**EXTENSION ORDER** 

On November 22, 2013, the Securities and Exchange Commission (Commission) issued an Order Instituting Administrative and Cease-and-Desist Proceedings against Joseph P. Doxey (Doxey) and William J. Daniels (Daniels), pursuant to Section 8A of the Securities Act of 1933 and Sections 15(b)(6)(A) and 21C of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

Yesterday, I denied Doxey's February 14, 2014, request for an extension of the deadline to file his opposition to the Division of Enforcement's (Division) Motion for Summary Disposition without prejudice, and explained that, if Doxey desires relief, he must file another request in which he explains in greater detail and with greater clarity the basis for his request. Today, this Office received a second request for an extension (Second Request), in which Doxey explains that he expects to have his opposition complete by February 26, 2014, and – in response to yesterday's Order – provides some clarification of the problems he has encountered with the investigative file furnished by the Division, including that twenty-one of its electronic files have attachments that appear to be blank when he opens them.

The Second Request explains that Doxey telephoned the Commission's Office of the Secretary repeatedly on January 24, 2014. Doxey also called that Office today to discuss yesterday's Order.

I ORDER that Doxey's Second Request is GRANTED, oppositions are now due by Wednesday, February 26, 2014, and any replies are now due by Friday, March 7, 2014. These deadlines apply to both Doxey and Daniels.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that unless otherwise directed, Doxey shall not call the Office of the Secretary, including but not limited to any staff member of the Office of Secretary he has previously called, regarding this proceeding. If Doxey is unclear about the procedure in

nis proceeding or seeks clarification of an order, he should file a written motion for clarification accordance with the Commission's Rules of Practice.
