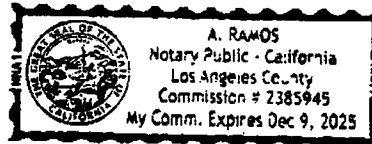

Note 1: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND DISCLOSURES

General

Augeo Advisors, LLC, (the "Company"), was formed in June, 2010 in the State of California as a limited liability company. The Company is registered as a broker-dealer with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") and is a member of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority ("FINRA") and Securities Investor Protection Corporation ("SIPC"). The Company is authorized to engage in private placements of securities and mergers and acquisitions. The Company does not hold customer funds or safeguard customer securities and does not provide any services other than M&A advisory and private placement services.

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

ASC 606 REVENUE RECOGNITION

A. Significant accounting policy

Revenue is measured based on a consideration specified in a contract with a customer, and excludes any sales incentives and amounts collected on behalf of third parties. The Company recognizes revenue when it has satisfied a performance obligation by transferring control over a product or service to a customer.

Taxes and regulatory fees assessed by a government authority or agency that are both imposed on and concurrent with a specified revenue-producing transaction, and that are collected by the Company from a customer, are excluded from revenue. No such taxes and regulatory fees were collected by the Company from customers for the year ended December 31, 2021.

B. Nature of services

One hundred percent (100%) of the Company's revenue for the year ended December 31, 2021 came from providing M&A advisory services to third-party clients. The following statement is a description of activities – separated by reportable segments, per FINRA Form "Supplemental Statement of Income (SSOI)", from which the Company generates its revenue. For more detailed information about reportable segments, see below.

Fees earned: This includes fees earned from affiliated entities; investment banking fees, M&A advisory; account supervision and investment advisory fees; administrative fees, revenue from research services; rebates from exchanges/ECN and ATS; 12b-1 fees; Mutual fund fees other than concessions or 12b-1 fees; execution service fees; clearing services; fees earned from customer bank sweep into FDIC insured products or from '40 Act companies and networking fees from '40 Act companies.

Furniture and equipment are stated at cost. Repairs and maintenance to these assets are charged to expense as incurred; major improvements enhancing the function and/or useful life are capitalized. When items are sold or retired, the related cost and accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts and any gains or losses arising from such transactions are recognized. Property and equipment are depreciated over their estimated useful lives of three (3) to seven (7) years by the straight-line method. Tangible assets with a cost of more than \$1,000 and an estimated useful life of at least one year are capitalized.

The Company, with the consent of its Member, has elected to be a Limited Liability Company. For tax purposes, the Company is treated like a partnership, therefore in lieu of business income taxes, the Member is taxed on the Company's taxable income. Accordingly, no provision or liability for Federal Income Taxes is included in these financial statements. The State of California has similar treatment, although there exists a provision for a minimum Franchise Tax of \$800 plus a fee based upon gross receipts.

The Company is engaged in various trading and brokerage activities in whose counterparties primarily include broker/dealers, banks, and other financial institutions. In the event counterparties do not fulfill their obligations, the Company may be exposed to risk. The risk of default depends upon the creditworthiness of the counterparty or issuer of the instrument. To mitigate the risk of loss, the Company maintains its accounts with credit worthy customers and counterparties.

One hundred percent (100%) of the Company's revenue for the year ended December 31, 2021 came from one client.

Management has reviewed the results of operations from December 31, 2021 through January 13, 2022, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and have determined that no adjustments are necessary to the amounts reported in the accompanying financial statements nor have any subsequent events occurred, the nature of which would require disclosure.

The Company is subject to audit by the taxing agencies for years ending December 31, 2018, 2019 and 2020.

FASB ASC 820 defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and establishes a fair value hierarchy which prioritized the inputs to valuation techniques. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. A fair value measurement assumes that the transaction to sell the asset or liability or, in the absence of a principal market, the most advantageous market for the asset or liability. Valuation techniques that are consistent with the market, income or cost approach, as specified by FASB ASC 820 are used to measure fair value.

The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad Levels:

Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities the Company has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs are inputs (other than quoted prices included within Level 1) that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.

Level 3 are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability and rely on management's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. (The unobservable inputs should be developed based on the best information available in the circumstances and may include the Company's own data.)

There were no Levels to measure at December 31, 2021.

Note 2: FURNITURE AND EQUIPMENT, NET

Furniture and equipment are recorded at cost by major classifications as follows:

For the year ended December 31, 2021, depreciation expense totaled \$1,145.

Note 3: INCOME TAXES

The Company is subject to a limited liability company gross receipts fee and a minimum franchise tax of \$800. For the year ended December 31, 2021, the Company was subject only to the minimum limited liability company income tax of \$800.

Note 4: COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

Since December 1, 2020, the Company has rented office space on a month-to-month basis with no minimum future rental commitments and no advance notice required to terminate. Office rent expense for the year ended December 31, 2021 totaled \$3,600.

Note 5: NET CAPITAL

The Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. Net capital and aggregate indebtedness change day to day, but on December 31, 2021 the Company had net capital of \$170,037, which was \$165,037 in excess of its required net capital of \$5,000; and the Company's ratio of aggregate indebtedness of \$5,750 to net capital was 0.03-to-1, which is less than the 15-to-1 maximum ratio allowed for a broker dealer.
