ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

The Securities and Exchange Commission (“Commission”) issued an Order Instituting Proceedings (“OIP”) on September 21, 2018, pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against respondents MaryJane Group, Inc., Omega Commercial Finance Corp., and Redpoint Bio Corp. (collectively, “Respondents”).¹

On October 18, 2018, the Division of Enforcement filed the declaration of Neil J. Welch, Jr., which stated that, consistent with Rule 141(a)(2)(ii) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice,² service of the OIP was made on MaryJane Group, Inc. on September 27, 2018; service of the OIP was made on Omega Commercial Finance Corp. on September 25, 2018; and service of the OIP was made on Redpoint Bio Corp. on September 25, 2018.

As stated in the OIP, Respondents’ answers were required to be filed within ten days of service of the OIP.³ As of the date of this order, Respondents have not filed answers. The prehearing conference and the hearing are thus continued indefinitely.

Accordingly, Respondents are ORDERED to SHOW CAUSE by March 29, 2019, why the registrations of their securities should not be revoked by default due to their failures to file an answer and to otherwise defend this proceeding. When a party defaults, the allegations in the

OIP will be deemed to be true and the Commission may determine the proceeding against that party upon consideration of the record without holding a public hearing.

If Respondents fail to respond to this order to show cause, they may be deemed in default, the proceeding may be determined against them, and their securities may be revoked.⁴ Upon review of the filings in response to this order, the Commission will either direct further proceedings by subsequent order or issue a final order resolving the matter.
