments, no contingent liabilities and had not been named as defendant in any lawsuit at December 31, 2021, or during the period then ended.

The company maintains bank accounts at financial institutions. These accounts are insured by either the Federal Deposit Insurance Commission (“FDIC”), up to \$250,000, or the Securities Investor Protection Corporation (“SIPC”), up to \$500,000. At times during the year, cash balances held in financial institutions were in excess of the FDIC and SPIC’s insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts and management believes that it has placed its cash on deposit with financial institutions which are financially stable.

**NOTE 9. RECLASSIFICATION**

Certain prior year amounts have been reclassified to conform to the current year’s presentation. These changes had no impact on previously reported stockholder’s equity.
