Partial Amendment

SR-NYSE-2016-90, Partial Amendment No. 1

The New York Stock Exchange LLC (“NYSE” or the “Exchange”) hereby submits this partial Amendment No. 1 to the above-referenced filing (the “Filing”) in connection with the proposed acquisition of National Stock Exchange, Inc. (“NSX”) by the Exchange’s parent the NYSE Group, Inc., to correct an error in the proposed Seventh Amended and Restated Bylaws of Intercontinental Exchange, Inc. The Exchange proposes the following amendment to the Filing:

1. **Amend Proposed Section 12.1(a)(1) of Article XII (Voting and Ownership Limitations) to the Proposed Seventh Amended and Restated Bylaws of Intercontinental Exchange, Inc. (“ICE Bylaws”) on page 72 of the Exhibit 5.**

The Exchange proposes to amend proposed Section 12.1(a)(1) of Article XII of the ICE Bylaws on page 72 of the Exhibit 5 to replace the reference to “the Amended and Restated Certificate of Incorporation of the Corporation” with “these bylaws.” The reference to ICE’s certificate of incorporation is incorrect and should be a reference to the bylaws such that the use of “ETP Holder” in the bylaws and with respect to NYSE National is modified accordingly. To reflect the proposed change, the Exchange proposes to amend the proposed text as follows (new text double-underlined):

(a) Subject to its fiduciary obligations under applicable law, for so long as the Corporation directly or indirectly controls NYSE National, Inc. (or its successor), the Board of Directors shall not adopt any resolution pursuant to clause (b) of Section A.2 of Article V of the Corporation’s Certificate of Incorporation unless the Board of Directors shall have determined that:

(1) in the case of a resolution to approve the exercise of voting rights in excess of 20% of the then outstanding votes entitled to be cast on such matter, neither such Person nor any of its Related Persons is an ETP Holder (as defined in the bylaws of NYSE National, Inc., as such bylaws may be in effect from time to time) of NYSE National, Inc. (any such Person that is a Related Person of an ETP Holder shall hereinafter also be deemed to be an “ETP Holder” for purposes of these bylaws[Amended and Restated Certificate of Incorporation of the Corporation], as the context may require);

All other representations in the Filing remain as stated therein and no other changes are being made.
