ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION TO SUPPLEMENT THE RECORD

On September 4, 2024, the Securities and Exchange Commission issued an order instituting proceedings (“OIP”) against Harvey Electronics, Inc. (“Respondent”) under Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.<sup>1</sup> On March 13, 2025, the Commission ordered the parties to submit any evidence and accompanying brief about whether Respondent has a class of securities registered with the Commission under Section 12(g).<sup>2</sup>

The Division of Enforcement now seeks an extension until May 5, 2025, to respond to the order. It appears appropriate to grant the requested extension.<sup>3</sup>

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that the date by which the parties must respond to the Commission’s order is extended to May 5, 2025, and that the date by which a party may respond to an opposing party’s filing is extended to June 5, 2025.

Respondent is reminded that, if it fails to respond or otherwise defend this proceeding, the Commission may deem it to be in default, deem the allegations in the OIP to be true, and

determine the proceeding against it upon consideration of the record without holding a public hearing.<sup>4</sup>

Upon review of the filings in response to this order, the Commission will either direct further proceedings by subsequent order or issue a final opinion and order resolving the matter.
