EXTENSION ORDER

On June 18, 2020, the parties in this matter were directed to file simultaneous briefs by June 29, 2020, addressing certain issues related to an order by the presiding law judge in this matter that certified to the Commission the question of "whether to exercise its authority to invoke the aid of a district court to enforce [a] subpoena [issued for documents to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation on April 15, 2020]." The parties were further directed to file simultaneous response briefs by July 9, 2020.

After filing a timely initial brief, the Division of Enforcement filed a reply brief in which it represented that it had "not been served by Respondent with a brief in response to the Commission's Order," nor had it "received a brief from Respondent through any other means." The Division added that, "[i]n the event Respondent filed a brief with the Commission but failed to deliver it to the Division, the Division would then respectfully request that it be given notice of any brief and time to file a reply." Respondent Mark Feathers subsequently filed a declaration stating that he had never received a copy of the Commission's briefing order and requested extra time in which to file a response. Given these circumstances, there appears to be good cause to grant the parties' extension requests.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED pursuant to Rule 161 of the Commission's Rules of Practice² that the time for Feathers to file an initial brief, not to exceed 5,000 words, in response to the Commission's June 18, 2020 order is extended to July 20, 2020. The time in which the parties shall file simultaneous response briefs, not to exceed 3,000 words, is extended to July 27, 2020.
