My business is Sylvron Travels. It provides tour bus service all over the Carolinas and sometimes the East coast. The company provides the service today as it did when I opened it. The business is still run with a single tour bus and at the moment I have no plans of expansion due to the price of diesel. Many corporate and state laws apply to the tour bus industry, such as weight limits and passenger capacity limits. Federal authorities making decisions on these laws due to the proxy access rules could have severe adverse effects on my business. My operating costs could increase as a result, and other rule changes may apply that would cost me even more.

A government official making more decisions over the transportation industry would not be good for the American economy. Transportation companies such as mine provide a vital service to millions of Americans every day, and an increase in costs industry-wide could adversely affect everyone. Transportation is a far-reaching entity that has ties with nearly every other business in the country.

Business has been much slower since the economy began to suffer. Operating my business has become harder over the last few years because of this. The rule changes proposed in the shareholder proxy access system will definitely make these circumstances even worse. During this open comment period please consider the views of myself and other small business owners and continue to keep government officials and special interests out of the corporate field.
